


BRACKETT HOLIDAY



COUNTY AGENT REPORT

The Texas Agricultural Extension Service and the Texas Sheep and Goat Raisers Association are going to co-sponsor a Lamb Evaluation and Judging Clinic on July 18 and 19 at the Texas A&M Research and Extension Center in San Angelo. The Clinic will be open to all individuals who are interested in market lamb evaluation and judging. Special invitations have been sent to judges of Texas lamb shows and to individuals involved in the lamb packing and processing industries. The Lamb Evaluation Clinic will allow county agents adult leaders and merchandisers an opportunity to stude to participate in market lamb evaluation both on hoof and on the rail. It is hoped that the clinic will stimulate all segments of the industry to express their thoughts and concerns in an attempt to increase the proficiency of market lambs selection in Texas.

The Clinic will officially open on Friday morning, July 18 with registration beginning at 8:30 a.m.. The morning session will start at 9:00 a.m. with an educational program on lamb carcass evaluation techniques and procedures. Following this program all Clinic participants will be invited to evaluate the market lambs which have been assembled. Following a noon lamb bar-B-Oue there will be presentation by the Lamb Packers and Feeders Lamb Merchandisers, and research people on market lamb evaluation and acceptability. The afternoon program will conclude with sessions on show lamb classification and selection, and a new approach to lamb showmanship contests.

Saturday, morning, July

19, all Clinic participants will meet at Wilson and Company Lamb Plant to view and discuss the evaluation lambs on the rail. There is a lot of interest in this educational event. Any 4-H members adult leaders, or other interested sheepman interested in attending this event should contact the County Agents' Office for arrangements.
