I have been contacted by several local residents expressing their interest in taking spanish lessons. At the present time no spanish lessons have been taught at the library, but if more parties are interested, I believe arrangements could be made to offer a class.

We have just received our Filmstrip Circuit Catalog. The Filmstrip Circuit materials are divided into 30 packets each consisting of nine titles. Just look at the shows listed in Satellite ORBIT and you can see that there are plenty of other channels that are free. I saw an announcement on one of the
cable stations the other day saying cable stations the other day saying
that satellite dish owners have to pa them a fee to watch even though they aren't scrambled yet. What's that all about?

There are several services that have announced prescrambling fees But many experts say that those fees are invalid. AI
Gore, the U.S. Senator from Tennesse, said recently:
"The marketing systems these programmers are attempting to impose on home satellite earth station viewers are inconsistent with Section 705 of the Communications Policy Act, and therefore are invalid and have no effect.' Gore was one of the men who wrote the la what he's talking about.
I thought the whole idea of getting a dish was to get all those channels for free.
Yes, satellite TV has been free, and even after scrambling, there still will be almost 100 free channels. But it's only right that we pay a fair price to watch services that depen on subscriptions rather than' advertising. Otherwise, those programmers will have no way of recovering the cost of producing those shows.

- Why should I get a dish, though, if I have to pay for the programming just like I do for cable?

## THE EDNA GLADNEY CENTER

The Edna Gladney Home, the largest maternity home and infant placement agency in the United States, has recently changed its name to The Edna Gladney Center it was announced today by Mrs. Eleanor Tuck, Executive Director.
"Gladney's program has come a great distance since its founding in 1887," Mrs. Tuck stated. "We have grown from being housed literally in Mrs. Edna Gladney's home to having a facility today that emcompasses one entire city block in Fort worth, Texas. Our focus today centers on providing services that are meaningful to young women experiencing an untimely pregancy.
"The decision to become The Edna Gladney Center came, in part, as the result of listening carefully to what was being said to us by the young women whom we serve," Mrs. Tuck continued. "Almost without exception they have told us that upon their arrival at Gladney they were surprised and very pleased to see that it was not actuallya large home with all the girls staying in one room!
"Additionally, they have indicated that because of the scope and dimension of the program that are offered at Gladney, "Center" would more accurately describe what goes on here. We firmly believe that the time spent at The Center should be not an "inwaiting" period but rather an opportunity to begin setting goals and obtaining the confidence and skills to carry them out. Our program is "centered" around that concept."
The services of The Edna Gladney Center include a residential program offering counseling, medical, educational and enrichment services. Other divisions of The Center are: Infant Placement, and Post-Adoption Services to birthparents, children and adoptive couples, Community Services of Texas, New Hope Special Needs Adoptions and International Adoptions.

STATE DEPARTMENT OF HIGHWAYS AND PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION

About 160 miles of highways in an eleven county area of West Texas will be improved under a contract approved in February by the State Highway and Public Transportation Commission.

The contract was awarded to Strain Bros., Inc., at their low bid of $\$ 1,587,358.28$.

The work will consist of applying a protective seal coat to roadways in Concho, Crockett, Kimble, Kinney, Reagan, Real, Runnels, Schhleicher, Sutton, Tom Green, and Val Verde counties.

Gene Hirschfelt, public affairs officer for the highway department in San Angelo, said that seal coating is a method of protecting and improving the surface of highways that provides good preventive maintenance.

The seal coat process consists of spreading a layer of liquid asphalt on the roadway surface, followed by a coating of fime rock chips which sink into the asphalt. The operation seals the surface to retard the formation of potholes, and provides smoother, safer traffice lanes for motorists.
Dan Gower of San Angelo is the highway department engineer who will supervise the work.
Highways is Kinney and Val Verde counties are:
Kinney County: US 90, from 2.7 miles west of Brackettville eastward, 12.6 miles.

Val Verde County: US 90, from US 277 near Del Rio to Spur 349 at Amistad Reservoir, 7.1 miles.

In adddition to improving 160 miles of highways, the work will generate about 19 construction site jobs, according to statistics prepared recently by the Federal Highway Administration. The FHWA report said that approximately 13 jobs are added in a construction area for each million dollars of activity in the southwestern United States. A job is defined as 1,600 person-hours per year.

FAMILY FINANCIAL STRESS AND CHILDREN

Stress in a child may be hard to recognize because it often takes the form of misbehavior. But you should be aware that a family's financial problem - like other stresses - will affect children too, says sylvia Baker, County Extension Agent.

However, child development experts tell us there are several ways to support a child who is stressed.

Listening is the first suggestion. Children's concerns are real to them. It may not seem to you that what they are describing is important or worth worrying about, but it is to them.

Children may have exaggerated fears that the loss of your job, a drop in farm income or some other family financial problem will mean they won't have anything to eat or they'll have to move right away.

Reassuring the child and sharing what positive steps the family is taking to deal with the problem can help reduce such fears. Letting the children help by making from - scratch cookies, clip coupons, save aluminum cans or other money saving jobs will let them feel both helpful and important says Mrs. Baker.
Allowing children to express their feelings is also an important way to help them deal with stress and to let them know it's "ok" to worry. Adults can comfort and that they don't have to bear their burdens all alone.

Sometimes it helps to read a story or make one up about a child in similiar circumstances. This can also convey the sense that the child is not the only one who feels bad.

It's also very important to provide many opportunities for children to exercise vigorously, to play constructively, to work constructively, to fee
needed, and to rest soundly.
A final suggestion is to maintain basic limit setting. This snds a message to the child that are interested enough to care what he or she does - and that is crucial to the child's sense of security. 1501.

EFFECTIVE RAINFALL -- THE PRIMARY LIMITING FACTOR ON RANGELAND

Every rancher prays for rain to grow more forage. This is especially true during drought, when shortages of forage often result in the forced sale of livestock at lower than normal prices and the purchase of high-priced feed and hay to sustain a base herd.

According to Dr. Larry White, range specialist with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service in Uvalde, rangelands are characteristically dry but can grow abundant forage if the rainfall is effective.
"For rainfall to be effective, however, the water must enter the soil through infiltration, not runoff, and the plants must be healthy enough to grow," White said.

Rainfall is the major limiting factor to forage production and quality, he said, but previous grazing management, current health of range plants, and the ability of the soil to absorb water greatly influence production. "Many ranches have such poor vegetative cover and soil conditions that even in normal rainfall years, little forage is produced and near-drought conditions are common," White said.

Infiltration of water into the soil is greatly affected by grazing, the range specialist said. Research near Sonora, Texas, concluded that infiltration rates and soil water for plant growth decrease as the "midgrasses" decline. Areas covered in bunchgrass, such as sideoats grama, accept three times more infiltration than bare ground,

White said.
Hoof action on grassland can also be beneficial, he said. Research has shown that grassland resists "trampling more successfully than any other type of community, though as with grazing, the amount of damage is determined by the severity of the process." The same study showed that trampling, when not too severe, could aid in scattering and planting seeds and fruits, White said.

Ranchers should protect soil and forage resources during drought years so that faster recovery and higher returns can be realized in good rainfall years, White said.
"High rainfall years are important for range recovery, especially for desirable forage seeding establishment. Good grazing management is essential for effective rainfall," he stressed.

Even in poor rainfall years, more water will infiltrate and grow forage on ranches with good vegetative cover than those in poor range condition, he said.
"Ranchers can grow more forage will less rainfall with more vegetative cover than having to rely on high rainfall years," White said.
