

PUBLIC NOTICE

The Fort Clark Historic District was listed on the National Register of Historic Places December 6, 1979.

The boundaries of the proposed district are as follows: starting at the springs headwater of Las Moras Creek, proceed east along the north shore about 1/2 mile. Turn southwest at a 90 degree angle, cross the creek, and proceed 800'. Then make a 10 degree turn to the west and proceed 760'. Make a 100 degree turn to the west and proceed approximately 580' to the street behind the houses facing the parade ground. Proceed 1320', to an imaginary line extending from the street behind the commanding officers' quarters, southwest of the parade ground. Proceed northwest along that line 1320', turn a 90 degree angle to the northeast, and proceed 300'. Make another right angle turn to the southeast and proceed another 225'. Turn at a right angle to the northeast and proceed approximately 400'. Make another extension around the water tower, creating a figure 225' on the southwest and northeast sides and 150' long on the nothwest side. Continue along the northwest edge of the street 810', then turn at a 100 degree angle to the northwest. Continue 900'; make a 135 degree turn to the north and proceed 350'. At that point, make a 151 degree turn to the east and proceed 300'. Make a 110 degree turn to the east and proceed 300', which will return to the point of beginning.

Mr. Harwood attended school in Brackettville, Texas Military Townsend officiating. Because of the family's interest in the progress of the


library in Brackettville it was suggested memorials be directed to the Kinney County Library, to those wishing to do so.




