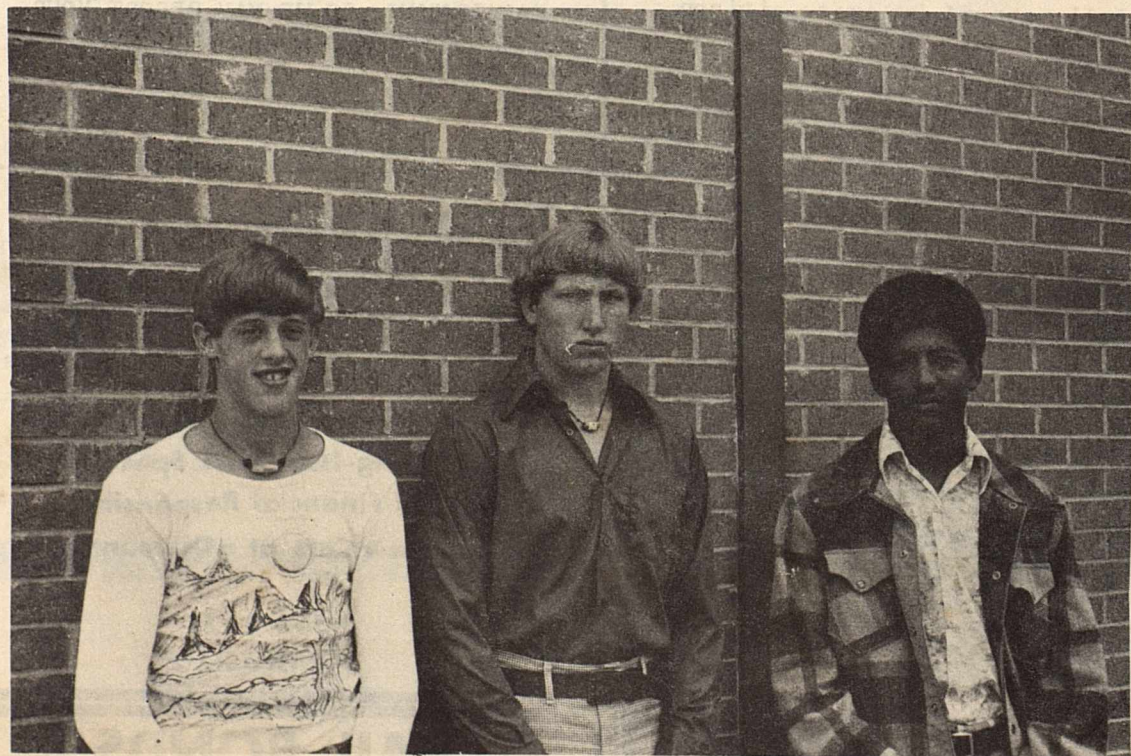

EASTER SEAL APPEAL

A further request for support of the Easter Seal Society for Crippled Children and Adults and its programs of services to the handicapped was issued today by Albert Postell, who is the Easter Seal Representative in Kinney County.

The Easter Seal Society provided treatment and services for 20,152 physically handicapped children and adults in Texas last year, and this program needs to be expanded. Many people are going without services that would increase the productiveness of their lives and make them happier. Increased public support of the Easter Seal Society will enable more and more of these people to be reached.

The Society is carrying out a continuing program to seek out the disabled who are doing without services and see that they receive the help they need. As Easter Seal Representative, Postell, is the person to contact for services from the Easter Seal Society.

The Easter Seal Society of Texas helps support treatment facilities in Texas where crippled children and adults who are not eligible for help from any other source are treated, regardless of their ability to pay. Physical, occupational and speech therapy are offered to help the handicapped overcome their disabilities. A complete referral program to ensure equal rehabilitation services to every person in Texas is included in Easter Seal Society services.

The Easter Seal Appeal continues through Easter Sunday, March 30, and full support by every citizen is urged.

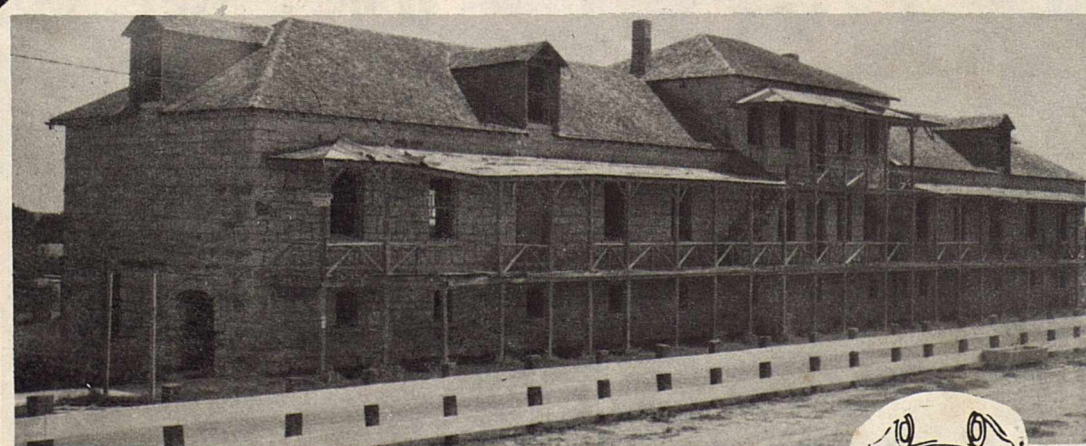
The House of Representatives in Austin has passed by a vote of 133-0 House Bill 784, by Representative Susan McBee. This bill is designed to give relief to those voters in sparsely populated areas of the state by allowing the smaller precincts to retain their voting boxes.

Under current law a minimum of 100 voters is required to form an election precinct. Mrs. McBee's bill allows voting precincts of under 100 to be created by the County Commissioners' Court. The bill was amended on the floor of the House in order to exclude counties with over 100,000 population

"This piece of legislation is particularly important to us in South and West Texas. I am very gratified that the House has passed it unanimously," said Mrs. McBee. She seems confident that Senator Snelson, who will sponsor the bill in the Senate, will be equally successful in getting it passed in the Senate also.

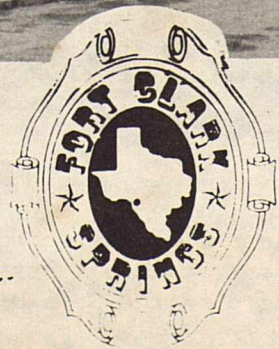

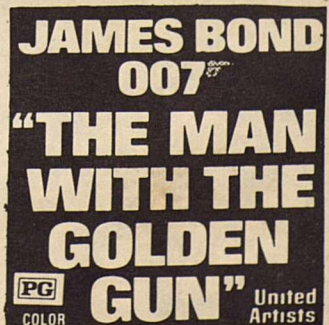

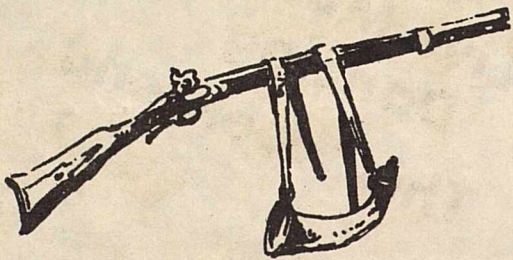
AMBULANCE PROGRESS REPORT

Rosemary Slubar, President of the Kinney County Volunteer Ambulance Service, announced, today, that the new ambulance will be in operation in the next week or two.

Mrs. Slubar stated, "The license plates for the ambulance has been secured and the needed additional supplies are on order and should arrive shortly."

"The telephone system is also on order," explained Mrs. Slubar "when the Ambulance Emergency number is dialed, it will simultaneously ring at the County Jail, the Fort Clark 24hr. Gate Guard, and Fort Clark Fire Department Fire House (where the ambulance will be shelter) thereby, assuring respond to an emergency call.

As soon as this system is operational the emergency number will be printed in the CAVALRYMAN.

If you have not experienced a Frontier Fair in Brackettville, we ask you to do so this year.

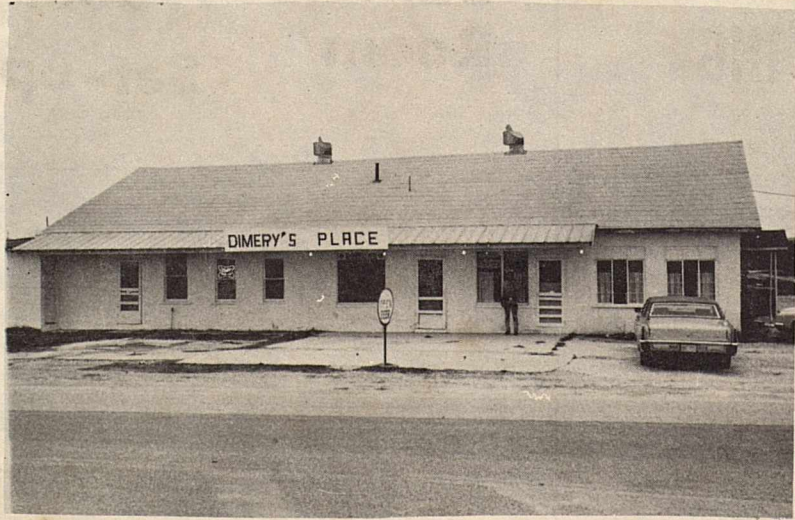

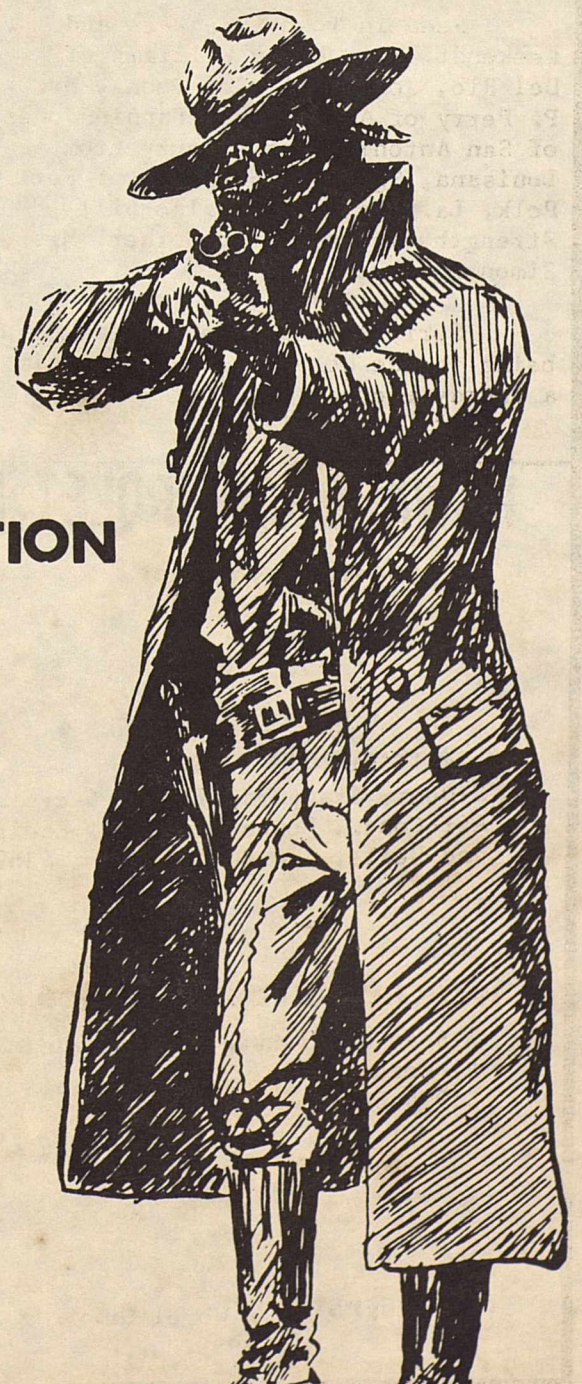

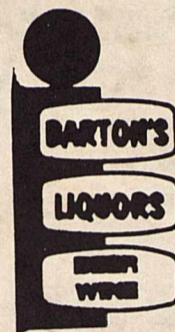

Soil and Water Conservation Directors Visit

Neville Smart, Jr. and P.H. Coates, III, both Directors of the West Nueces Las Moras Soil and Water Conservation District, toured the Martin Wardlaw Ranch on March 19th.

They observed the short-duration grazing system, that has been in progress on the ranch for three years. Mr. Wardlaw runs two herds of stock on eleven pastures and has had excellent results both with his animals performance and range improvement. A public tour will be held on the ranch later in the year. The time will be announced at a later date.

The Directors feel that everyone should make a special effort to make this tour. This type of grazing system has a lot of possibility in this area.
