

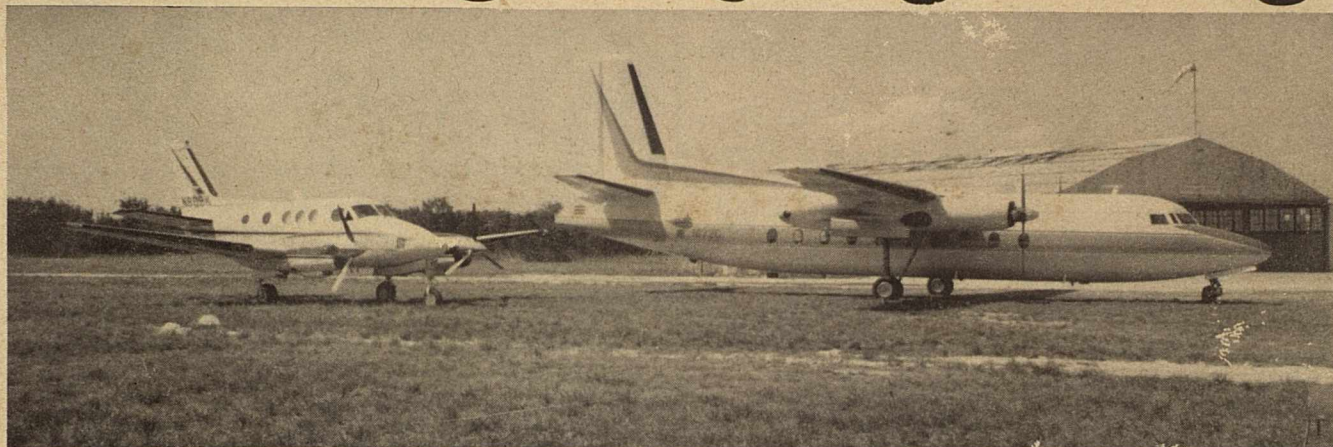

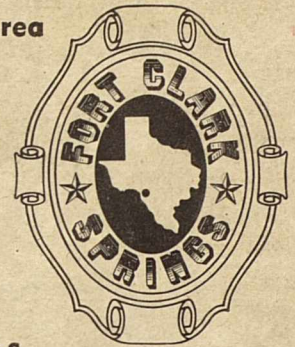

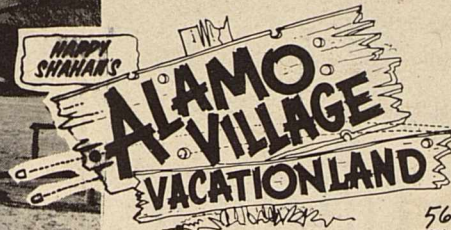

BOOSTER CLUB TO MEET

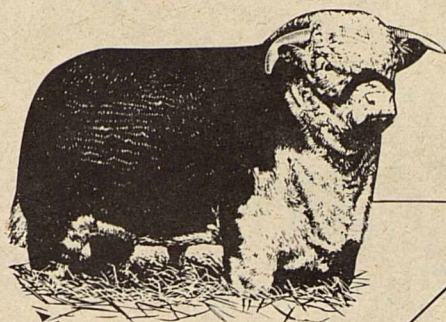
The Brackett Tiger Booster Club will meet on September 10th at 7:30 p.m. at the Courthouse for their regular meeting.

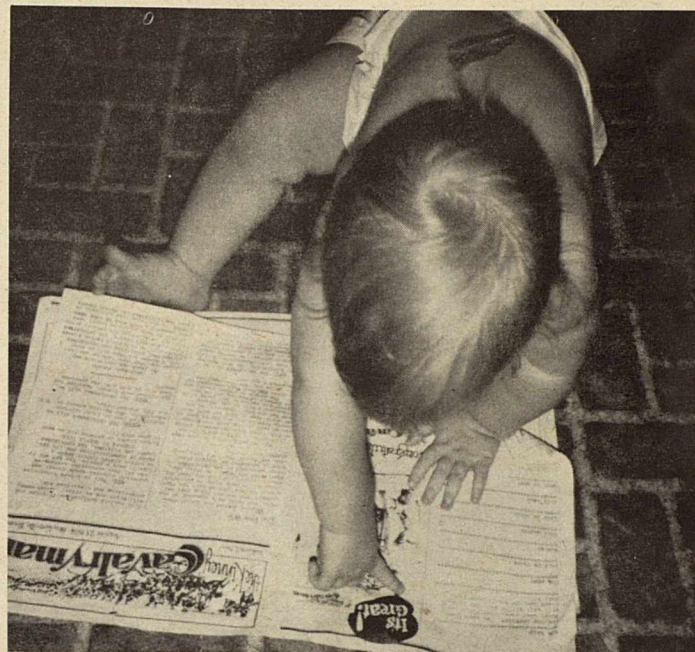

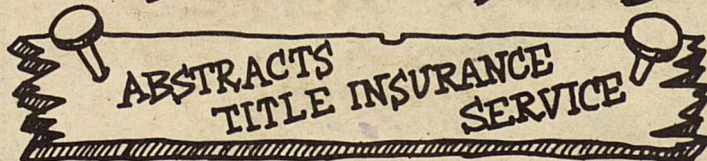

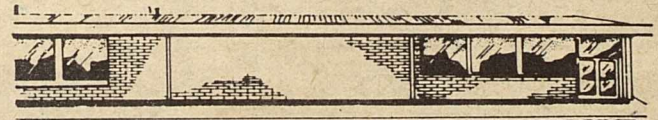
