

## **NEW LAW FORESEEN**

Washington, D.C. -- Senator Lloyd Bentsen Tuesday said he believes a new \$17.6 billion, 2-1/2 year highway bill will be signed into law by the middle of April.

Bentsen was Chairman of the House-Senate Conference Committee which completed work on the compromise highway bill last week. The Conference report is expected to be written and ready for final congressional action as early as two weeks from now.

"I am hopeful that the President will sign this new measure as soon as it receives congressional approval so that we can ease the strain on the highway program in Texas and in other states," Bentsen said.

The Conference bill includes \$7.8 billion for each of the next two fiscal years plus \$1.8 billion for the interim period until the new fiscal year starts October 1.

The legislation represents a compromise between the \$7.3 billion per year included in the original Senate bill and the \$8.8 billion in the House measure.

The new highway bill provides \$3.5 billion for each of the two years for Interstate construction, \$600 per year for highway safety, \$1.35 billion in Primary Highway funds, \$800 million in Urban funds and \$400 million in Secondary Highway funds.

"These funds are badly needed in my State of Texas, for example, which is completely out of Primary and Secondary Highway funds," Senator Bentsen said.

SAGEBRUSH BY JOE TOWNSEND I am having more inquires about lawns, plants and yards than I've ever had. Usually when I check it out the two big problems are lack of water and impatience. Somehow we forget that the weather has been dry, dry, dry. You can't simply wet the top of the ground thoroughly and get sufficient water to the roots of plants. You must also rememner a little rain goes better and farther than a lot of water from the sprinkler. So---water long and thoroughly and often. Also remember though the days are hot the nights are cool to cold and things don't grow all that fast under these conditions These hot days make our gardening

fever rise, but they don't produce great plants when the nites are so cool. So just be patient, water, and time will work wonders. Also now is the time to feed your trees. As a growing boy needs to be fed, waking and growing trees need to be feed also. A good heavy feeding will pay big dividends in short order.






### JOE TOWNSEND


