Effective with January 1, 1958, benefits under the disability insurance provisions of the Social Security Act can start no earlier than for the month in which formal application is filed. Sanderson stated that up through December 31, 1957, a claim for disability insurance benefits can result in back-dating payments to July of He suggests that all dispersons aged 50 or over check the following requirements and make every effort to get a im filed before January

1. The disability must have tarted at least six months ago. 2. It must be so severe that substantial gainful activity is im-

3. The disabled person must have had five years of social security credits out of the ten years just before becoming disabled, and at least 1 1/2 years of such credits out of the three years before on-

### Nast, Early-Day Cartoonist, First **Drew Santa Claus**

STILLWATER-Santa Claus, a fellow who enjoys almost universal support, was first sketched as we know him today by Thomas Nast, creater of two far more controversial figures - the GOP elephant and the Democrat Donkey.

The famed cartoonist's drawings, showing Santa attired in red and accompanied by reindeer, appeared in Harper's weekly. It is the first known picture of the present day St. Nick, according to sources in the Oklahoma University library.

The original St. Nicholas, later to become patron saint of Rusi, was bishop at Myra in Asia Minor, probably some time during the fourth century.

About 600 years after his death. reports of his legiondary generosity were brought to Russia by Czar Vladimir and later spread his reindeer-drawn sled.

One of the legends about St. Nicholas' generosity gave rise to the custom of hanging stockings near the chimney on Christmas eve. It all began when St. Nick, the son of wealthy parents, gave his gold to girls without doweries by dropping it down chimneys.

One eager miss, so the story coes, hung her stockings in the chimney to catch the gold. Milions of youngsters have since folowed her practice, thus adding mother colorful tradition to the Christmas celebration.

11/2 cup sugar Combine evaporated milk, marshmallow cream, butter, sugar and salt in saucepan and bring to full boil stirring constantly. Boil five minutes over moderate heat, stirring constantly. Remove from heat; add semi-sweet chocolate morsels, vanilla and nuts. Stir until chocolate is melted. Pour into greased pan 8x8x2 inches. Chill until firm. YIELD: Approximately 2½ pounds.
