AUSTIN---Representative Susan McBee has been appointed to the Legislative Council by Speaker of the House, Bill Clayton.

Mrs. McBee is one of ten (10) Representatives appointed to the Legislative Council by the Speaker. In addition, five (5) Senators are appointed by the Lieutenant Governor. Each will serve for the next twelve months.

The Legislative Council provides facilities and professional personnel to assist members of the legislature in areas of research, special studies, Legal Council, communications, and bill drafting. The regular research staff, supplemented by temporary members and consultants, makes studies requested by the legislature and by the Council itself.

METHODIST SERVICES

You thing the prices of apples, peaches and other fresh fruit is so high, you'll grow your own? That's great! It's time to begin thinking about planting trees. It is best to plant them as soon as they go dormant and are ready to dig.

There are a number of things to remember. The main thing is to plant trees that will bear fruit in this area. Don't be fooled by advertising that say "all these trees will produce in this area" and then lists trees with a familiar name or a fruit you like. If you want to grow apples--more to the mountains of New Mexico or North, North, North..... In spite of newspaper advertising apples will not produce in this area. They must have more cold weather. There is in the offeringan apple that will likely bear fruit here...but not yet.

Some brands of peaches do well here Babcock, Chilow and best of all the Leona. If any peaches produce here these will---you'll waste your time with Elberta, Early Elberta, Hale and many others. Varieties of Plums that do well well here are Excelsior Mariposa, and Santa Rosa. For pears try Douglas, Improved Kieffer, Monterey. In our area if you like apricots try Royal, Moorpark or Blenheim.

It is best to buy balled and burlapped trees. There's less chance of loss of the tree by careless handling. There is less root disturbance, also. If you plant good healthy trees that are balled and burlapped and plant them early---DECEMBER---you should have some peaches, plums, and apricots the first year, pears take longer.

Like anything else, the trees grown, developed and produced in this area and for this area do better.
