### CITY HALL

The following City Ordinances are in effect and this serves as notice that violators should expect immediate action by the City according to City Secretary Roland Williams.

DEFINING NUISANCE PERSONAL PROPERTY: DIRECTING REMOVAL AND IMPOUNDING SAME SAME WHEN FOUND IN PUBLIC PLACES AND PROVIDING A LIEN AND SALE THEREON.

SECTION I. Declaring certain property a nuisance and authorizing impounding;

Any vehicle or other property or obstruction place left standing, parked, erected, or lying in violation of any ordiance of the City of Brackett ville or left unattended for more than forty-eight (48) hours continues in or on any public street, alley, sidewalk, park or any ther public place of said ciry is decalred to be

park or any other public place of said City is decalred to be a nuisance and any such property shall be summarily removed by any public official of the City of Brackettville and taken to the City Storage Area and shall be kept there until redeemed or sold.

PASSED AND APPROVED THIS 11TH DAY OF SEPTEMBER, 1967.

ORDINANCE NUMBER 187

\*\*\*\*\*

\*\*\*\*\*\*

SECTION I. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm business or corporation to deposit any refuse on any street, alley, lot, park or cementary within the corporate limits of the City of Brackettville.

(a) Refuse shall consist of paper, cans, bottles, brush, weeds, dead animals, junked applicances, automobiles, or any other matter considered to be trash.

(b) Such refuse shall be conveyed to community dump area and there deposited at attendants direction.

SECTION III. Any person, firm, business or corporation found violating this Ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction shall be fined not less than one Dollar (1.00) nor more than two-hundred dollars (200.00).

PASSED AND APPROVED THE 12th DAY OF NOVEMBER, 1073.

ORDINANCE NUMBER !87. provides for the abandoment of vehicles on streets, alleys and etc. shall be a misdemeanor and upon conviction shall carry a fine of not less than one(1.00) dollar nor more than two-hundred (200.00) dollars.

### COUNTY AGENT REPORT

Pinkeye is a serious problem in some beef cattle herds in Texas duringing the hot summer weather. The disease can cause considerable weight loss and even the loss of sight.

There is no single cure-all for pinkeye, but there are several practices which you can follow to help reduce pinkeye problems, notes Carl Esser, Kinney County Extension agent for the Texas Agricultural Extension Service.

Clipping pastures before seed-heads develop on grass is one practice that helps. These seed-heads may irritate the eyes of the cattle and increase the chances of pinkeye infection.

Flies spread certain kinds of pinkeye. Esser recommends repeated spraying of the faces of cattle with Ciodrin insectide to control face flies. Dust bags, face wipers and backrubbers also help in controlling flies. Locate them near or on the salt box, on the way to water, or in shaded loafing areas.

An adequate amount of Vitamin A helps keep eyes healthy. Good pastures generally provide enough Vitamin A. Where dry weather is turning pastures brown, supplementary Vitamin A should be provided.

Separate animals with pinkeye from the herd and treat infected eyes with an antibacterial preparation. Keep infected animals in a sheltered area. Covering infected eyes will protect them from kight and foreign matter and will speed recovery. A simple patch made of burlap and held in place with rubber cement seems to be effective,

If treatment does not improve conditions, consult a veterinarian, suggests Esser. Viral diease such as IBR may be the cause of pinkeye. Your veterinarian can recommend a vaccination program for controlling such diseases.
