REMEMBERING THE ALAMO

Today's Navy has nearly 600 ships in it. Within this number are ten that proudly carry the banner of Texas tradition. One of these ships is the USS ALAMO (LSD-33).

The ALAMO is a dock landing ship of the Thomaston class, a swift and powerful unit of the U.S. Amphibious forces in the Pacific. Commissioned in 1956, she was named for the Texas National Monument, the Alamo, in san antonio. she reflects the spirit of the Texas volunteers of 1836.

The ALAMO's primary mission is to transport and control loaded boats, landing craft, vehicles and tanks in early assault waves on enemy beached. she accomplishes this in a unique manner: the back portion of the ship is lowered into the water a few feet so that the landing craft and other boats, or amphibious tanks, can be floated out and head directly toward the beach.

A secondary mission of the vessel is to act as a boat haven, repairing amphibious craft of all sizes in its after portion (the back) of the ship. this versatility makes this ship much in demand by the fleet, by the Marine Corps, and by the Army. Her motto reflects this demand: "we deliver anything, anytime, anywhere."

The ALAMO was built by Ingalls shipbuilding Corp. in Mississippi. She is 510 feet long, and her well-deck of 395

feet by 48 feet can be flooded to a depth of 10 feet. The ALAMO is able to carry three very large landing craft, known as LCUs, or 20 medium-sized craft (LCM), or 40 smaller craft (LCVP). As many as 100 two-and-half ton trucks used in combat, can be transported at one time. The ALAMO carries a crew of 21 officers and 384 enlisted personnel. she is capable of transporting a Marine Corps unit of 29 officers and 272 troops, plus nine staff officers, in-addition to the

ship's crew. Navy ships have always played an important role in aiding victims of disaster, and the Alamo is no exception. In October 1962, she delivered emergency relief supplies to typhoon-stricken Guam. Similar missions throughout USS ALAMO's 18-year career ensure that, like her namesake, the United States will "remember the Alamo". She continues her mission today serving in the Pacific Fleet from her homeport of San Diego, California.

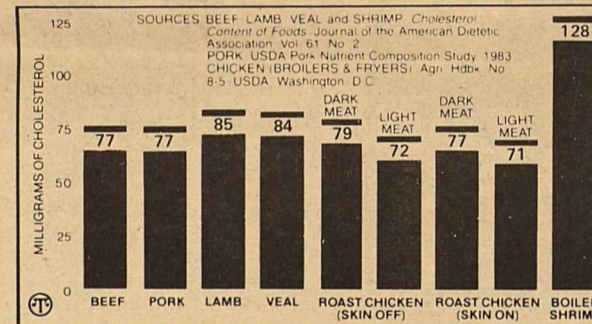

Meat is what nutritionists call a "nutrient dense" food. That is, it offers a high proportion of many essential nutrients for relatively few calories.

The average American consumes just under four ounces of red meat per day, which represents 327 calories—only 16 percent of a 2,000 calorie diet. Those four ounces are composed of just under two-thirds of an ounce of ground beef, about one and one-third ounces of other fresh beef, a third of an ounce of fresh pork, an ounce and a half of processed meats and about seven-hundredths of an ounce of veal and lamb combined.

Meat is an important source of many essential nutrients, including protein, B-vitamins and minerals. Take iron, for instance. The iron in red meat actually increases the amount of iron absorbed from other foods eaten with red meat. And red meat is a much richer source of iron than chicken, turkey and fish.

The thiamin in that average daily four-ounce serving of red meat equals 21 percent of a grown man's RDA (Recommended Dietary Allowance) and 30 percent of a woman's; it supplies 24 per-

cent of a man's and 33 percent of a woman's RDA for niacin.

Red meat contains less cholesterol than many people believe. Three ounces of cooked lean beef, for instance, is slightly lower in cholesterol than the same size serving of roast chicken—without the skin. Cooked lean pork is only marginally higher in cholesterol than roast chicken. The average four-ounce serving of all red meats combined contributes less than one-third of what many doctors recommend for maximum daily cholesterol intake (300 mg.).

Individuals watching the fat in their diet should not cut out red meat. That average four-ounce serving of red meat contributes only 214 calories from fat. That's about 10 percent of a 2,000 calorie diet. Many nutritionists recommend that fat contribute no more than 30 percent of daily calories, so it's easy to see that red meat fits in with room to spare.

High in protein, minerals and B-vitamins and modest in calories, fat and cholesterol, red meat is a valuable part of a balanced diet. This tasty American favorite is truly a nutrition bargain.

The above report is a summary of police and criminal activity in Kinney County for 1984 and of course does not include itemized info of those crimes or other activity handled by the various law enforcement departments during the year. At least this will give you some idea of criminal activity in our county and the efforts of those of us in law enforcement to preserve the peace and protect the citizens and property of Kinney County.

conjunctivitis, eczema, fatigue, hearing loss, insomnia, learning disorders, obesity, rashes, stomachache, stress, and water retention.

But the FDA, the National Institutes of Health, and the American Academy of Allergy and Immunology disagree, saying there is no evidence that cytotoxic testing works.

Conducted at a cytotoxic clinic, the test involves placing drops of a person's blood on 200 microscope slides that have been coated with the dried extract of 200 different foods. If the white blood cells collapse or change shape, the patient is supposedly allergic to that particular food. The allergy results are used as evidence of almost any problem the person may have.

To correct this condition, the cytotoxic clinic generally offers a "personalized diet" that includes vitamins and minerals the clinic has for sale. Investors are told they will make more money on the products than on the testing itself.

Also referred to as Bryan's test, leukocyte antigen testing, and food sensitivity testing, the procedure is unproven since no studies have shown that white blood cells shrivel and die when exposed to foods a person is allergic to.

Cytotoxic testing costs from \$200 to \$400 for the usual series, plus additional charges for the vitamins. Patients apparently are not seen by a physician during the testing. FDA investigators note, however, that some products used in the testing can be legally ordered only by a medical doctor.

The U. S. Government's most recent report on tar and nicotine listed 207 cigarette styles. Carlton was listed lowest in three categories. The lowest tar king was Carlton Box (less than 0.5 mg. tar, 0.05 mg. nicotine—nobody tested lower). The other lowest were lowest tar menthol (king size Carlton menthol at 1 mg. tar, 0.1 mg. nicotine) and lowest tar 120's (6 mg.

CYTOTOXIC ALLERGY TEST UNPROVEN

Cytotoxic testing has been advertised as a quick way to find out and cure what ails you by testing your blood for food allergies.

The catch is that there is no proof it works, according to the Texas Medical Assn.

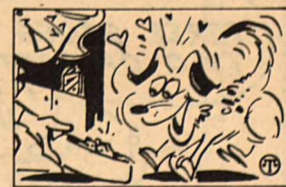
In addition, the U.S. Food and Drug Administration warns that newspaper ads inviting investors to get into the "profitable field" of allergy testing are misleading.

Promoters claim cytotoxic testing will cure a wide range of problems: asthma, arthritis, canker sores, chronic cough, confusion, diarrhea, depression, heart palpitations, headaches, anxiety, acne, baldness, back pain, bedwetting, constipation, crying,

Some Not-So-Hard Facts About Floppy Disks

The growing use of personal computers in homes and offices has made the term "floppy disk" a part of the language for many people who wouldn't have dreamed they'd be speaking "computerese" a short time ago. Many people who frequently do, however, still wonder why floppy disks aren't very floppy, and why they're called "disks" when their shape is decidedly square.

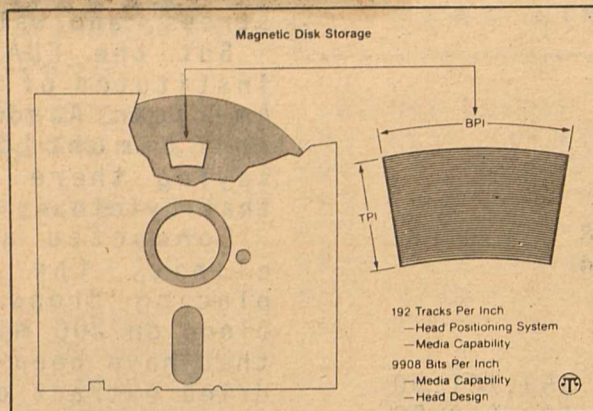
The answers are hidden just beneath the square protective jackets of the disks—more properly called flexible disks. Inside the covers are thin, round and flexible plastic disks with a large hole cut in the center, and one or more smaller holes punched a short distance from the center.

Coated with something akin to the material on audiotape or video recording tape, a flexible disk is a "record" for storing computer information in a code of ones and zeros.

Tape, however, moves from one reel to another past magnets that record and read the information. If you want to change your place in the tape, you must push a forward or reverse button.

With a record player on the other hand, one can move a tone arm to the center of the record and place it in a groove close to a song's start. Flexible disks use this same idea but automatically rather than by hand. That saves time.

According to Noel Proudfoot, manager of quality assurance for Kodak's new Electronic Media Manufacturing Division, there are two ways for the computer to know where one disk section begins and another ends. The disket-

tes generally have a smaller hole located a short distance from the center hole, which marks the start of a track.

A light shining through one of the holes is detected by the computer. A single hole tells the computer where the track begins. The individual parts of the track, which are called "sectors" are defined when the disk is first set up, or "formatted" for use.

Conventional flexible diskettes can have as many as 96 tracks in a single inch.

However, new technologies permit information to be even more tightly packed. According to one expert, as many as 384 tracks per inch may be possible.

Such disks require finding methods more precise than other disks did. Disks such as HD600 Kodak diskettes are therefore preformatted at the factory.

A single character of infor-

mation—a letter of the alphabet, a number, punctuation or other symbol—usually requires one "byte" of storage, either in the computer or on the diskette. A double-spaced page of typing with 200 average length words contains the equivalent of 1,000 bytes or about one kilobyte of data (usually abbreviated as 1kb).

Some of the early personal computer systems could store only 143 kb of data or 143 typewritten pages on a single diskette. Most of the present generation of microprocessors used in offices can store either 320 kb or 360 kb of information. The new high-density diskettes would store eight to ten times the data of conventional diskettes. The experts predict that such high-density storage will become commonplace within four years. That, it seems gives people a lot to look forward to.

EXPECTING THE UNEXPECTED

When Hurricane Diana smashed into the North Carolina coastline this fall, the local electric utility was prepared. Over 45,000 customers lost their power and many utility lines and facilities were badly damaged, but the lights were back on in every home, business, and public facility within three days. The utility's emergency storm plan had worked.

Texas was hit even harder in the summer of 1983 when its southern coast was socked by Hurricane Alicia with winds of 135 miles per hour. Although 750,000 customers lost electric service, over 80 percent of them had their service restored within four days because utility repair crews from all over the region worked with local crews round-the-clock to get the lights back on.

Both of these companies had developed comprehensive emergency action plans to be used as soon as they heard the weather reports just prior to the storms. Like every electric utility across the country, they were well-prepared in advance for the unexpected.

Electric utility managers know that electricity has become such an essential part of our daily lives that to do without it for even an hour can be personally aggravating, financially devastating—



and sometimes even life threatening.

Customers tend to take the efficiency of America's electric utility system for granted. And when the lights do go out—because of man-made or natural disaster—they want them right back on again. Fast. Electric utility managers understand the needs of their customers and have a number of highly sophisticated operations in place to deal with any problems that residential customers face when there is no electricity.

The source of our greatest achievements and accomplishments is electricity. Our world is increasingly electric: automation, computerization, transportation, communication and information systems depend on the steady flow of this important service. We depend on electricity for the convenience of a money exchanger at a bank, and the on-time departure of our flight from New York to Los Angeles.

Classic Greek Dish Satisfies Hearty Appetites



Greek cooking is known for its subtle combination of simple ingredients. One dish typical of Greek cuisine is Pastitso. A lasagna-like entree including ground beef, pasta and spices, Pastitso exemplifies Greek-style cooking—a cuisine in which beef seldom is served plain. Instead, Greeks often use beef in rich tomato stews; stuffed into grapeleaves, peppers or cabbages; or as part of layered dishes like Pastitso.

Spices such as cinnamon and nutmeg also are very common to Greek cuisine. Though beef seasoned with cinnamon and nutmeg may

seem unusual, this intriguing flavor combination transforms simple ingredients into an exotic culinary delight.

Pastitso's rich mixture of ground beef, eggs, tomato sauce and spices is alternately layered with pasta, a cream sauce and Parmesan cheese. The cream sauce is made with nonfat dry milk instead of a heavy cream so it is lower in calories.

A perfect dinner for hearty appetites, Pastitso easily can serve eight to ten people. For a complete meal, serve this dish with sauteed zucchini, rolls and a tossed green salad.

PASTITSO (Makes 8 to 10 servings)

- 1 pound elbow macaroni
- 3 well-beaten eggs
- 1 pound ground beef
- 1 cup chopped onion
- 1 crushed garlic clove
- 1 cup (8-ounce can) Contadina tomato sauce
- 1 tablespoon chopped parsley
- 1/2 teaspoon cinnamon
- 1/4 teaspoon nutmeg
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 teaspoon pepper
- 1/3 cup butter
- 1/3 cup flour
- 1 cup dry Carnation nonfat dry milk
- 2 3/4 cups water
- 2 tablespoons butter
- 1 cup grated Parmesan cheese

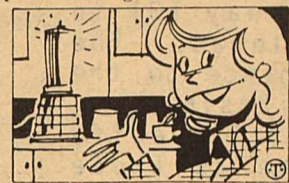
Cook macaroni in boiling salted water 10 minutes. Rinse and drain. Stir eggs into macaroni. Brown ground beef, onion, and garlic in medium saucepan. Drain off excess fat. Stir in tomato sauce, parsley, cinnamon, nutmeg, 1/4 teaspoon salt, and pepper. Bring to boil. Reduce heat and boil gently 15 minutes, stirring constantly. Melt 1/3 cup butter in medium saucepan over medium heat. Stir in flour, dry nonfat milk, and remaining 1/4 teaspoon salt. Slowly stir in water. Cook, stirring constantly, until mixture just comes to a boil and thickens. Melt 2 tablespoons butter in 13 x 9 x 2-inch baking dish. Layer ingredients in dish as follows: half the pasta, meat filling, 1/2 the cheese, remaining pasta, cream sauce, and remaining cheese. Sprinkle lightly with more cinnamon. Bake in moderate oven (350°F.) 25 minutes, or until heated through. Cool 10 minutes. Cut into squares to serve.

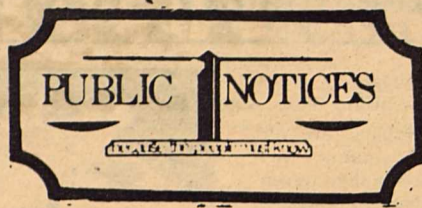

NOTICE OF APPLICATION FOR WASTE DISCHARGE PERMIT RENEWAL

THE CITY OF BRACKETTVILLE, P.O. Box 526, Brackettville, Texas 78832 has applied to the Texas Department of Water Resources for renewal of Permit No. 10194-01 which authorizes a discharge of treated domestic wastewater effluent at a volume not to exceed an average flow of 300,000 gallons per day from the wastewater treatment plant which is located approximately 0.8 mile southwest of the intersection of U.S. Highway 90 with State Highway 131 in the city of Brackettville in Kinney County, Texas. The effluent is discharged into Las Moras Creek; thence to the Rio Grande in Segment No. 2304 of the Rio Grande Basin.

The permit, if renewed by the Commission, will specify conditions and limitations generally the same as those currently enforced by the existing permit. The expiration date of the existing permit was March 26, 1984. It is proposed that the expiration date be specified as midnight, five yeras after date of Commission approval.

Legal Authority: Section 26.028 of the Texas Water Code, as amended, and 31 TAC 341 of the Rules of the Texas Department of Water resources.

No public hearing will be held on this application unless an affected person who has received notice of the application has requested a public hearing. Any such request for a public hearing shall be in writing and contain (1) the name, mailing address and phone number of the person making the request; and (2) a brief discription of how the requester, or persons represented by the requester, would be adversely affected by the granting of the application. If the Commission determines that the request sets out an issue which is relevant to the permit decision, or that a public hearing would serve the public interest, the Commission shall conduct a public hearing, after the issuance of proper and timely notice of the hearing. If no sufficient request for hearing is received within 30 days of the date of publication of the notice concerning the application, the permit will be submitted to the Commission for final decision on the application.

Q. I have found my older children offering table food to my 8-month-old son. How do I know when my child is really ready for table foods?

A. The transition from baby foods to family foods occurs in several steps based on a youngster's physical development.

Junior foods, which have more texture and encourage chewing, usually are introduced when a baby begins to develop teeth. For many youngsters this transition is appropriate at 8 or 9 months of age. The foods should gradually be added to the diet, just as you introduced baby's first solid foods.

Toddler foods are the next step toward table foods. Gerber Chunky Foods for Toddlers™ are mildly seasoned and have bite-size pieces of fruits, vegetables and meats.
