Mary SanMiguel was appointed election Judge for the April 4th City Election.

Action on trash burning and "leash Law" was posponed pending the arrival of information from the City's Attorney.

## COMMISSIONERS' COURT

At their regular meeting last Monday, the Kinney County Commissioners approved the use of the Kinney County Civic Center for the Second Annual World Championship Tortilla Tossing Tournament to be held May 15 and 16th. The Court also approved use of the center for a fund raising benefit for the Volunteer Fire Department and Ambulance Service, under the direction of Don Crowder.

REGINONAL CONFHRRANCE ON CHILD ABUSE SET FOR FHBRUARY 27

A regional Conference on Child Abuse will be held in San Antnio on Friday, February 27 at the Oak Hills Motor Inn, 7401 Wurzbach.

Highlighting the two-program event will be District Judge George M. Thurmond of the 63rd Judicial District in Del Rio. He will speak at a luncheon on the judicial perspective on child abuse. The conference draws together the people who come in contact with abused children and their families including law enforcement, school,
state and county, also community social service staff, child welfare board
members, community volunteers and attorneys.

Another significant factor of the conference is that public agencies and community resources in a 21-county area will advise a planned approach to deliver protection services within their geographical areas.

One program is recommended for attorneys, but the participants come together in two joint sessions: "Agency Perspectives on Child Abuse Issues" and "The Child in The Crack: Accountability of State Agencies." Program A is for everyone interested and involved, and offers workshop and community networking sessions.

Sponsoring the conference are the Alamo Area Council of Governments, Region 9 of the Texas Department of Human Resources, Community Guidance Center of Bexar County, Houston Bar Association --Family Law Section, Texas Association of Counsel for Children, the University of Texas at Austin-Region 6 Child Abuse and Neglect Resource Center and the Youn Lawyers Associati on of San Antonio.

The registation fee which in cludes the luncheon is $\$ 12$ for Program $A$ and $\$ 35$ for Program B. For more infor mation, contact Betty Murray, Human Resources Manager at AACOG, at 225-5201.

TEXAS TTEFHWORLD COMPETITION TO OFFHR \$1,500 IN COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIPS

Statewide competition for the Texas Teenworld contest has just been announced for July 3-5, 1981, at the Hyatt Hotel in Fort Worth.

Teenworld will select outstanding young women from all over the state to participate in the three days of activities. A $\$ 500$ college scholarship will be awarded to the Texas winner She will also receive an all expense paid trip to the Teenworld National Finals in Atlanta, Georgia, and a \$1,000 scholarship to the Fashion and Art Institute of Dallas.

The Teenworld program is design ed to recognize young women, 14 to 18 , who excel in scholastic achievement and community involvement. Contestants are judged on poise, personality, grooming, and a speech or talent presentation, as well as scholastic and civic achievements. Entrants must have a "B" or better accumulative grade average and be able to document at least 10 hours of volunteer service to a community or charitable organization. Swimsuit competition is not part of the program.

## in Washington

Our house Armed Services Committee began hearings last week on our defense posture leading up to consideration of new budget requests. Even as General David Jones and the other members of the Joints Chiefs of Staff appeared before us, the kyenote of our Committee action was sounded by Chairman Mel Price of Illinois and the new ranking minority member of the Committee, Bill Dickinson of Alabama.

Chairman Price noted that for the first time, our Committee will be responsible for the authorization of funding for operations and maintenance (or $0 \& M$ ) of our military system. We shall have a new subcommittee wat ching this function, and it is aptly named the Subcommittee on Readiness With the jurisdiction taken over from the Appropriations Committee, it is expected that our Defense authorization bill will top $\$ 115$ billion, when military construction, military nuclear systems, personnel costs and new equip ment are included.

## ADVICE TO PRESIDENT

Mr . Price, commenting that he has served on the Committee for 33 years under nine presidents, noted that our Committee had been warning for years that our defense establishment had critical inadequacies, and he offered advice to the President. He had noted, time after time, that production of new weapons systems was seldom rejected outright, but instead was shunted aside for further study. Now, Chairman Price said, there is little time for re-study Instead, he said, it is time to get down to work.

He also declared that in the recent past, the Committee has not had full access to the expertise of the Joint Chiefs when budgetary actions were taken, and said our Committee would have them return to discuss our existing ability to meet possible problems in Europe, the Persian Gulf or elswhere in the world.

## NON-PARTISAN APPROACH

Our Committee has always avoided political party stands on issues to do what we think best for the nation, and this was displayed anew when Bill Dickinson spoke for the Republican minority.

He said he believed we were at a watershed in security planning. For 25 years after World War II, there was military equilibrium between the super-powers. The Soviets had superior ground forces in Eurasis, but we had a big strategic lead. The Soviets then could reach areas adjacent to their homeland, but much of the Middle East, Africa and Southeast Asia was beyond
the access of its military equipment. In the 1960's, Representative Dickinson said, the balance began to shift to our disadvantage. The Russians improved their missile accuracy and warhead technology, built up their aircraft and missiles with Backfire bombers and SS-20 missiles, improved their naval and air lift abilities, and used surrogate forces from Cuba, Libya Ethiopia, South Yemen and Viet-Nam.

> While he said he considered such action improbable, he warned that Soviet power had grown to where they have greater strength than we do in aircraft and missiles, and could risk a fonfrontation. That retreat is so real that we must build our strength.

## "HAVE MARCHING ORDERS"

## Representatives Dickinson

 said there had been one other change, welcome to our Committee. The nation has expressed its desire that we be storng or, as he said, "has given us our marching orders." We must recognize that the period of the 80 s is one of maximum risk because it will take us seven to 10 years to build our weapons strength. This will mean substantial increase in defense budgets, not merely cosmetic covering up of inflation.But he also sai d--and I certainly agree-that there is reason to be optimistic about the future, based on the determineration of the American people that "we make our defense capabilty unquestionably No. 1 again."

Our meeting was an inspiring start on the great taisk ahead of us this sessi on.

GRAZING SYSTEMS CRITICAL FACTOR IN IMPLANT RESULTS

UVALDE-Today's cattle rancher is caught between a rock and a hard place. He looks one direction and evisions the time-honored approach to ranching that proved profitable for decades. Then he takes a second look and all kinds of new scientific developments begin to pop before his very eyes. Sud denly he's in the midst of a whirlwind that flacks one new technique after another his way.

With costs rising faster than income, ranchers must constantly stay ahead by seeking new ways to increase beef output acre while keeping costs at rock bottom, even if it means deviating from the traditional path taken by their forefathers.

On technique, growth implant stimulants, has been tried in growing calves and in many cases has resulted in increased calf weaning weights. Un:itil recently, no data wa available to determine how different grazing management systems influenced calf response to these growth stimulants.

However, Dr. Larry Varner, associate professor of range nutrition with the Texas Agricultural Experiment Station at the Texas A\&M University Agricultixal Research and Extension Center in Uvlade, recently completed a three-year study which sheds new light on the subject.

Varner tested three successive calf crops involving 760 calves that were produced from three different grazing systems on the 10,000 acre Rio $G_{r}$ ande Experimental Ranch near Spofford in Southwest Texas. Continous (1-pas-ture-1 herd), rotational ( 4 pasture3 herd) and short duration ( 6 pasture $=$ 1 herd) systems were used.

Two-thirds of the calves were implanted with a normal dose of Ralgro

a popular implant stimulant, at about one month of age and again 90-100 days later. The remaining calves were not implanted.

Varner says the three-year average increase in weaning weights and in vestment return per calf from implanted calves versus those not implanted was
significantly higher under the rotation al grazing systems
"In the 4 pasture- 3 herd program
implanted calves were 42.2 pounds heavier at weaning than non-implanted
animals and returned $\$ 24.71$ above im plant costs," he explains.

Implanted calves from the continous grazing system were a distant second, producing 11.9 pounds more beef per head than their non-implanted counterparts while returning $\$ 9.75$ above implant costs. Implanted calves from the short duration system produced 9.7 additonal pounds, returning $\$ 7.96$ more than implant costs.

The Texas A\&M range nutrition scientist points our, however, that although the short duration grazing system produced about two pounds less beef per implanted animal than the continous system, the former method was able to sustain a 30 percent heavier stocking rate than either of the other grazing systems.

Varner says the rotational grazing system produced the largest percent increase in beef production per acre from implanted calves, 9 percent, followed by the short duration method ( $6 \%$ ) and continuous system ( $2.5 \%$ )

Calf response to implants appear to be in addition to the incresed beef production usually seen when improved grazing management systems such as rotational or short duration practices are implemented, thus giving ranchers an additional incentive to excercise good range and livestock management," he concludes. $\qquad$

 <br> <br> by william PR Clomonts Jr.}As the third most-populous state in the nation, Texas faces many problems and challenges. I have stated ofte during the last two years that providing an adequate water supply for our citizens, our agriculture and our industry ultimately, may be the most critical issue of all. If we do not accurately assess our needs in this regard and prepare accordingly, we could be in a crisis situation... That is why I recommended in my January 22 State of the State address to the Legislature establishment of a State Water Trust Fund to hold in reserve anticipated surplus revenues toward meeting our future water needs. Water is not an agricultural problem alone. Neither, contrary to a widely-held view, is it a sectional or regional problem.

Municipal water supplies and sewage treatment capabilities must be assured in the small towns and large cities. Our farms and ranches and industry will continue to demand more water as our population increases from 14.1 million to 22 million by the year 2000

Already, Texas is classified as a water-short state. That is, we are using our water faster than it is being replaced by nature. According to the Texas Department of Water Resources, we are using statewide 7.1 million acre feet of groundwater per year more than is being replaced. The withdrawal is causing water level declines, creasing well yields, land subsidence, movement of geologic faults and saline water encroachment.
This 7.1 million acre feet deficit amounts to 41 per cent of water use in our state annually. And it is twice the amount we can take safely from our 10 largest lakes. In a recent publication, the Department of Water Resources pointed to this long-term water supply outlook: -Major areas of the State will be limited in growth potential to provide jobs for increasing populations unless additional water supplies are developed.
-Areas where some long-range ( 20 to 50 years) water shortages are anticipated include Dallas-Fort Worth, Wichita Falls, Abilenc, San Angelo, Midland-Odessa, High Plains, Trans-Pecos, El Paso, Lower Rio Grande Valley, Middle Rio Grande, Corpus Christi and the San Antonio area. Implementation of projects can prevent projected shortages in many of these areas.
-The Middle Gulf Coast, Houston, Beaumont, East Texas, Northeast Texas and a part of the Dallas-Fort Worth Central Texas regions can be supplied through intrastate, local area development over the next 50 years if surface-water supplies are developed on a timely schedule as now planned.
All of this led me to the conclusion that establishment of a Water Trust Fund to underwrite water development projects including additional reservoirs and distribution facilities should be a high priority goal
As I stated in my January 22 speech, this is literally an investment in our future. It will ensure that the state sur-plus-unlike some in the past-will be spent in an accountable manner on a highly identifiable and critical

PICADILLO (Mexican Hash)
2 cloves garlic 1 onion minced
2 fresh tomatoes 2 tablespoon flour
$\frac{1}{2}$ cup chopped green olives
$\frac{1}{2}$ teaspoon marjoram (oregano)
4 tablsepoons lard or cooking oil
$\frac{1}{2}$ cup tomato sauce, or fresh tomato
1 lb. cooked meat, cut small or chopped
$\frac{1}{2}$ cup soup stock or strong beef broth $\frac{1}{2}$ cup raisins, washed and seeded; or seedless raisins
1 teaspoon salt
$\frac{1}{2}$ teaspoon pepper
Fry the onion and the garlic together in the fat, and take garlic out; add the tomato cut small, if fresh is used, or the tomato sauce; add now the meat chopped or cut small; mix well; and the broth and the other ingredients at this point, stir well to mix thoroughly Simmer 30 minutes. Serves $4-6$. This picadillo is also used in tacos and for tamale.
