EUCALYPTUS.....
(Myrtaceae)

Species of the genus Eucalytus
(gumtree, iron bark, or stringy
bark) are fast-growing trees
and shrubs that make decorative
foliage plants indoors, but only
temporarily, since they grow
very tall. Most have two distinc-
tive types of foliage: Immature
(juvenile) leaves, and mature
ones, only the juvenile stage,
when no flowers are produced,
is normally reached in the home.

PROPER CARE:
Light: Eucalyptus needs full sun-
light in order to maintain good
leaf color.
Temperature: These plants grow
equally well in warm or cool
rooms.
Watering: Water moderately enough
to moisten the potting mixture.
thoroughly. Allow the top third
of the mixture to dry out between
watering.
Feeding: Apply standard liquid
fertilizer once every ten days.
But only when plant is in active
growth.

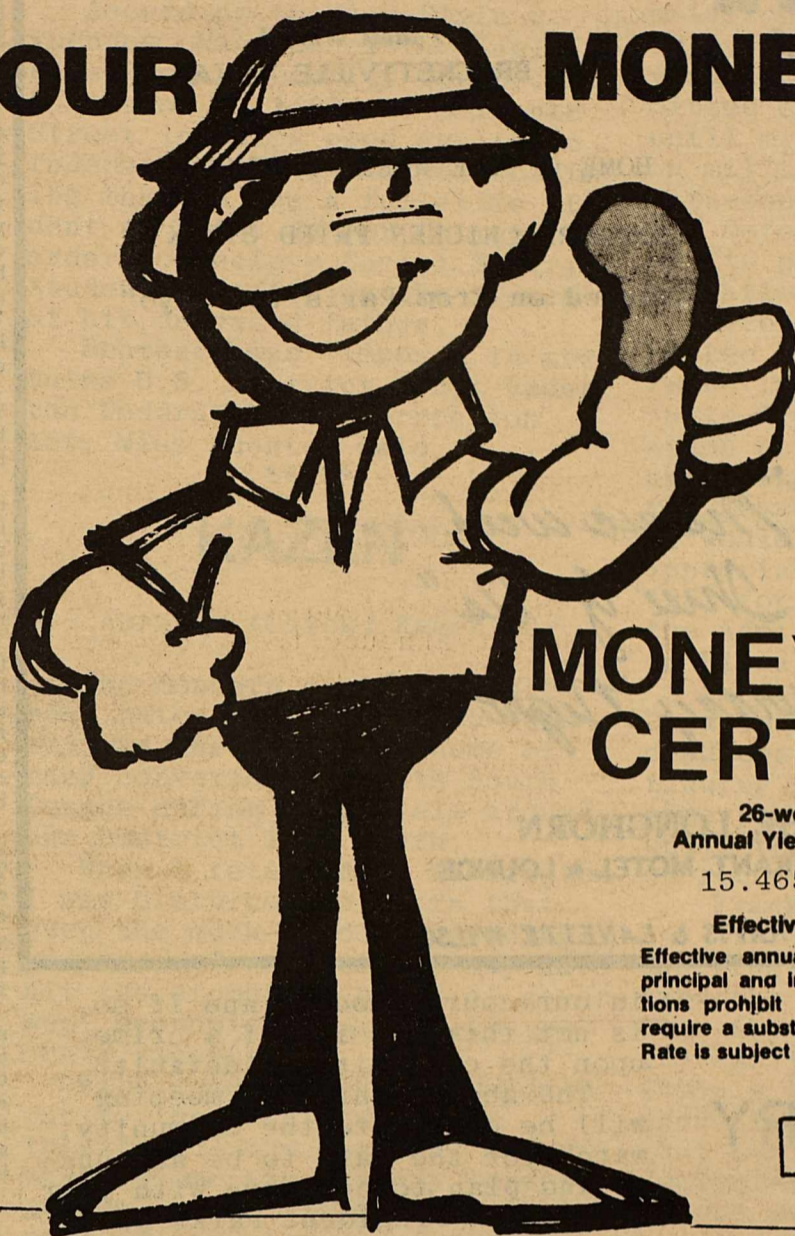

SOCIAL SECURITY NEWS

In accordance with a new federal law barring social security disability payments to convicted felons in prison, the administration has suspended disability benefits to about 2,400 prisoners since last October when the law

became effective and is taking action to halt checks to about 600 other disabled felons.

The law banning disability payments to felons in prisons allows the prisoners' spouses and children to continue getting their benefits. The prisoners' payments could resume once they are released if they are still disabled.

This new law also bans benefits in three other situations where the felony occurs after October 19, 1980.

- *Students benefits while a prisoners,
- *Disability benefits to individuals who became disable during the course of their crimes, and
- *Disability benefits while a prisoner where the individual becomes disabled during imprisonment.

Unlike the disability payment that is banned because the felon is in prison, payments to the spouses and children are also banned in these situations.

An El Paso woman who alleged assumed the identity of a deceased person and used documents relating to the deceased in order to claim federal assistance payments has entered a not guilty plea before a U.S. Magistrate.

Genoveva Duran, in the U.S. illegally, was arrested on August 25 after a sealed five count indictment was returned by a Federal Grand Jury, according to Miss Elvas F. Fuentes, Manager of the Eagle Pass Social Security Office.

Ms. Duran allegedly made false statements and presented false identity documents to the Social Security Administration in order to qualify for Supplemental Security Income (SSI) payments as a low-income disabled U.S. citizen Miss Fuentes said. Miss Fuentes explained that SSI payments are intended for low-income U.S. citizens or aliens lawfully admitted for permanent residence. Recipients must be at least 65, or severely disabled, or blind. The program is financed with general tax revenues, not social security taxes, Miss Fuentes said.

Ms. Duran waived her rights to a jury trial and will be tried by a U.S. Magistrate. If found guilty, she faces a maximum penalty of a \$10,000 fine, five year imprisonment, or both on each count.

Miss Fuentes emphasized that the indictment is only a formal charge and does not constitute evidence or guilt. "The defendant is entitled to fair trial in which it will be the government's burden to prove guilt beyond a reasonable doubt," Miss Fuentes said.

A Shreveport, Louisiana man has been sentenced in U.S. District Court in Shreveport for defrauding the Social Security Administration.

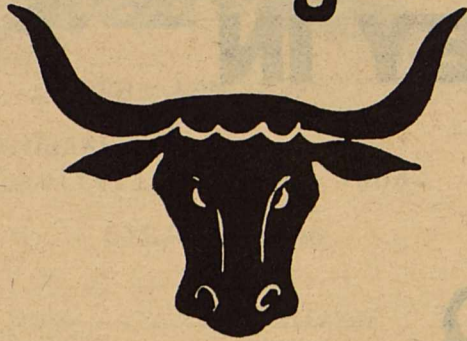

Since the meeting of the Friends of the Library, the committee of inquiry appointed by Pres. Don Parks to look into the repeated edlays in the trial case, met determined to persue this cause and to deligently dig out the hidden reasons for the inefficiencies of the last four years from the inception of EDA grant for a new library building (12-23-77) through the ceasation of construction at the half way mark (9-17-78) to the present push by the "Friends" through fund raising and volunteer help in getting the building enclosed. The committee solicited the help of County Attorney, Tully Shahan, to build a case for conviction to go before the Grand Jury--and Tully agreed to do this.

At the Commissioner's Court meeting Monday the "Friends" were there in mass to support the library action. Charlie Ward Prsident of the Library Board, requested of the Commissioners the Mr. Shahan be appointed to research the case violations and Judge Postell was asked to set a date within the next 10 days for an open meeting when the attorneys in the case would be present to answer our questions--and there are many--Are the attorneys being paid on a continuing basis? If so can this be changed in name of ecpediency? Is a Criminal case being disgusted as a Civil offence, hence, being delayed perhaps indefinitely to protect

the guilty parties at our expense with the political philcsofpy, "you cratch my back and I will scratch yours?" Or is this just an exagerated example of delayed litigation that is so prevalent

in our courts today, and if so, is not this, in itself a crime upon the community by default?

The above mentioned meeting will be opened to the community; watch for the date to be announced and plan to be there with your questions. President Parks pledged the "Friends" help and support all the way.

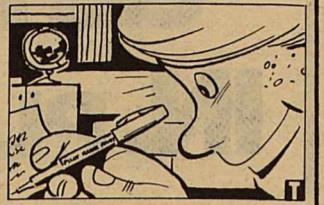

Dollar Wise Shopping Tips

BACK TO SCHOOL

It's time to shop for school supplies once more. Here are some tips to help you get through the 'crunch' without spending the family fortune.



Make shopping for school supplies a fun project. Before you go, sit down with your children and put together a written list of what they will need. Then let the children put together what they have left over from last year and eliminate these items. You'll be amazed to see just how budget conscious your children can become.

One word of warning. When you get to the store be firm and don't let the kids buy extras.

Shopping for bargains—real bargains—helps. So look for "Back to School" specials offered by name brand manufacturers. That's your guarantee for quality merchandise.

Also check book bags, lunch boxes and loose-leaf binders to see how they are put together. Shoddily made merchandise at cheaper prices always turns out to cost more in the long run because it doesn't last.

When it comes to pens and pencils, buy the box. This also saves money because the unit price decreases when you buy in quantity. This method of purchase saves you a lot if you have a large family.

But there's a trick to making buying in quantity cost effective. If you give all the pens and pencils to the children, they'll be used up in no time. Keep them in a special place (you should hide them, especially the

pens) and dole them out as needed.

When you shop for writing instruments, look for a name brand, like Pilot Pen. Youngsters especially favor Pilot's Razor Point Pen because their youthful handwriting takes on grace and legibility when they use a fine point.

According to Miss Fuentes, Manager of the Eagle Pass Social Security Office, Charlie Brister of 1409 Allendale Street in Shreveport was ordered to repay \$6,000 to the Social Security Administration as a condition of his five-year probation after receiving a suspended sentence for defrauding the agency.

Brister pled guilty to federal charges of concealing that he was working in order to continue social security and supplemental security income disability benefits.

Social Security has stepped up its review of disability cases, and those who fail to report medical improvement of work abilities face fines, imprisonment and repayment of all amounts not due, Miss Fuentes said.

A Delaware, Oklahoma woman has pled guilty to federal charges of making false statements to the Social Security Administration and concealing information from the agency.

According to Miss Alvia F. Fuentes, Manager of the Eagle Pass Social Security Office, Carrie Stone Hyman admitted in the Tulsa U.S. District Court that she had willfully concealed her marriage and her husband's income in order to continue to receiving Supplemental Security Income payments.

Miss Fuentes said that SSI payments are intended for low-income individuals who are at least 65, or severely disabled or blind. The SSI program is financed with general tax revenue not social security taxes, Miss Fuentes said, and the payment amount depends on how much other income is available to a person or a couple.

Mrs. Hyman was given a 5 year suspended sentence, fined \$100 on each of four counts and ordered to repay \$4,400.00 to the Social Security Administration.

A Tulsa, Oklahoma man has been ordered to repay \$5,400 to the

Social Security Administration as a condition of his probation after receiving a suspended sentence for defrauding the agency.

According to Miss Elvia F. Fuentes, Manager of the Eagle Pass Social Security Office, La Don Mason of 1405 E. Seminole Street in Tulsa pled guilty to federal charge of falsely claiming that he was a full-time student at Tulsa Junior College in order to receive Social Security Student Benefits on the record of his deceased father.

Sentence was imposed in the Tulsa U.S. District Court under the Federal Youth Correction Act, Miss Fuentes said.

The concern over high interest rates and a sluggish economy was the repeated theme of many conversations with South Texans during my travels around our District last month.

When I returned to Washington I was disturbed to learn that even the much-needed upgrading of our national defense may have hit the stumbling block of government economists and to her armchair experts.

With some programs already cut to the bone and others threatened, our national defense have become the primary target of some non-military budget planners. Although much of the defense debate is being conducted behind closed doors, we understand that there has been considerable disagreement between the OMB and the Defense Department over a proposal to cut as much as \$50 billion from the five year defense increase.

Unfortunately, this comes at a time when critical defense decisions must be made, making it difficult to determine whether the fates of important new weapons systems such as the MX Missile and the B-1 Bomber are hinged on military strategy or OMB economics.

One of the first negative effects of the Administration budget reconsiderations was to delay the Department of Defense Appropriations Bill for Fiscal Year 1982, which begins October 1. Obviously, the Appropriations Committee cannot draft a proper bill until military witnesses testify on military needs--and these witnesses cannot testify until the Defense Department has cleared its program through the Administration.

Defense Appropriations Subcommittee Chairman Joseph P. Addabbo recently explained why the bill is in limbo until the Administration acts: "At a time when we are being asked to cut back on many essential people programs, it would be extremely unwise to appropriate money in Fiscal Year '1982 for defense programs which the Administration plans to cancel in Fiscal Year 1983 or 1984."

In the meantime, the Defense Department faces being left on dead center, funded under a continuing resolution at about the same pace as Fiscal Year 1981 until the Administration agrees on recommendations.

Frankly, I cannot imagine that

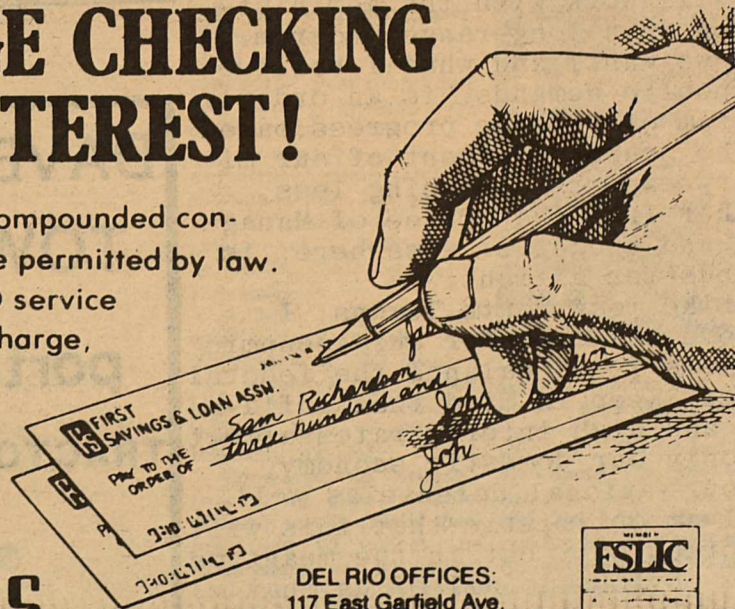
the final decisions will tilt toward the suggestions of the OMB over the judgement of military professionals and the Administration's own experts in the Pentagon. It is certainly no secret that our national defense has been neglected to the danger point in recent years.

I had occasion last week to talk with Secretary of Defense Caspar Weinberger and he indicated no opposition to my own belief that our defense must be bolstered in critical areas. As I said to the Secretary, we must invest in recruiting a sufficient number of properly-trained personnel to operate our sophisticated weapons systems, we must provide the incentives to keep our experienced people from leaving for private industry and we must spend more on operation and maintenance to keep our equipment working. If

I STARTED IN THE BANKING FIELD OCTOBER 4, 1942, AS BOOKKEEPER AND TELLER. IN 1947 ELEVATED TO ASSISTANT CASHIER---BECAME A DIRECTOR MARCH 1966--- ADVANCED TO VICE-PRESIDENT AND CASHIER IN 1968,

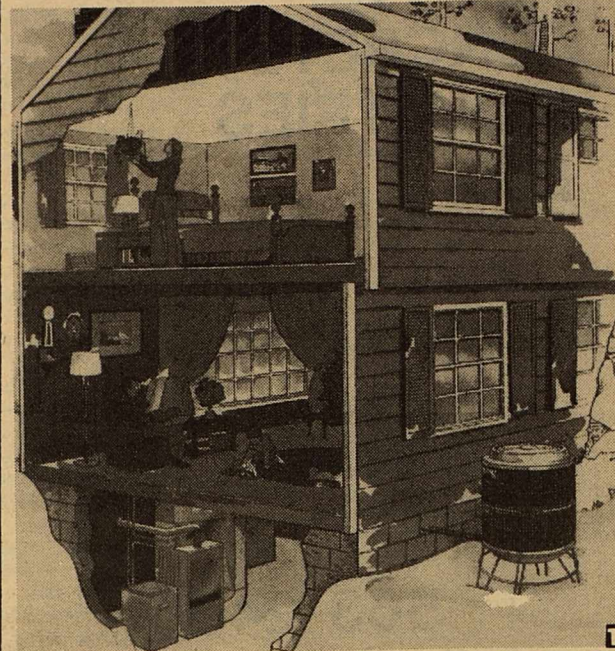

there are not enough spare parts to keep our aircraft flying, for example, the problem must be corrected at once without applying first to the OMB.

I was pleased that Secretary Weinberger seemed in agreement and willing to do his part to put the muscle back in our defense.

From my experience on the Armed Services committee, I believe that the majority of the Members of Congress recognize this need and will work with the administration in a long-range program. What we want, and what I believe the public demands, is an orderly program of defense progress based on the sound judgement of our military experts. Anything less, whether from the Office of Management and Budget or elsewhere, is grounds for a fight.

Like most South Texans, I believe the cure for our economic problems is to balance the federal budget. Keep in mind that inflation and high interest rates affect not only our domestic economy, but our national defense as well.

I am optimistic that this will be worked out, but in the meantime it is obvious to all of us that our national defense is too important to the security of the United States and to the free world to be handled with anything less than the highest priority. We cannot afford otherwise.

Energy Efficient Fireplaces

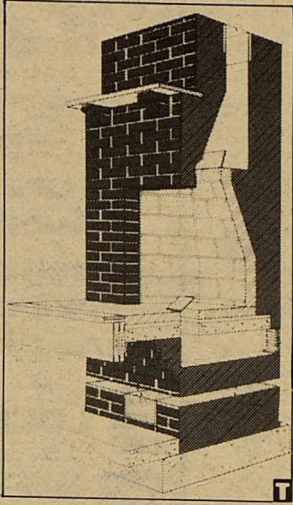
If you hate to see your hard-earned dollars go up in smoke, it might brighten your life to take a look at something that can help you put a damper on the high cost of heating your home: an energy efficient fireplace.

Although some fireplaces lose heated air up the chimney, one that's properly constructed and equipped can be an economical as well as an aesthetic asset.

The traditional material for fireplace construction is brick. It is noncombustible and can effectively isolate fires from combustible materials that may be nearby. Unlike other materials, it will not crack or burn away in a lifetime of high temperature use. Brick fireplaces have an added advantage, according to experts at the Brick Institute of America. Another important aspect of an efficient fireplace is an outside air inlet. This allows the fireplace to use outside air for combustion instead of room air that has already been heated.

being a source of cold air, properly installed dampers, tightly closed louvers and glass screens should be used.

Glass screens provide a barrier that will keep heated inside air from escaping up the chimney but will still allow residual smoke and fumes to get out.

A well built brick fireplace can help keep your home warmer—and your temper cooler.

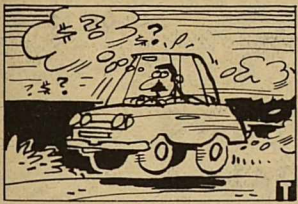
The fact is that trucks are paying their way for highway use. Experts in the trucking industry say that the present tax structure, with the varying vehicle payments, is basically fair and equitable, and studies back this up.

Under the federal highway tax program, the typical passenger car pays about \$33 a year. A typical over-the-road truck pays \$1,800 a year in these special taxes, or 54 times more a year than the typical passenger car.

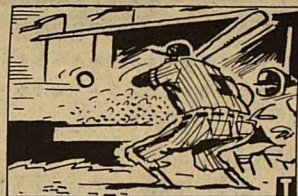

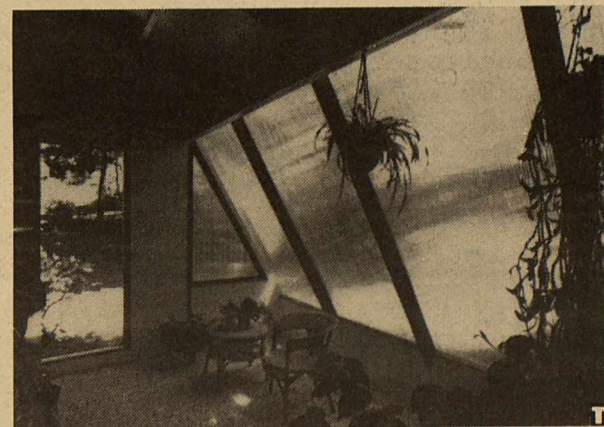

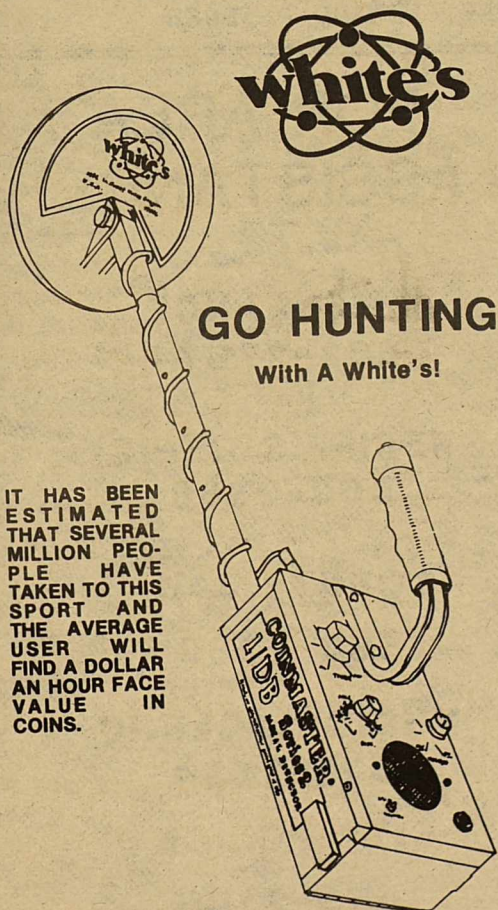
