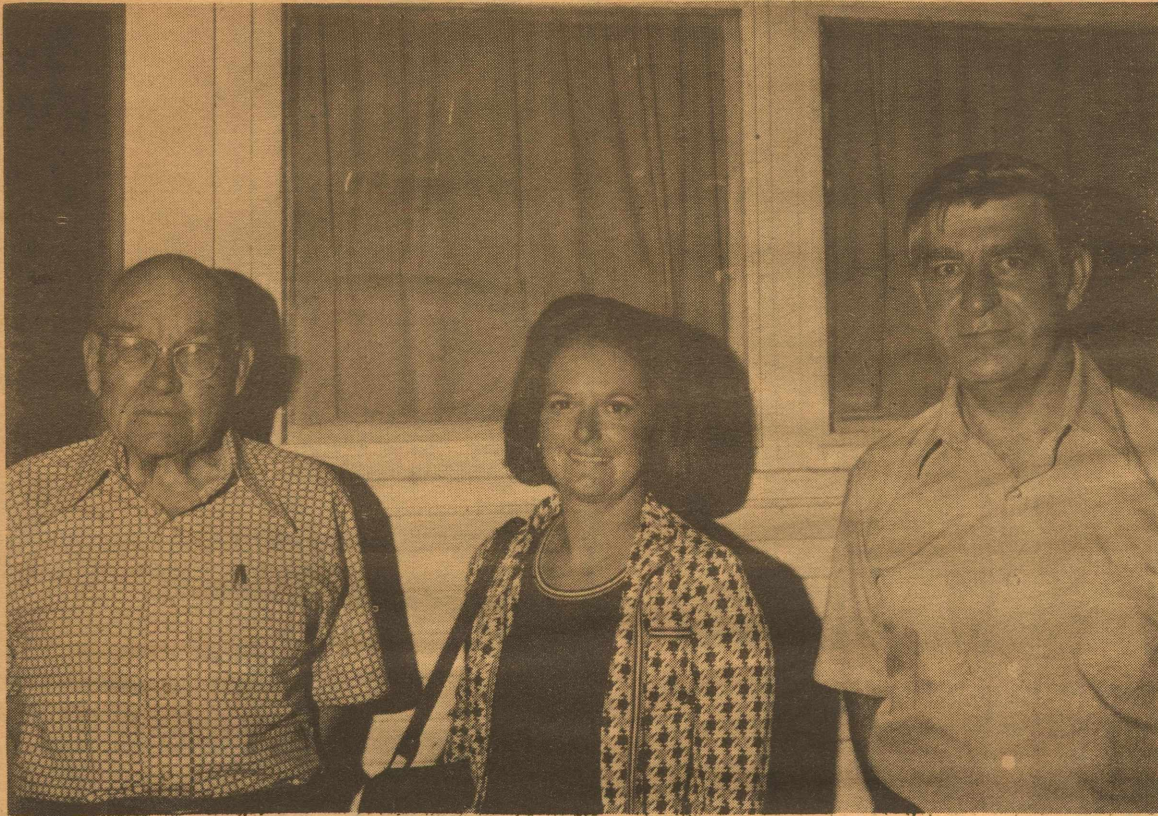
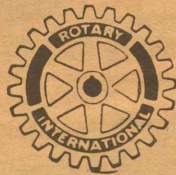
"DOTTSY" Visits Brackettville

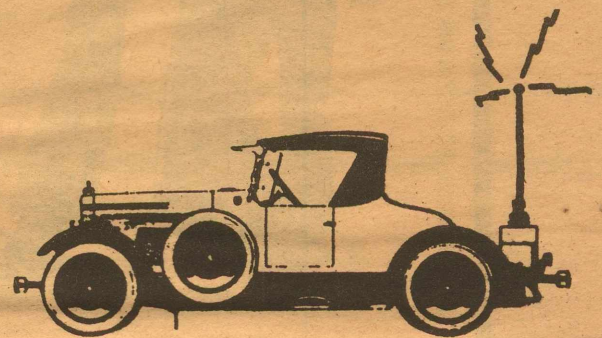

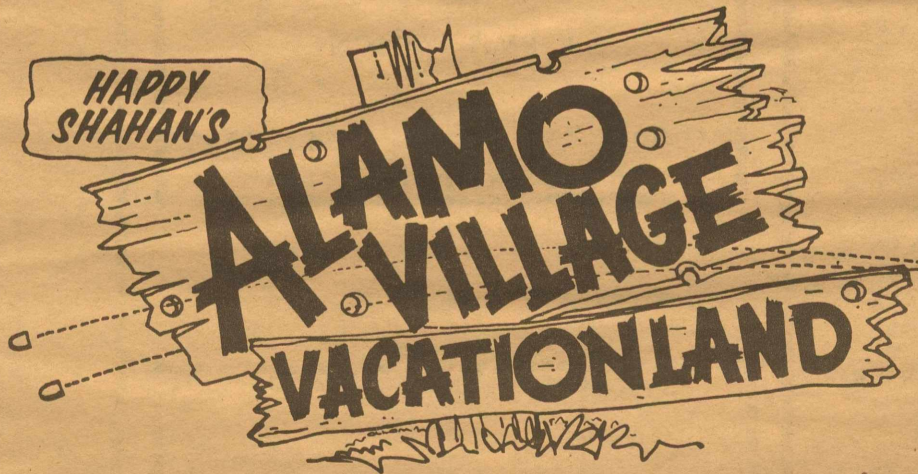
