





Arraignment procedings were held in District Court Friday November 15th. District Judge George Thurmond and District Attorney Tom Lee were present with Judge Thurmond presiding.

A pre-trial hearing was set for Louis Starzel, Kinney County Justice of the PEace who has been indicted by the Kinney County Grand Jury on charges of Felony Theft. The charges stem from an investigation and audit of his office which turned up missing public funds. The hearing was set for December 12th.

George Joseph Barber, 27, of Brackettville, who is charged with the homocide death of John Lee Titt, 137, also of Brackettville, which occured on October 11th was instructed by Judge Thurmond to obtain an attorney and prepare for trial. Barber had requested a court-appointed attorney, that request was denied by the judge.

Francisco Martinez, 21, also of Brackettville was arraigned on charges of Violation of Probation of a 1983 Burglary conviction. Martinez had been sought by the Sheriff's Department on a warrant issued in February of this year. He was arrested on October 11th and has been held in the county jail without bond since that date pending a hearing in District Court. Judge Thurmond appointed an attorney for Martinez as he was unable to hire one.

W.C. Jackson, 67, did not appear for arraignment on Felony Theft charges pending against him in District Court. He is believed to have fled the state to avoid prosecution and a fus tive warrant has been issued the his arrest. I recently reported to

you that the Kinney County Jail had been certified to be in full compliance with the minimum standards required by the Texas Commission on Jail Standards. I also mentioned the fact that the huge majority of these standards are mandated by court decisions in favor of cases filed by inmates of various Jarls and prisons who dife.

demanding better living conditions while they are confined for their crimes against society. Kinney County has spent over \$100,000.00 above and beyond the original cost of the jail, which was completed in 1974, in order to bring the facility within compliance. Wehave met every requirement of the Commission at a great cost to the County (taxpayers), but finally reached the elusive level of compliance required by law.


Well, Guess What! The Commission now says that we, have to install a light above the lavatory in every cell in the jail. The light has to be. wired into a control panel in the Dispatcher's office so that the lights can be turned down low at night to provide a "night light" for the prisoners but won't be too bright to disturb their sleep. The inspector came by with his trusty little light meter and decided that the light now being provided by two 4 foot long lights in each cell was not adequate to provide the prisoners in those cells with enough light to shave by and/or have a night light.

We have received preliminary cost estimates of the system and this little project is going to cost the county (taxpayers) between \$2,500 and \$3,500. The Jail Commission has advised me that these lights must be installed by the time we have our next inspection or we will, once. again, be in violation of state law and will lose our status as a Certified Jail. Where will it all end?

It seems to me that the law these days is more concerned with the individual rights of a small minority of criminal violators that with the rights of the large majority of law abiding citizens of our country. Prisoners already receive food, clothing, dental and medical care, educational programs, exercise, and the list of benefits goes on and on. The commit crimes against society, then society has to dig deeper to provide them with all the fringe benefits that they demand, and most often recieve, through the courts. JUSTICE??

1986 MAIN STREET CITIES

At its quarterly meeting in San Angelo on October 28, 1985, the Texas Historical Commission designated the cities of Greenville, Palestine, Pittsburg, Pampa, and San Marcos as the 1986 Texas Main Street cities. These five communities will join a network of 35 cities working to revitalize their central business districts by developing the historic fabric of their downtowns.

Each designated Main Street city hires a full-time Main Street Manager for a three-year period to coordinate the project, using " private sector techinques of marketins, management, and business development, as well as historic architectural design and landscape improvements. Local financial institutions lend support by setting up low-interest loan to encourage pools rehabilitation and reuse of existing historic buildings.

The Texas Main Street Project of the Texas Historical Commission is primarily a technical assistance program rather that a grant program. Many other state agencies, such as the Texas Economic Development Commission, the Texas Department of Community Affairs, the Texas Department of Agriculture, the Texas Tourist Development Agency, and the Governor's Office, provide additional assistance.

A key to success of the Main Street Project is the joining of historic preservation and economic development techinques to redevelop downtown as a viable marketplace. Since the beginning of the Texas Main Street Project in 1981, Main Street cities have seen a total of 1,020 downtown buildings rehabilitated, a net gain of 594 new businesses and 1,562 new jobs, and a private reinvestment in downtowns of more that \$96,400,000.


