

MAIL SUBSCRIPTIONS



D'Hanis Wins Two Games



CITIZENS ADVISORY COMMITTEE

The Citizens Advisory Committee met at the City Hall on Monday, January 6,1975, to be breifed on the Community Development Program.

Although only about one-half of the Citizens appointed by Mayor Mendeke made their appearance, much ground work was accomplished.
