The Mexican army, portrayed by the National Re-enactment Society, stormed the walls several times before the actual capture of the compound. ## KAZEN IN WASHINGTON

The House last week voted $\$ 4.8$ billion for foreign aid in fiscal 1976, and while I opposed the bill, I see some good signs in our actions I was concerned about the amount involved, representing an increase of 126 per cent over the previous year. I do not believe it is reasonable fo our nation to provide a greater share of our resources to support security assistance in foreign countries while we are facing serious problems in meeting our own security needs also could not accept some individual elements of the legislation which I felt were unwise.

On the other hand provisions in the bill increase the voice of the Congress in use and distribution of foreign aid funds, and we went on

TWO INTERESTING SUMS
At the request of Speaker Carl Albert, I presided when the House met as committee of the whole on the foreign aid appropriations so I di.d not participate in the debate. However, I was especially impressed by the argument of one of our Texas colleagues, Jim Wright, about a fiscal coincidence

He noted that the President had asked $\$ 6.2$ billion for foreign aid, while only three weeks ago he had vetoed a domestic jobs bill involving the same sum. In the foreign aid bill, provisions are made for 406 starts on construction projects in foreign countries. Yet the President when he sent up his budget, said he

reservoirs and flood control in our country. He has taken the position that we connot spend more for schools highways, libraries and parks, saying the jobs bill "was nothing more than pork barrel legislation."

I thought Congressman Wright was on solid ground when he said he could not support foreign projects when domestic jobs were denied to our people. He mad= the argument I would have made if I had been on the floor.

MILK SUPPORTS UP
The Secretary of Agriculture last week announced that the support price for manufacturing milk would be increased to 80 per cent of parity, effective April 1. He said the new level was required to provide sufficient farm income to insure continued production by our dairy farmers.

I +ool the same view when we passed legislation in this area last year, only to have it vetoed by the President I am convinced that we must keep family-owned dairy farms producing milk or our consumers will face higher prices from less total milk production Quarterly review of parity levels is now required, so that prices can be adjusted as necessary.

## CB LEGISLATION IN PROSPECT

have received a large volume of mail from constituents seeking help in getting Citizens' Band radio licenses from the Federal Communications commission. I can now report that the Congress is acting on the problem that developed when CB applications rose from 30,000 a month two years ago to 100,000 last March, passed 400,000 in December and topped 500,000 in January. I'm told there are 205,000 licensees in Texas and some five million in the nation, but officials believe there may be again as many operating illegally without licenses I think the Congress will soon procan hire personnel to process applications much faster.
I also see wisdom in proposals for laws to curb mis-use of $C B$ facilities. It is reported that some operators are boosting power of their transmitters illegally, so that they interfere with emergency broadcast communications and home television reception.

## GUN CONTROL DEAD

Another issue of district concern has been proposals for new federal gun control laws. Apparently that issue has died for this Congress, because the House Judiciary committee could not agree to legislation proposed by a sub-committee. While the bill was simed at controlling small handguns, the so-called Saturday night specials - the committee members either found the restrictions 00 strict or not strict enough.
The Judiciary committee rejected the bill by a vote of $17-16$. Advocates said they doubted that they will press for new legislation this will pre
session.
