riots and beer drinking demonstrations, teen age gang rapes,
joy riding car stealing, breaking and entering, vandalism and
the rest of the troublesome news that crop up these days, it is
no wonder that a concientious parent will have some sleepless
nights wondering if he has done the right thing in rearing his
own.
