COUNTY MEETS ON LIBRARY PROBLEM

Kinney County 4-H members Exhibit Market Lambs at San Antonio Livestock Show

Nineteen Kinney County 4-H Club members exhibited fifty-six head of market lambs at the recent San Antonio Livestock Show held February 10 at the Joe Freeman Coliseum. Over fourteen hundred head of market lambs were exhibited by 4-H and FFA members from across the state of Texas.

Coates, 14th place medium weight finewool crossbred lamb; and 32nd place heavy weight finewool crossbred lamb; Brenda Foust, 25th place medium weight finewool; Brad Gwartney, 35th place heavy weight finewool lamb; Ginger Hooten, 33rd medium weight finewool lamb; Kevin Kaplan, 18th place light weight finewool lamb, 20th place light weight finewool crossbred lamb, and 22nd place heavyweight finewool lamb; Doug McCarty, 5th place medium weight finewool lamb, 23rd heavyweight finewool lamb, 23rd medium weight finewool crossbred and 38th heavyweight finewool crossbred; Jim Lindeman, 35th place light weight finewool lamb; and Tana McCarty ???heavy weight finewool lamb. Other exhibitors from Kinney county incuded Debbie Latham, Rex McCarty, Seth Kaplan and Toby Frerich. city hall

Monday night at City Hall the Brackettville City Council met with the owners of Brackettville Cable TV Company.

The owners of the TV company, Fred Brien and Louie Younts, both of Del Rio, appeared before the Council to enlighten the Councilmen on questions concerning the cable service to the City residents.

Brien state he knew the system has some problems but he felt they had been improved by the electrician they had hired. He has made the system more efficient in the month that he has been working.

Another question submitted to the owners by the council was the expanding of the system to include Channel 9 to the area. According to Brien and Yount they could offer it for and extra one dollar per month. Brien slao informed the council that work on the reception of Channel 5 is scheduled for the future and that the reception will be converted to Channel 6 while the maitainence work is being completed but that further noticed will be given.

If the City decides to change the agreement a public hearing will be held and the City made no committments to set up the hearing and the issue is still pending.

A traffic survey recently conducted in Brackett has set up Stop and Caution signs to be supplied with 100% federal funding, if the city will furnish the poles

Also the Councilmen reviewed the Water system. According to Jim Allen, Water Tower Specialist the water tower is in need of repairs and must be enlarged to accommodate the increasing population of Brackett.

Tim Ward, City Manager, stated Allen had inspected the leak found in the tower and also found corrosion damage. He said the corrosion of the tank could be fixed by re-coating the inside with a more permanent coating.

He also stated that the 75,000 gallon tank could easily be converted into a 100,000 gallon tank with side expansion and raising the roof. Councilman Borden ask Allen to draw up the proposal of costs.

Allen also stated the ground storage tank needs minor repairs also but not of major concern of the Council at this time.

The month of January had 68 issued tickets as reported by City Police Chief Morgan Bailey.

COMMISSIONERS' COURT

Kinney County Commissioners' Court met on Monday, of this week, with John Myers, former contractor of the K.C. Library project. Myers of the Myers Construction of Uvalde had had his contract terminated after he ask for additional funds to complete the project. Work on the library halted after the funds were refused, leading to the termination of the contract.

In the meeting Myers said he would be interested in renegotiating a contract to finish the Library, this time with a valid bonds. (As before a bond which held Myers respeponsible to the subcontractors was invalid due to technical diffi-culties.)

No definite agreement was made between the parties involved The commissioners sought an agreement term that Myers would pay all subcontractors on the job.

Myers stated he had purchased the bonds and that he is in consultation with his lawyers concerning the bonds.

The Commissioners' Court will meet again Monday to discuss the project further.

The court heard then from the Texas Parks and Wildlife Commission on guidelines affecting Kinney County to obtain comments and suggestions.

1. It will not be unlawful to attract game birds or animals in the State with electronic or recorded devices.

2. Suggested by the Commission was a spring turkey gobbler season which would begin the closest Saturday to April 15 and last for 16 consecutive days limit being one turkey.

On this the Court disagreed with the season for fear of interfering with lambing time in the County.

of Uvalde as county auditors.

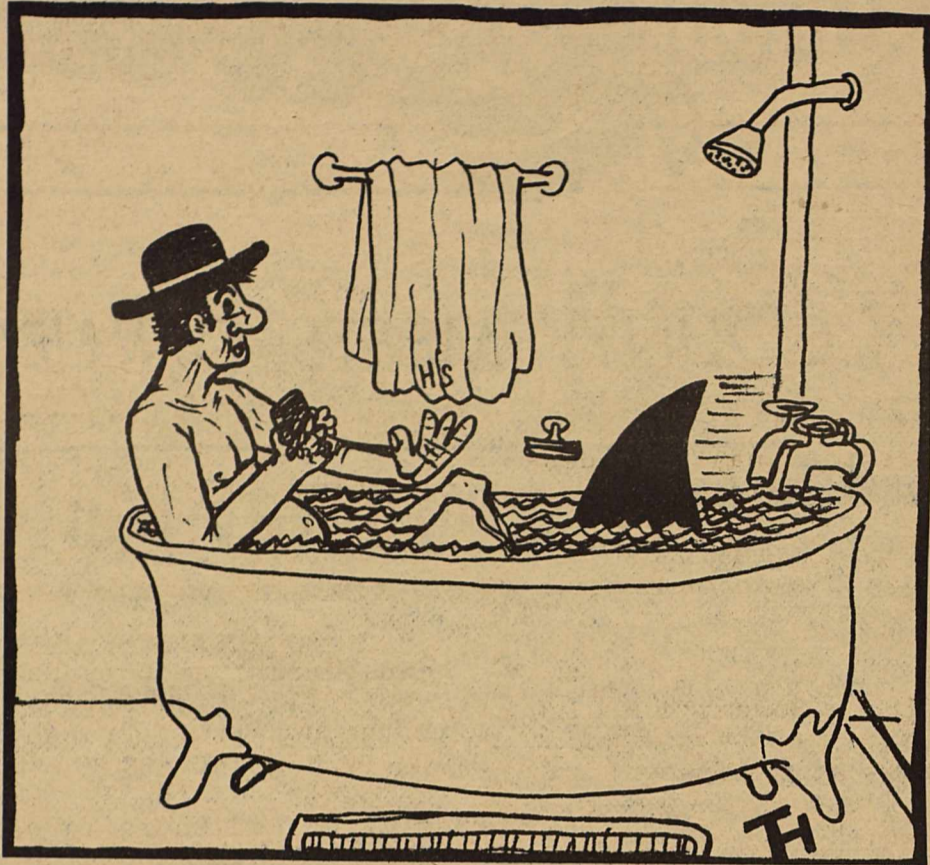

Soil Conservation

PROPER GRAZING USE ESSENTIAL

Proper grazing use is essential to help maintain and improve the productivity of rangeland. Over grazed pastures deteriorate. The rate depends upon the length and severity of overuse.

A evaluation of the amount of grazing use in a pasture should be made several times during the year. This helps to plan adjustments in livestock numbers that may be necessary to prevent overgrazing.

There are two major evaluation factors that are necessary to plan proper grazing use. First a key grazing areas is selected for each pasture. This area should represent the average amount of grazing use for the pasture. There will be some other areas of the pasture grazed a little heavier and some a little lighter. If the key grazing area is properly grazed, the pasture as a whole will not be excessively used.

Next the key species is determined for each pasture. Generally the key species is the best quality grazing plant that produces about 15 percent or more of the available forage on the key grazing area. It could be a better quality plant present in smaller amounts. The selection is based upon the management objectives of the operator.

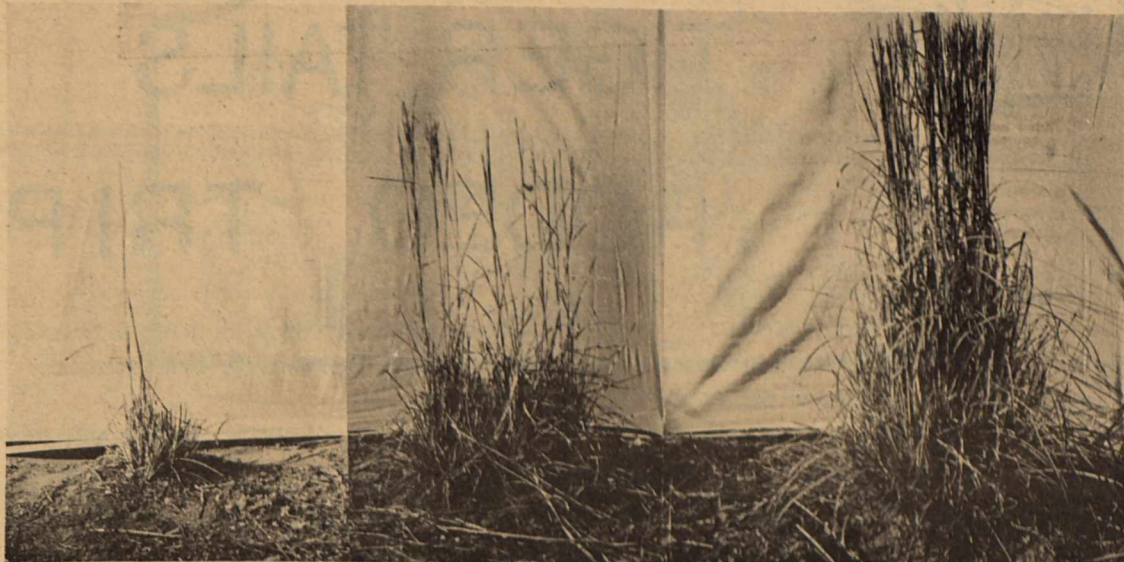
Once the key grazing area and key species is determined for each pasture, a quick look at this species on this area is all that is needed to estimate the current level of use in the pasture.

The maximum amount of annual production that can be removed from grasses and maintain healthy plants is 50 percent of the weight. If the key grasses are grazed heavier than this they will become weak, quit reproducing properly and die out. Grasses of poorer quality will take their place.

In summary, a pasture is properly grazed if no more than 50 percent by weight of the annual production of the key species is removed from the key grazing area.

The same principle applies to browse plants as the grasses. With browse, no more than 65 percent of the annual production should be removed.

YEARBOOK PICTURES TAKEN AT NEW BANK

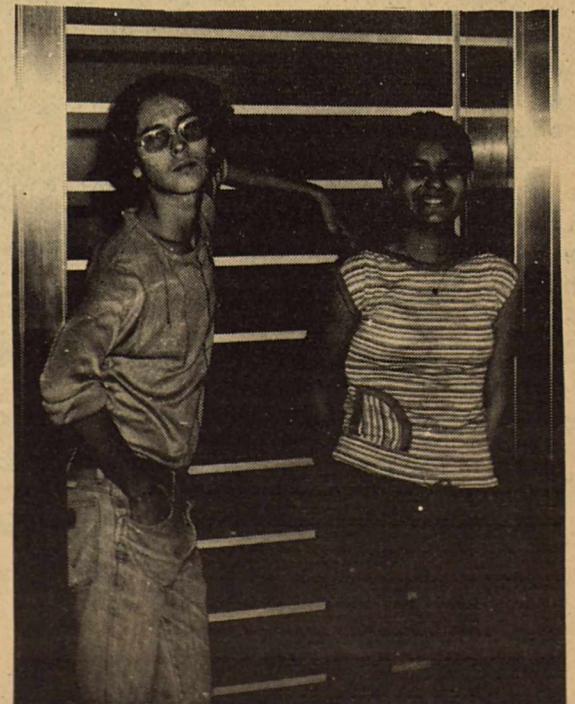

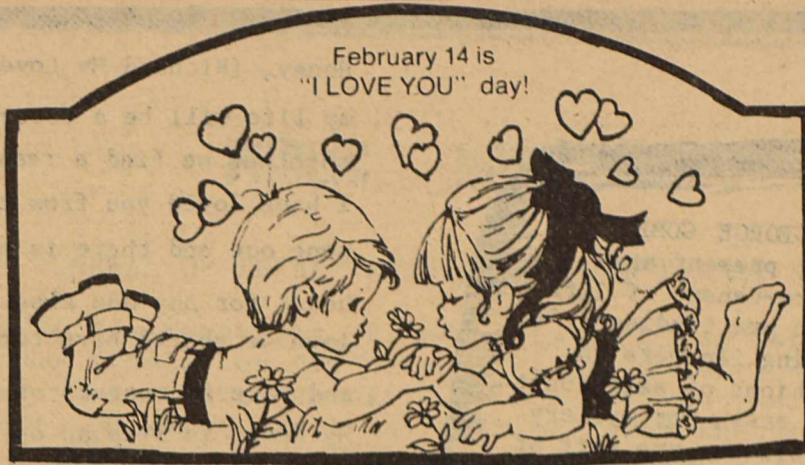

DEVILED EGG-SHRIMP CASSEROLE

PUBLIC NOTICE

PROPOSED RENEWAL OF TEXAS WATER COMMISSION PERMIT NO. 10194-01

The City of Brackettville, Kinney County, Texas has applied to the Texas Water Commission for renewal of its permit, which authorities a discharge of treated domestic sewage effluent, at a volume not to exceed 300,000 gallons per day average, from the sewage treatment facilities located approximately 0.8 mile southwest of the intersection of U.S. Highway 90 with State Highway 131 in the City of Brackettville, Kinney County, Texas. The treated domestic sewage effluent is discharged into Las Moras Creek; thence to the Rio Grande River.

RENEWAL AUTHORITY: Rule 156.25.20-.004 of the Texas Department of Water Resources.

The permit, if renewed by the Commission, will specify conditions and limitations generally the same as those currently enforced by the existing permit. The expiration date of the existing permit is July 23, 1979. It is proposed that the expiration date be specified as midnight, five years after the date of Commission approval.

No public hearing shall be held on this application for renewal unless a person who has received notice of the proposed renewal has requested a public hearing in writing. A person requesting a public hearing should set out the factual basis of his belief that such renewal should not be granted by the Commission.

If no sufficient request for hearing is received within 30 days of the date of this notice, the permit will be submitted to the Commission for approval of the renewal.

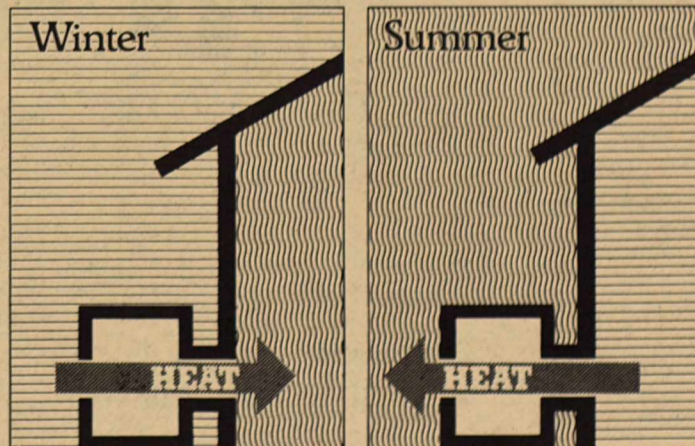

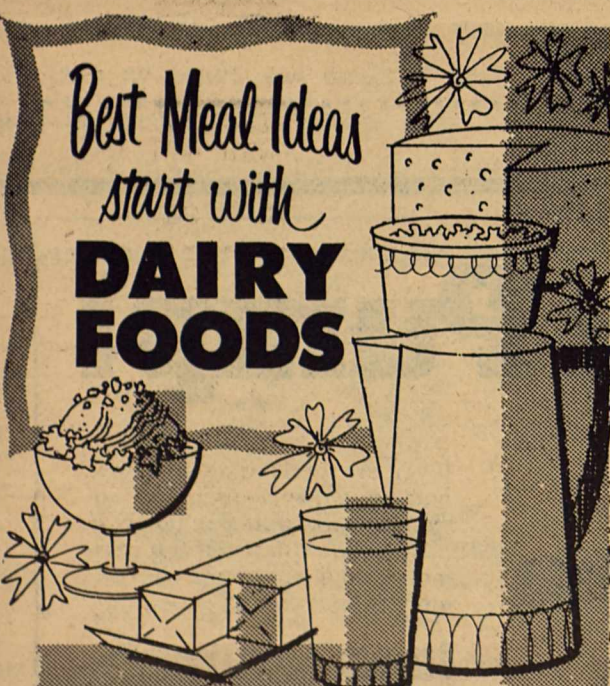
