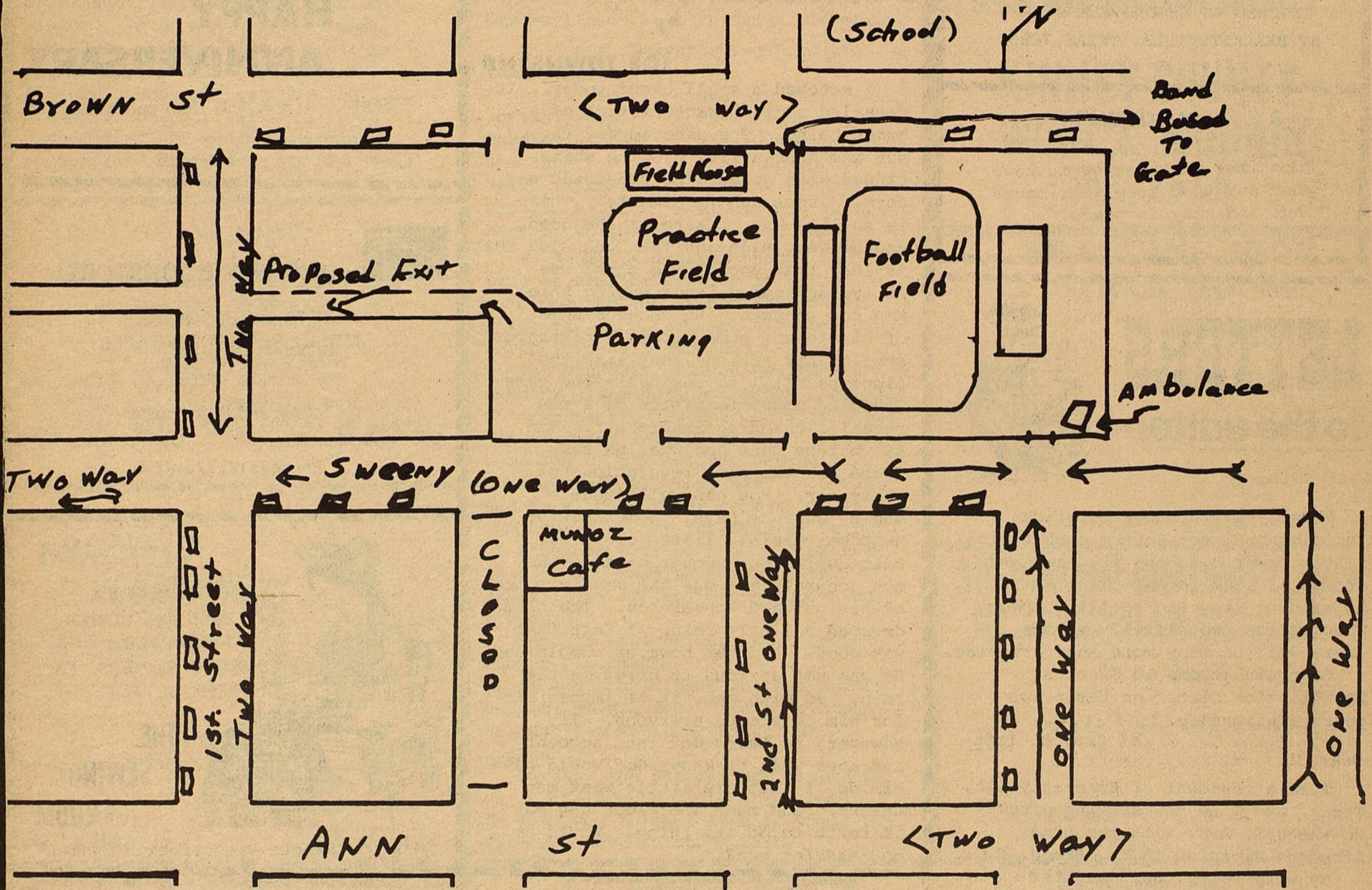

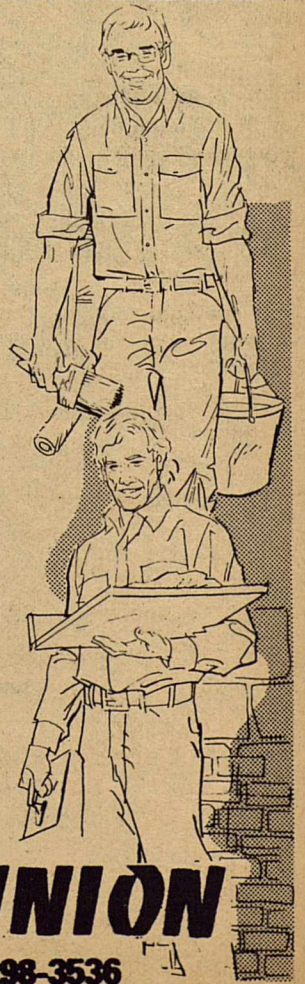
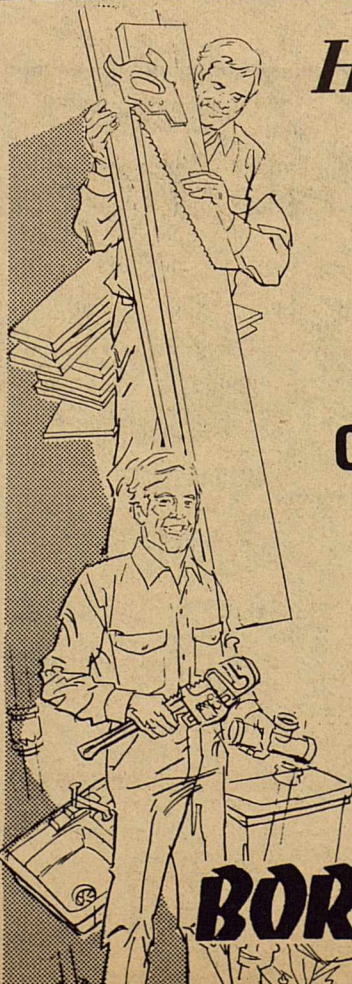

# TIPS FOR GREEN THUMBS

The question arises about flowers in flower beds through the winter. Marigolds and such summer flowers have become ragged and should be replaced. There is no good reason to have a drab yard for lack of flowers in the winter. When you take out the old flowers, work the soil good, add fertilizer and water the ground well. When the ground is dry enough to work well it is time to put out bedding plants.

You can plant calendula. They will provide you with large yellow or orange flowers all through the winter. Phlox will give an array of colors until spring. Dyanthus make exceptionally good winter flowers. Soon you can put out snapdragons. Do not feel like it is winter time and everything has to be dead and drab for a while. This is true only if you want it to be.

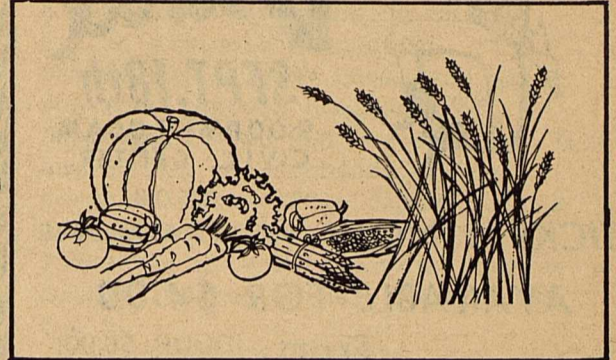
Students will be tested from time to time and will be moved up in skill level if they are progressing properly.

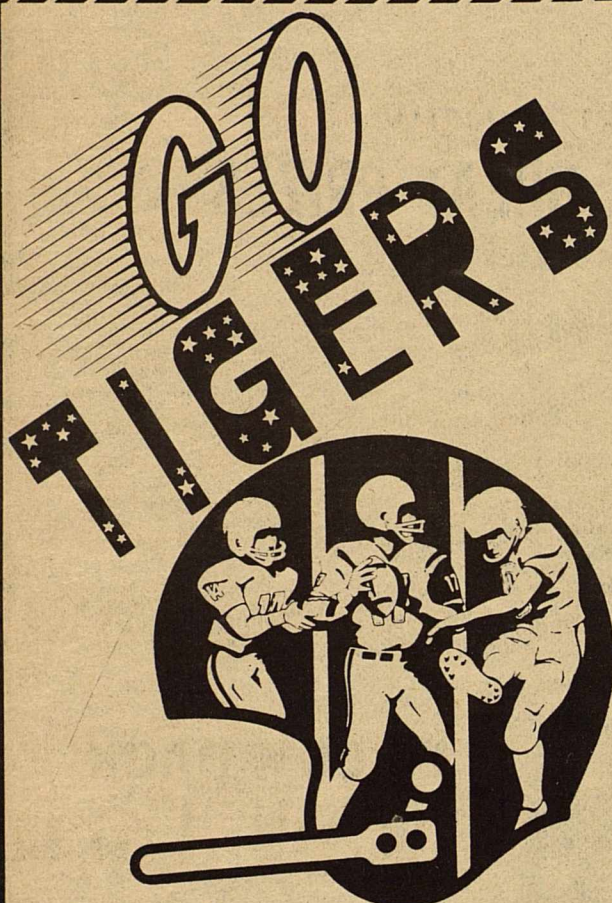
## Beta Sigma Phi Alpha Epsilon Psi
