#### LANGTRY AWARD

ROADRUNNER AWARD FOR LANGTRY

Jack Skiles, Supervisor of the highway department's Visitor Center at Langtry, has been named as recipient of the 1983 Roadrunner Award at the Texas Travel Counselors Conference which concludes today.

The award, which recognizes the state's highest achieve-ment in service to the traveling public, was presented by Tom H. Taylor, director of the highway department's Travel and Information Division.

The Langtry facility is one of 12 operated by the highway department. In 1982, nearly three million travelers were provided with information and assistance at the tourist bureaus that are at key highway entrances to the state, at the State Capitol. and in Langtry.

Skiles was named supervisor of the Roy Bean Visitor Center on July 1,1968, several months before the facility was opened to the public. To his new position he brought a background of a degree in botany from Sul Ross University plus gradauate studies in Biology, geology, archaeology and museology. He is a former superintendent of school at Paint ROck and Balmorhea, and curator of the Shandhills Museum now a part of Monahans Shanhils State Park.

The Roy Bean Visitor Center pererves the historic "Law West Of The Pecos" saloon/courtroom of the crusty frontier judge. It, and the modern visitor center and garden of desert plants, are open open daily. Some 95,000 tourist were visitors at the

center in 1982.

The remote location makes added demands on the personnel at Langtry Maintainance and technical problems are reoutinely handled by the staff; such as installation and maintanance of the sound system in the center's dioramas, or service of the antique windmill that was a added to the facility last year

We have not had any ranch burglaries reported since the arrest of the two Cuban suspects in Del Rio. This by no means implies that they are guilty of anything, it is just interesting to those of us working on the

We are maintaining a daily average of 25 federal prisoners at the County Jail. At the rate of \$18.00 per day per prisoner, this adds up to \$450.00 per day income. These prisoners are not the usual, run of the mill, misdemeanor prisoners we used to get. 90% of them are felony prisoners who are facing years of imprisonment in a federal pen. Security has been tightened at the jail as best we can and we hope that no incidents occur. We are, under the existing conditions, shorthanded by about three jailers.

One of our recent arrivals escaped from the Kinney County Jail last March. He has been returned, charged with various federal criminal crimes, including escape. He is being held in lieu of \$200,000.00 bond We have him under close supervision and tight security as he has made threats to escape should he get the chance.

Mrs. Pearl Anderson reported that someone entered her unlocked car as it was parked in her garage behind her home on Ann St. and took oil paints and brushes valued at over \$200.00. The paints and brushes were in a yellow fishing tackle box.







During fiscal year 1981-1982 Kinney County Library's total number items circulated were 5,457 and to total number viewers of movies were 5,138. Our total number library applications on hand went up from 818 to 1,319. Of these addition 501 new patrons, 211 were child ren and 290 were adults. Since October of 1982 until now, we have added 125 more patrons and project at least another 125 by the end of Sepetmber. This will end fiscal year 1982-1983 with a total projected patronage (1973) of 1500.

Book circulation for March was 819. All of this is given simply to point out that circulation had doubled over the past year and patrons (people) who use the Library ) is ever increasing.




