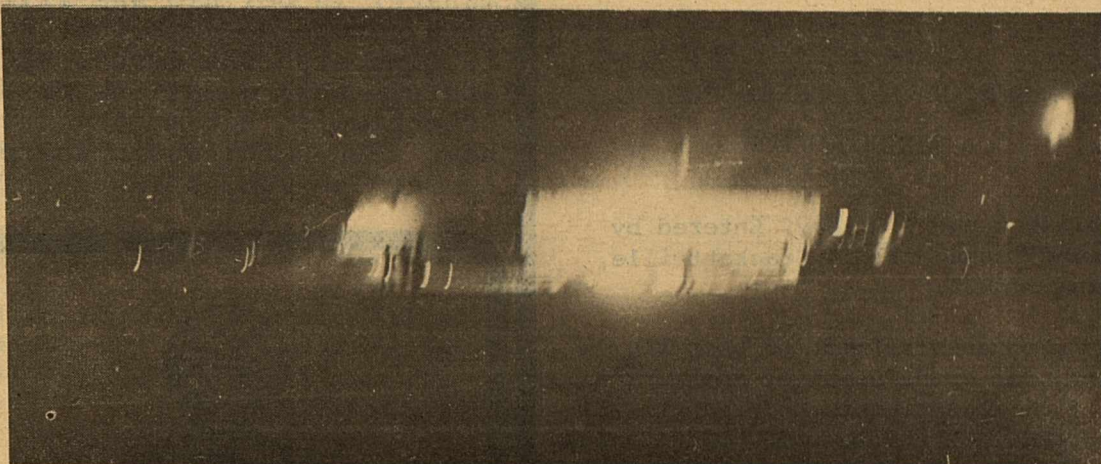

KINNEY COUNTY MEMORIAL CLINIC COMMITTEE MEETING HELD

The annual Meeting of Kinney County Memorial Clinic Committee was held on October 8th. Principal business of the meeting was the election of two trustees to fill two year terms in that office. Elected were Betty Pena, who was re-elected after serving a two year term, and RoseMary Slubar. Incumbent trustees who have one more year to serve on their present term are: Tully Shahan, B.E.Sweet, and Francis Larson.

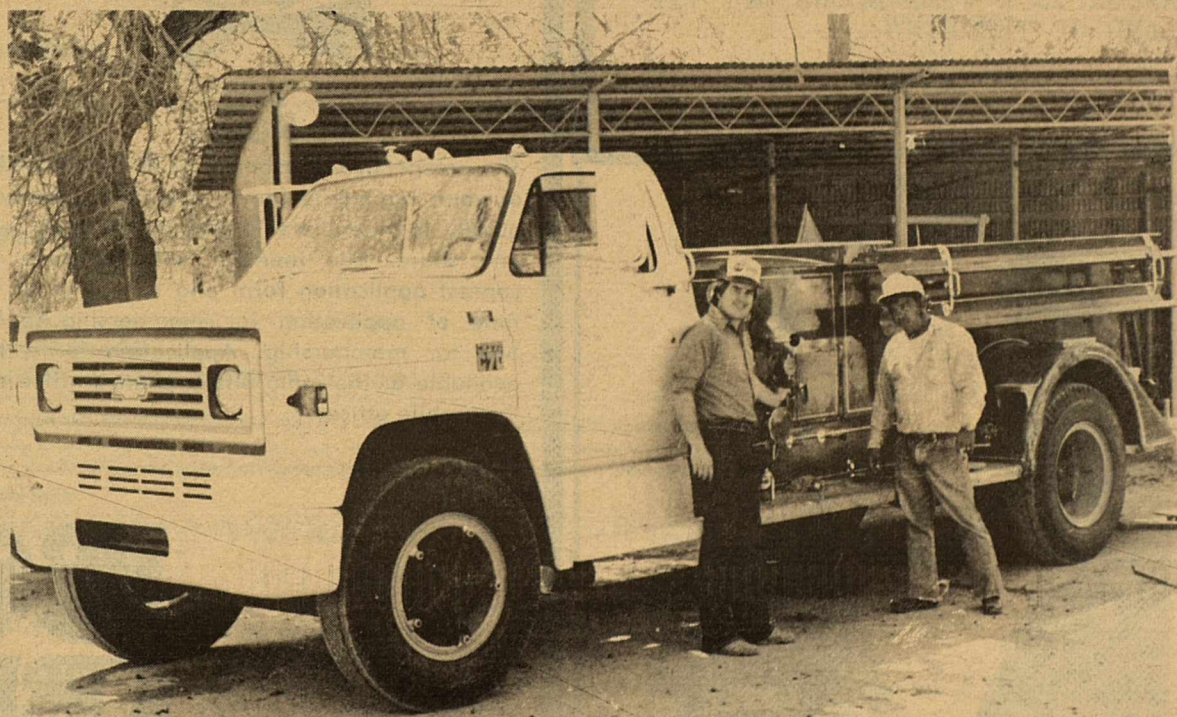
A report from the board of trustees was given as to the progress in securing health care for the community through the Maverick County Out-Patient Clinic, Inc., which is a Rural Health Initiative Program funded by HEW. Letters requesting inclusion in the Maverick County RHI was initiated by the Kinney County Clinic Committee, and the Kinney County Commissioners Court. Currently negotiation with the Maverick County RHI are being held up pending the receipt of a "Certificate of Need" from the Texas Department of Health. Expecting benefits from joining the Maverick County Out-Patient Clinic are a viable out patient clinic in Brackettville, a professional staff adequate for the health needs of the community, and assistance to those in the community who cannot afford, or are unable to secure health care through existing health care means.

It was pointed out that the trustees of the clinic will have an important role in negotiating for, and working with this new health service. Kinney County will have two representatives on the Maverick County Clinic Board of Directors--one to be elected by the community and one appointed from the Kinney County board of trustees.

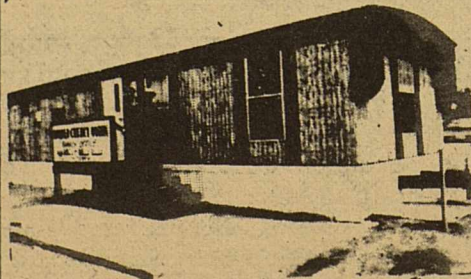

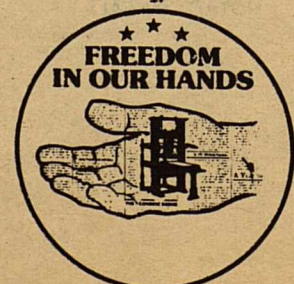

MRS BARTBERGER TO BE 100 YEARS

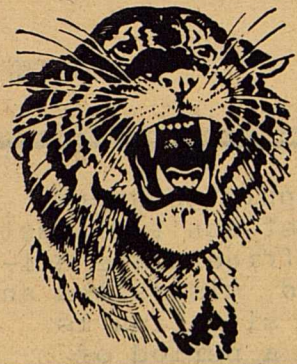
On October 25th Mrs, A.E. Bartberger will be 100 years old.
