

Home Garden Shortcourse There will be a home gardening shortcourse for all interested people in Kinney County on Monday 21 at 1:30 p.m. at the Kinney County Courthouse. This shortcourse will include such items as preparing your garden for planting, important varieties to plant, proper planting, fertilizing, watering and harvesting techniques, disease and insect control and other important topics. Jerry Parsons District 13 Vegetable Horticulturist will present most of the program. Gardening time is near so this shortcourse should be most beneficial for all.

Sheep Field Day The annual Sheep Field Day held at Sonora Experiment Station will be Thursday March 17. This field day is being held at the conclusion of ram test feeding period. All rams that have been tested will be available to look at and a sale of all certified rams will be held that afternoon. Beef Research and Information Act and Pending Referendum The beef industry is gearing itself up for a referendum to determine if beef producers want a national check-off program or not. The beef research and information act is a self help plan under which producers can raise funds for beef research, consumer education, producer information, promotion and market development programs. If you have not trimmed your trees you should do so immediately. Any low hanging limbs or sprouts at the base if the trunk should be removed. The more you trim off of the tree, the more abundant growth you will have in the remainder of the tree. With a root system enough to feed the entire tree, when you trim off part of it the remainder of the tree will get full benefit of the root system thus a fuller, healthier tree will be forthcoming.

It is full late to be planting most trees. To insure growth it is good to dig your hole large enough and deep enough so the tree can be at about the same depth as before it was duq. Fill the hole with water to which has been added some root stimulater. Then place the tree and fill the hole. If the soil is tight it is best to add some mulch to the soil before filling the hole.

When buying trees don't pay much attention to the height of the tree. A tree can be tall and of poor quality. The best way to buy a tree is by the caliper of the trunk. This means the thickness or diameter of the trunk. A tree not properly grown can be very tall and have a low caliper. This tree will not be what you want in a tree. When you are planting the tree, trim off about the top one-third of the tree. This will give you a one. Plant your trees now -there's barely time for most
