Brown and Root Company of Houston is presently involved in a survey of Amistad Dam on the requirements that will be involved in installing Hydroelectrical Generators to supply the area with a portion of its electrical supply.

When the Dam was constructed provisions were made for the later installation of electrical generating equipment. Although the facility when completed will not supply all the electrical energy demands of the area, it will provide substantial amounts of energy.

No actual contract for construction has been let at this time, the new facility could be producing electricity with in the next 18 months to two years.

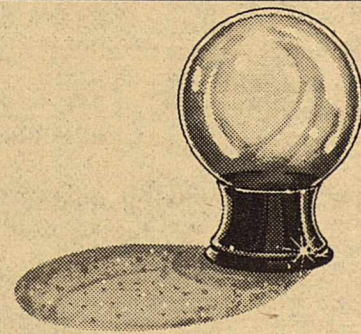

Present Day Myths

Somewhere there has arisen the idea that the way to beat inflation is to raise wages, raise social security, benefits, raise welfare payments, have more free services (medical, dental, transportation, meals, build more cheap buildings at high costs, etc.) Such an idea could only be dreamed up and promoted by politicians trying to buy votes and bureaucrats trying to spread the reach of their pet programs. Rather than solve the inflation problem these are the cause of inflation. Rather than reduce prices these cause higher prices. Labors shouts and cries that they must have higher wages and greater fringe benefits to meet higher prices is either the cry of the ignorant or the dishonest mouthings of the unscrupulous. When labor cost rises prices must include the rise in cost. When fringe benefits are added to labor, prices must include the cost increase. When Social Security Benefits increase, prices must increase with the added cost. Additional labor taking care of the red tape involved in these items must be added to prices.

"There are not free lunches"--- the price has to be paid---and the consumer must pay! In 1931 prices were low and labor was cheap. Mr. Roosevelt by illegal executive order cut man hours of the work day and week and raised wages. The Supreme Court declared it illegal but the damage was already done. This action caused prices to rise. This leap frog affair still continues. Raise labor cost and fringe benefits and prices go up. The present day myth that wages must be raised to meet higher prices (cost of living increase) is the old story of the tail wagging the dog. When roughly 20¢ worth of raw materials is transformed into a \$20.00 shirt almost the total cost of the shirt is labor cost. It's amazing how masses of people want wages to go up and expect prices to remain low. This happens where people let labor leaders, bureaucrats and politicians do their thinking for them.

ORGANIZATIONS INVITED TO SPONSOR DANCING TOURING PROGRAM

Organizations throughout the state are invited to participate in the 1978-79 Dance Touring Program funded by the National Endowment for the Arts and administered by the Texas Commission on the Arts and Humanities, according to Maurice Coats, TCAH executive director.

The Dance Touring Program helps nonprofit, tax-exempt groups sponsor five days of dance company residency for public performances, workshops, master classes and lecture demonstration. In the past sponsors have included symphonies, theatre groups, local dance groups, museums, colleges, universities, local arts councils, service organizations, Junior League and Rotary, public and private schools and many more.

The limited funding is available strictly on a first come, first served basis and interested persons should immediately contact the Texas Commission on the Arts and Humanities if they are considering participation.

The National Endowment for the Arts funding provides 30 per cent of a company's base fee. Additional assistance of up to one-sixth of the fee may be provided by the Texas Commission on the Arts and Humanities in accordance with grant application procedures.

Participating organizations choose the dance company they wish to sponsor from a list of over 160 professional dance companies which offer a wide range of disciplines.

The 1979 Directory of Dance Companies is now available from the Texas Commission on the Arts and Humanities. The Commission staff also provides technical assistance to organizations wishing to participate and will aid organizations in negotiations.




Hill Country areas of the region report good progress with oats due to ample rainfall while southern counties need more moisture for oats. The Sutton County area stills remains dry with ranges short and ranchers feeding all classes of livestock.

TIPS FOR GREEN THUMBS

It is now tree trimming time. If you have young mulberry trees you will want to prune them severely. This is a necessity if you want the trees to be shapely, healthy, full-bodied trees. All low shoots of trees should be cut off. If old trees have a considerable amount of dead in them it is wise to top these trees and give them a fresh start. Each cut should be a clean cut that does not strip bark or fiber from the remaining stump. Cuts should be made at an angle to the ground. If cuts parallel the ground there is a danger of water collecting and rotting the stump. If properly cut it is not necessary to paint the remaining stump. Any limbs cut off of the major limb or trunk should be cut close and parallel to the remaining portion of the trees. Trim trees now and the cuts will heal and seal and you will have better trees in the spring.

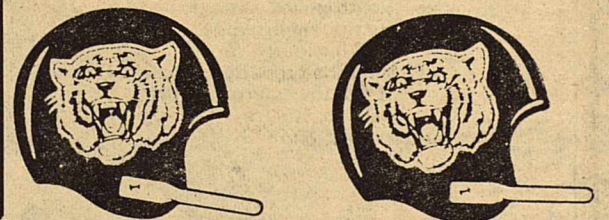
On Wednesday, November 23, I was privileged to attend a performance of the rock group Kiss at Joe Freeman Coliseum in San Antonio.



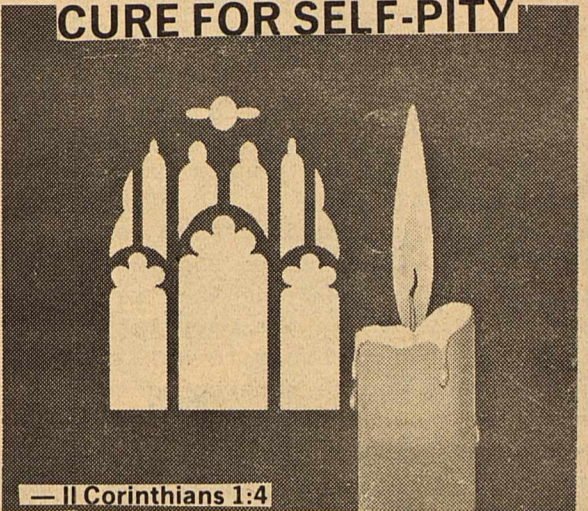
