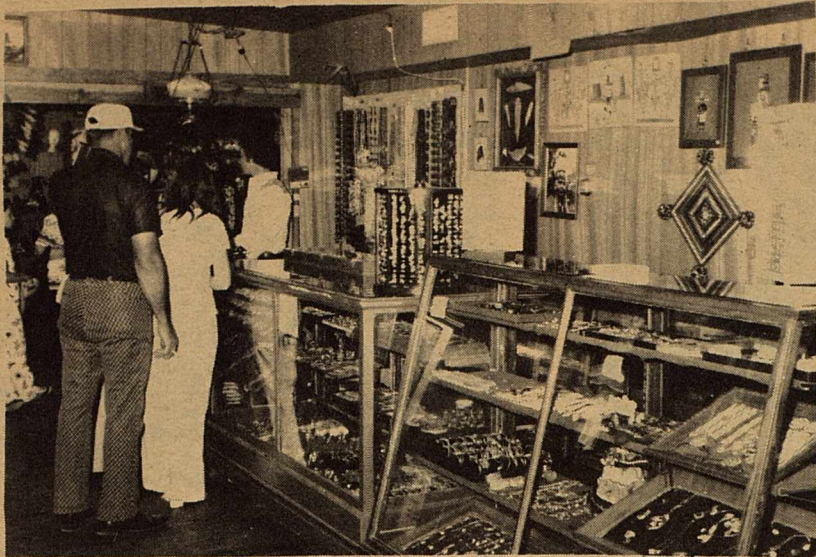

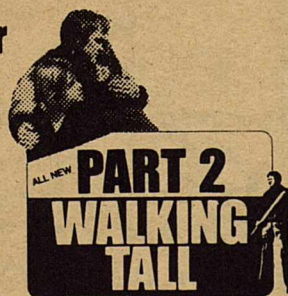

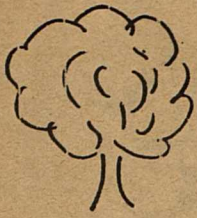

## COMMENTS from The SAGEBRUSH



Comments from the Sagebrush

"Cutting" ants are always a problem in this area. They can strip a large plant or small tree overnight. They are most active following a rain or shower. They work mostly at night but sometimes in the daylight hours. If you see any sign of plants or trees being eaten try to catch the ants working. If you do, follow the trail of ants to their hole. Use any good "ant bart" and sprinkle heavily in a circle about four feet across with the hole in the center. Use an extra heavy dose for 3 to 6 inches around the hole. There still remains nothing safer and better than chlordane but thanks to irresponsible and arbitrary rulings by the federal beurocracy you may no longer be able to but. it. So buy whatever you can find and use it.

\*\*\*\*\*

Trees like anthing else demand much care. To be the best and heaviest leafed, even the mesquite should be fed. Like anything that grows-trees with ample food and water are heavier greener and grow faster. There are many good ways to do this.

There are fertilizer spikes you simply drive in the ground, fertilizer pellets, to be used in root feeders that both feed and water at root level or just to sprinle any good all purpose fertilizer around the tree from the "drip line" (outer edge of leaves) to the tree trunk and the tree will be fed as it is watered.

If your tree has webs in it, it should be sprayed when webs are first found. Web worms are more plentiful and earlier this year than ever. Mulberry trees are hardest hit but the caterpillars from the web have eaten: peach, lagustrum, and many other as well as house plants. They will even find their way into the house in some instances. For the good of the tree and your neighbors, you should spray. Army worms are bad in pecan trees. They can strip a tree bare in a very short time. There is a good crop of pecans this year---- protect them by spraying.

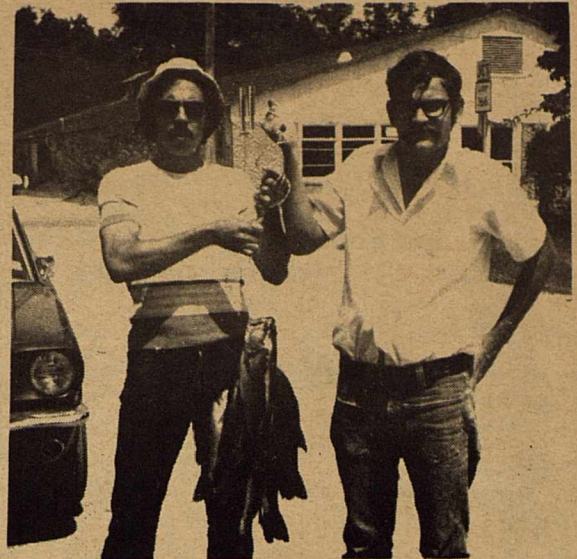

## CITY COUNCIL

### CITY TO OPERATE SECTION 8 HOUSING

The Housing Authority of Brackettville made an application to HUD for the Section 8 Housing Assistance Program with the understanding that the City would be Sub-Contractors and operate the plan in all phases. The Housing Authority felt that they did not have sufficient staff to implement the program.

The City will be co-ordinators and go between for the owners, contractors, real estate people and the prospective tenants, seeing that all phases of the operation conform to guide lines.

As soon as the Contract is completed there will be more information published.

This program is part of the Community Development Plan for which the City has already been approved.

### COUNCIL ADOPTS BUDGETS

At the Regular Meeting, Aug. 11, 1975 the City Council approved and adopted the 1975-76 Budgets.

The General Fund Budget showed an anticipated increase of \$11,103.52. The 1974-75 Budget was \$53,207.57. This years is \$64,311.09. The actual figures for 1974-75 were: Revenues \$56,229.76, Expenditures of \$57,249.91, aminus of \$1,020.15.

The Utility Budget increased from \$126,822.27 to \$156,378.12 an increase of \$29,555.85. The biggest part of the increase is due to rise in Natural Gas cost. Last years' increase over budget cost for Matural Gas was \$18,029.26.

The Council had a lot of thinking to do on the General Fund Budget as the first draft showed a need of approximately \$10,000.00 more that anticipated Revenues.

### EMERGENCY LIGHTS

The Council approved the use of Emergency Lights for the following ambulance drivers: Ray Huntley; Ginger Dodson; Chris Gomez; Darrell Paul Franks and Eloy Garcia. The City could not approve Edgar Kent and Rosemary Slubar as they reside in Fort Clark Springs, however, they did give approval for them to use lights in the City.

Emergency Lights are to be used only when drivers are on a call, any other use will constitute a violation of traffic laws.

Next week we will publish the ordinance on the use and observance of emergency light as there is widespread violations, especially during fires.

### FOOTBALL PARKING

Elsewhere you will a plan for the parking of vehicles at the football games at Tiger Field, this year. This has long been a dangerous situation. This plan will only be in effect during games or some major attraction at Tiger Field, there will be signs and personnel to guide the traffic and all rules will be enforced. More information will be given before the football games start.

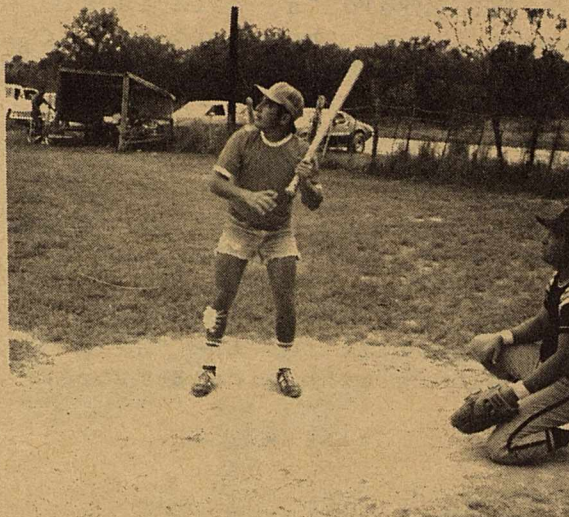

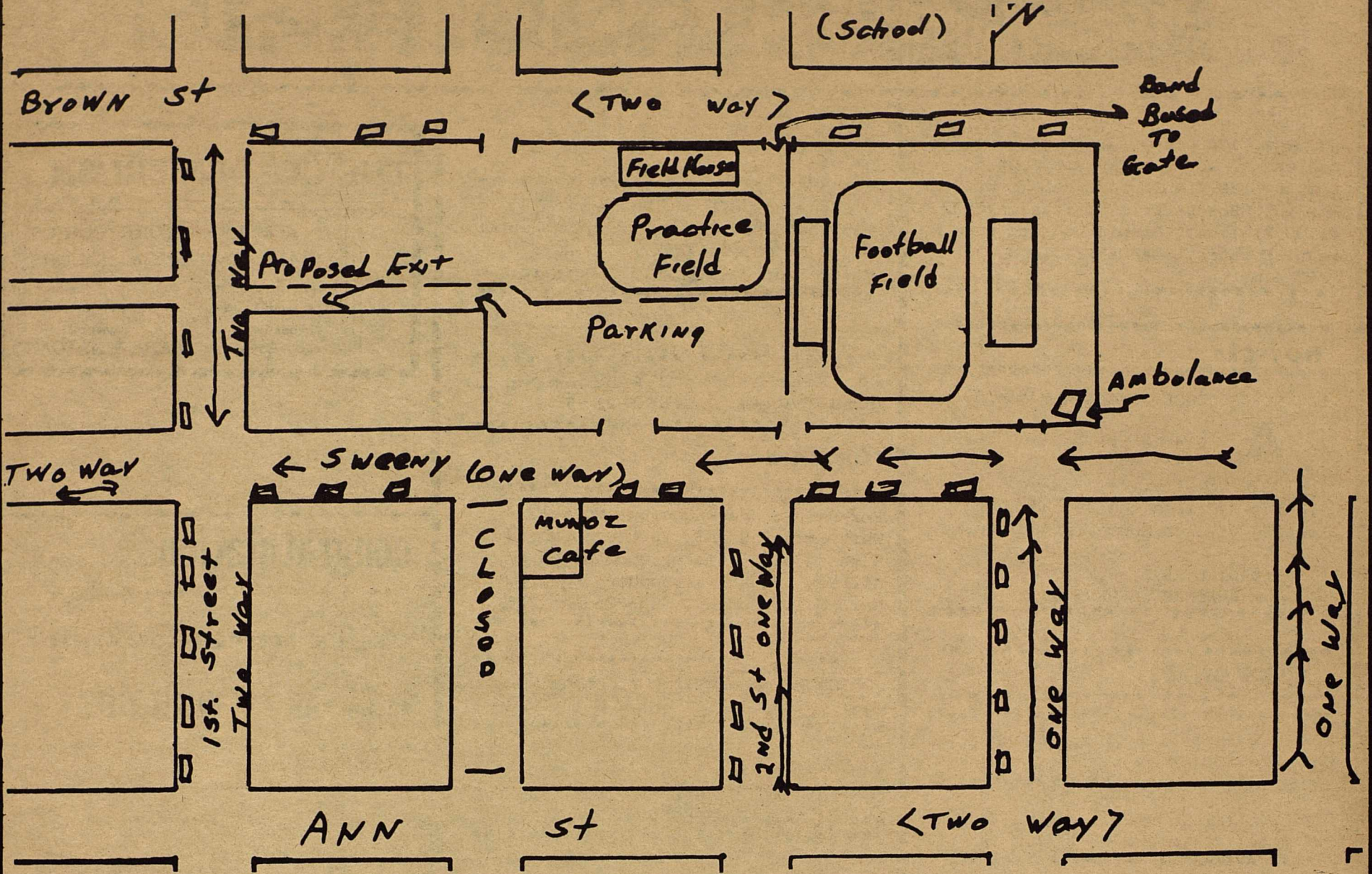
