### SMALL BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION

To be eligible for these loans  
the producer must show that the  
farm operation suffered a loss and  
that the business has the ability  
to repay the loan. These loans  
can be up to \$500,000 (and more in  
some cases) at the rate of either  
5% or 8 1/4% (depending on whether the  
applicant is solvent enough to be  
able to obtain credit somewhere  
else) and can carry maturities up  
to thirty years (depending also on  
each individual's ability to repay  
the loan.

The application will be mail-  
ed to prospective applicants who  
call the above number and request  
one. These applications are simple  
to fill out and can normally be  
filled out by the applicant or his  
normal bookkeeper. The Small  
Business does not recommend or en-  
dorse any loan packager and to in-  
sure that packagers do not take  
advantage of applicants includes  
in its applications a form that  
must detail the amount charged by  
any representative for his service.

# Plants & Posies

The when-how-and why's of fertilizing your houseplants can often be confusing with so many fertilizers now on the market. But-read on-you can't have to be a chemist to figure it out!

Your houseplants fertilizer can be a dry form mixed with water or a pottling soil, on wet form dissolved in water and applied directly into the soil. There are also coated granules of slow release nutrients that feed your plant for an extended period, of time. Organic fertilizers--fish emulsion, blood meal, and manures are readily available.

The three main nutrients most important to your plants are nitrogen, phosphorus and potassium (potash) Nitrogen promotes vegetative growth, phosphorus is important for fruit formation and flower development, and potassium helps form strong stems and roots as well as improving the plants resistance to diseases.

Calcium magnesium, sulphur, and trace elements such as iron, zinc, and copper are also important to your plant and found in most fertilizers. On all fertilizers, the three numbers present, such as, 8-10-8, always represent the percentage of nitrogen, phosphorus, and potassium present (in that order)

Overfeeds, just as overwatering, will do considerable harm to your plant. On the safe side, always follow directions carefully for that particular fertilizer you purchase.

regulation. By 1979 the total hit \$358 billion—four times higher.

This crushing regulatory burden falls most heavily on the shoulders of small and medium-sized businesses—which can least afford it.

Larger corporations have the resources—legal and accounting divisions, trade associations—to help them stay aware of and comply with all federal regulations.

It is easier for major companies to cope with the expenses involved in microfilming records. This way, they can preserve records indefinitely as insurance against a charge—however ill-conceived—that they violated a federal regulation a decade ago.

But a small company often lacks the resources to maintain such full-scale monitoring and record-keeping. Smaller businesses are most apt to channel their scarce resources into the kind of research and development or new equipment that our economy needs so desperately.

There is no statute of limitations for the innocent taxpayer who happens to violate a dictate of the Department of Energy or the Environmental Protection Agency. He is liable forever.

He would be well-advised to keep records that go back years and years—just in case he is called to account by a federal agency for an alleged misdeed sometime in the distant past.

It is indeed ironic that much of the criminal element in our country—thieves, forgers, embezzlers, and extortionists—are protected by a statute of limitations.

If they can commit a crime and remain undetected for a certain number of years, they can be assured of immunity from prosecution for that deed, no matter how strong the case against them.

There is absolutely no reason to grant criminals a greater measure of protection than is offered to law-abiding citizens.

That is why I have introduced legislation that would place a five-year statute of limitations on the enforcement of rules and regulations promulgated by federal agencies. My bill also would limit to five years the time period required for individual record-keeping.

This five-year statute of limitations would not apply in cases of fraud or willful or knowing violation of a rule. Any actions and records relating to dangerous material also are exempted from the five-year statute.

This legislation is designed to guard against harassment for unwitting violations far in the past, and to reduce the costs involved in record-keeping.

If enacted into law, this measure would be applauded by millions of small business operators across America. They could "breathe easier" about focusing their resources on investment in new tools and equipment to help push America's productivity record uphill again.

My legislation is by no means intended to weaken the force or effectiveness of necessary federal regulations. But it will protect honest business operators across America from the lingering fear of prosecution for an alleged violation more than five years in the past.

**VACCINATION CERTIFICATES CAN BRING LARGER PROFITS AT SALE**

Producers who vaccinate weaned calves before sale and shipment are providing a superior product. Buyers usually pay a premium--as much as \$4 more/cwt.--for cattle that have been preconditioned or immunized against shipping and feed-lot diseases.

However, the Producer must show proof that the cattle were vaccinated. Some areas of the U.S. and Canada have preconditioning certification programs through state veterinary associations or cattleman's groups. For areas where such programs do not exist, Norden Laboratories has designated a "Certificate of Vaccination" which the company will supply to licensed veterinarians in the U.S. and Canada. Veterinarians will issue the certificates to cattle operators who vaccinate livestock prior to sale.

Presale vaccination to help protect cattle against respiratory and other feedlot diseases benefits both producers and feeders. Producers receive a premium at sale time and maintain a reputation for supplying healthy cattle. Thus, buyers will want to deal with them again. Feedlot operators have noted that preconditioned cattle go on feed faster and incur less disease and death loss. Therefore maintenance and treatment costs are lowered.

Norden Laboratories has notified salebrans operators that veterinarians will be receiving supplies of vaccination certificates. The complete form, signed by a veterinarian, should be presented to the actioneer before vaccinated cattle are sold.

**TEXAS SHEEP & GOAT RAISERS ASSOCIATION**

We've stomped and we've hollered and we've argued and pointed out and just plain pointed, but nothing's really done much good. Now we're going about it the "Civilized" way---by suing.

By "we", we mean the sheep industry as a whole, though the suit is being brought by the Wyoming Farm Bureau, the American Farm Bureau Federation and several individual sheep producers--some of whom may actually be former sheep producers.

And the suit--if you haven't guessed by now--is to force the federal government to accept its legal responsibility for predator control. There's even a provision demanding that the government fork over damages for past failures to control predation, topped off by the very real claim that the government's failure to control predation has and continues to violate the Fifth Amendment rights of sheep producers.

Principal defendant in the suit is Interior Secretary Cecil Andrus or his successor--and lawmen served papers on Andrus recently when he stepped off a plane in Cheyenne. That, by the way, is where the suit was filed, not in some D.C. court where coyotes are considered that puppy dog's cute country cousin.

Basically, the suit reiterates the Animal Damage Control Act of 1931, which "authorized and directed" first the Agriculture Secretary and later the Interior Secretary to control predators. That law is still very much in effect, though you wouldn't know it from the way that government has avoided obey-

ing it the last few administrations.

In fact, Andrus and other Interior brass have publicly stated that the law no longer means what it says because "times have changed." What they neglect to add is that the law itself hasn't changed, that it still orders them to use the "best methods" available to control predators, regardless of whether or the environmental elitists pulling their strings happen to think about it.

Nowhere in the 1931 law does it say that unelected bureaucrats may obey or ignore that mandate as the whim strikes them, or that growing public ignorance of the real world can automatically invalidate the law 40 or 50 years after it's passed.

And that's precisely what's happened. The law's still there, it's just being openly flaunted. How you might as, could such a thing go on in a "representative" government? Simple. Because no one has ever tested this particular violation in the courts--no one has ever gone to court to force the government boys to live up to their own law, and until it's done, they won't.

So now it's being done, and we're tickled pink.

Oh yes, the Fifth Amendment. One provision of that basic Bill of Rights guarantee says that the government can't come in and steal (when the government does it, it's called "confiscation") private property without going through the legal motions of condemnation and then compensating the property owner for his loss. The suit holds that the government, in effect, is "confiscating" livestock for the use of its protected predators. No one bothers to condemn the livestock, and no one has ever paid for it, they just take it.

FLASH FLOOD SAFETY RULES

The destructive power of moving water will surprise you. Knowing what to do and acting quickly can save your life when treated by a flash flood.

A flash flood watch means it is possible that rains will cause flash flooding in the specified area. Be alert, think ahead what you would do if heavy rains develop overhead or around you.

A flash flood warning means flash flooding is occurring or is imminent in the specified area. Move to a safe location immediately if your area is threatened.

Know the lay of the land where you live and work. Which way will high waters come from and drain toward. Know what low areas may flood and cut off your escape. Know the location of nearest high ground or well built high building.

Know the lay of the land if you are camping or visiting in an unfamiliar area. Moving to high ground when flash flooding threatens you is doubly difficult when you do not know your way and it is at night. During the daytime make notice of the best path to high ground if you are camping near a stream or river.

If you observe prolonged lightning from your location, be suspicious that a flash flood is developing. Heavy rains can be very localized. You may not get much rain where you are, but flood waters could drain quickly downstream to your location.

Do not attempt to cross a flooded stream on foot where water is above your knees. A flowing current only 3 feet deep moving at only 3 miles an hour could sweep a grown person off his feet.

Never drive through a flooded low water crossing if you are not sure of the dept. Swift water often will push the rear of a car first causing it to swing around. The car then faces into the oncoming current. The heavy engine holds the front end down while the rear end moves. When this happens

it is then difficult to get the car door open. The oncoming current tends to push back on the door when the occupants try to open it.

If you approach a flooded roadway, look for a debris line on the road surface. This can make the height of the water at maximum flood should the water be receding when you encounter it. Now here is an important point. If that debris line indicates that the water has indeed been much higher, then do not drive over the low water crossing until you can clearly see the road surface. It may have been washed away. This is even more important to consider when crossing a bridge that has been overtopped by flood waters.

If you can receive NOAA Weather radio at your location, use it. The warning alarm feature can awaken you at night should a flood develop. If you can not receive NOAA weather radio, know which radio and television stations you can receive late at night for information.

Finally, if a flood threatens, move yourself and do not waste time gathering personal belongings. Flash flood waters come swiftly. Many times the leading edge of the flood wave contains large and dangerous debris such as rocks, trees, and other rubble.

SEVERE THUNDERSTORMS ARE THE  
NUMBER 1 KILLER AMONG NATURAL  
DISASTERS

In a typical year thunderstorm related phenomena kill more Americans than any other type of natural disaster. Hundreds of our citizens are killed. Thousands are injured and hundreds of millions of dollars damage are done annually by the combined effects of lightning windstorms, hailstorms, tornadoes, and floods.

Most areas of Texas will experience between 30 and 60 thunderstorm days per year. At least several of these thunderstorms will be severe at any given location within the state.

To be classified as severe a thunderstorm must produce wind gusts of 58 mph or greater hailstones of at least 3/4 of an inch

in diameter, funnel clouds, or tornadoes. Severe thunderstorms may also produce flash flooding which has become a greater killer than tornadoes during the last 2 decades. The greatest killer from thunderstorms, lightning occurs with all thunderstorms whether severe or non-severe.

The national weather service offices in Texas keep round the clock, round the calendar, watch on atmospheric conditions issuing watches and warnings for severe thunderstorms, tornadoes, and flash floods. A watch means that severe weather or flash floods are possible. During a watch persons should watch for threatening weather and listen to NOAA weather radio, TV or radio for further information. Warnings will be issued whenever severe weather has been reported by spotters or indicated by radar. Warnings described the downstream area that is endangered by a severe storm or flood. This area is determined by the location size, direction, and speed of movement of the storm. When a warning is received persons close to main arm of the path of the storm should take shelter immediately.

Since severe weather is not always sighted or indicated by radar warnings may not always be issued. Thus, you should always be on the alert for the possibility of severe weather when thunderstorms approach your area.

In Texas, the national weather service uses a network of long range radars at Amarillo, Stephenville, Longview, Midland, Hondo, Brownsville, and Galveston. Local warning radars are used at Lubbock, Wichita Falls, Abilene, Waco, Corpus Christi, Austin, Victoria, and Shreveport; Louisiana Also thousands of trained tornado severe storms, and flash flood spotters....including amateur radio operators, CB Operators, firemen, and Law enforcement officers...assist the national weather service and local civil defense offices by giving reports of severe weather.

WEST-NUECES-LAS MORAS SOIL AND WATER CONSERVATION ELECTION

An election for a director to serve in Zone 2 on the West Nueces

issues affecting private property rights or landowners.

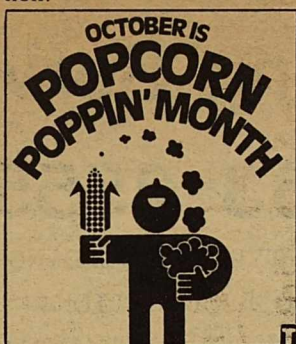
