## PROPERTY TAX RENDITIONS



### HELP YOU PROTECT YOUR RIGHTS AS A TAXPAYER

A rendition is a report to the appraisal district that lists all the taxable property you own or control on January 1, 1986. You may also give your opinion of the property's value, if you wish.

You must file a rendition if you own tangible personal property used to produce income—such as the machinery and equipment used by a business.

The appraisal district may require any taxpayer to file a rendition by sending the taxpayer a written notice and a rendition form.

You may want to file a rendition, even if you aren't required to file, to preserve some of your rights as a taxpayer:

- You put your correct mailing address on record so your tax bills will go to the right address. Even if your bill goes to the wrong address, the law still holds you responsible for paying your taxes on time or else paying extra charges for late payments.
- You can put your own opinion of your property's value on record. If the

appraisal district then places a higher value on your property, it must notify you in writing of the higher value and explain how you can protest that value to the appraisal review board.

• By filing a special type of rendition called a *report of decreased value*, you can notify the appraisal district of significant damage to your property that occurred in 1985. The district will send someone to verify the damage and take it into account when assigning a 1986 value to your property.

File renditions with your local appraisal district at the address shown below. Forms are available at this office.

The new deadline for 1986 renditions is March 31. You can get an extra 30 days if you ask for it in writing before the March 31 deadline.

### NAIL DISORDERS UNSIGHTLY BUT NOT HARMFUL

Broken, discolored fingernails and toenails are not always a sign of illness. And good nail care will help prevent many nail problems. The Texas Medical Association suggests follow these guidelines for healthy-looking nails:

--Protect your nails from prolonged immersion in water, especially soapy water.

--keep nails short to prevent them from getting splits, which tend to trap dirt.

--trim your nails regularly with scissors, special nail clippers or a diamond chip file.

--either leave cuticles alone, or push them down with a cuticle stick or the thumbnail of the opposite hand.

--if you use nail polish, touch up any chips in it rather than remove it with nailpolish remover. Nail polish remover makes nails weak and brittle. Don not use it more than once a week.

Brittleness, like dry skin, is one problem that is likely to worsen in winter. Wear rubber gloves when immersing hands in soapy water, and warm gloves when outdoors in winter.

White spots on nails usually result from minor injury to the nails. White spots seldom indicate any vitamin or mineral deficiency; they will vanish as the nail grows.

Longitudinal ridges on nails are not unusual; they may be genetic, and they do become more prominent as you age. If you have crosswise ridges, you may have injured the nail with a manicure tool or by biting your nails and cuticles. These ridges also may appear after any illness, but they are not symptoms of infection.

Discoloration of nail may be caused by cigarettes, hair dyes, and even the tints from nail polish. Discoloration is also caused by various illnesses. The nail bed appears pale in anemia and white in chronic liver disease. Small, black, splinterlike areas appear under the nails in infections of the heart valves.

Many nail problems are not medically significant. Nevertheless, your nails are one of many indicators of health. Any dramatic changes in their texture, shape, color or growth rate may be a signal that you should seek medical advice.

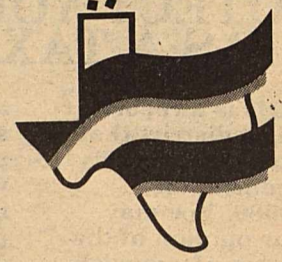

**History Repeats Itself**

It often has been said that history repeats itself. The following comparison of Presidents Lincoln and Kennedy, is a graphic example.

## HOME BURGLARY PREVENTION

Most burglars don't like to work for their living. Your best prevention against burglary is to make your home as hard a target as possible. Reduce the opportunity for the thief.

Install quality locks, keep your home well lighted -- make sure that the thief has to work for what he gets. Often he may become so discouraged he will go elsewhere.

What can you do to make your home a tougher target?

The Alamo Area Crime Prevention Association suggests a number of steps:

Don't leave your keys under mats -- that is the first place a burglar will look.

Don't leave notes on the door -- it shows clearly no one is home.

Do not keep large amounts of cash or jewelry at home. Safes and safe deposit boxes are the only secure places for these items.

Keep a porch light on and encourage your neighbors to do the same.

When you are away from home in the evening, leave two or more lights on inside. Keep a radio playing preferable to a talk station.

From all appearances, it should seem as if someone is home.

Make sure all doors and windows are locked.

The best door lock is a dead bolt lock. If your home is not equipped with dead bolt locks, see your hardware dealer or locksmith about installing them.

Garage doors should be equipped with case-hardened or hardened steel hasp and matching padlock to prevent a thief from entering your home unobserved.

If you have considerable amounts of valuable furniture, it may be a good idea to install a home burglar alarm system.

Systems can range from a simple switch at one entrance to complicated detectors which send silent signals to the police station or other protection agencies.

A common burglary alarm, of course, is the family dog.

# STRAIGHT TALK ABOUT SCRAMBLING

## ANSWERS TO THE MOST COMMON QUESTIONS ABOUT HOW SCRAMBLING WILL AFFECT HOME SATELLITE TV VIEWERS.

**Q.** Is home satellite TV legal?

**A.** Absolutely. Last fall, President Reagan signed Public Law 98-549 which confirmed the legality of home satellite TV.

**Q.** Aren't HBO and other channels planning to scramble soon so that people with dishes won't be able to watch their shows?

**A.** Yes, they are planning to scramble. But you will still be able to watch scrambled shows on your dish if you want to. Programmers like HBO are working on descrambling systems that will make it possible to receive their signals with a home satellite TV system.

**Q.** But won't I have to pay a fee and buy a descrambler?

**A.** Yes. The system hasn't been worked out completely, but you will be able to buy a descrambler and pay a monthly fee for the scrambled services you want to see. Only a handful of services plan to scramble in the next year, and even then, there will be plenty of free programming to watch on your dish. Just look at the shows listed in Satellite ORBIT and you can see that there are plenty of other channels that are free.

**Q.** I saw an announcement on one of the cable stations the other day saying that satellite dish owners have to pay them a fee to watch even though they aren't scrambled yet. What's that all about?

**A.** There are several services that have announced pre-scrambling fees. But many experts say that those fees are invalid. Al Gore, the U.S. Senator from Tennessee, said recently:

"The marketing systems these programmers are attempting to impose on home satellite earth station viewers are inconsistent with Section 705 of the Communications Policy Act, and therefore are invalid and have no effect." Gore was one of the men who wrote the law that made satellite TV legal, so he knows what he's talking about.

**Q.** I thought the whole idea of getting a dish was to get all those channels for free.

**A.** Yes, satellite TV has been free, and even after scrambling, there still will be almost 100 free channels. But it's only right that we pay a fair price to watch services that depend on subscriptions rather than advertising. Otherwise, those programmers will have no way of recovering the cost of producing those shows.

**Q.** Why should I get a dish, though, if I have to pay for the programming just like I do for cable?

**A.** Satellite TV gives you much more programming to choose from today, and it will still give you more even after some services scramble. And there will be a system that lets you pay to get the scrambled programs if you want to. So satellite TV gives you more channels to choose from for less money.

## SOUTHWEST TEXAS JUNIOR COLLEGE

A course in advanced life-saving techniques will begin at Southwest Texas Junior College on Monday, March 17 at 6 p.m. in the indoor swimming pool building on the college campus.

The course carries one hour of college credit. Students who complete the course will receive American Red Cross certification as a "Senior Lifesaver" and will be qualified to work as a lifeguard.

"We will need lifeguards for the college pool this summer and the fall, and area pool managers are already calling me for recommendations for lifeguards," said physical education instructor Rose Koehl. "Anyone interested in working as a lifeguard or simply learning about water safety should seriously consider the course."

Registration for the course, which includes an approximate \$55 fee, will be held during the first class meeting. Scheduling for the 32 hours required for the course will also be discussed.

"We will meet three or four nights each week from 6 to 9 p.m. until the course requirements are met," Koehl explained. "I will work with the students to set up a schedule that will accommodate their needs."

A maximum of 16 students will be accepted in the class. For more information, contact Koehl at 278-4401 on Monday, March 17. The college will be closed for the traditional spring break the week of March 10 through March 14.

The Southwest Texas Junior College student chapter of the Association of Texas Professional Educators announced their semester project and heard a special presentation from a Uvalde juvenile probation officer during a meeting at the college last week.

The college chapter will sponsor an organ donor drive on the SWTJC campus March 18 and 19 from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. in the student center.

As transplantation techniques improve, the need for donated organs is expected to increase, and many lives can be saved by making these organs available, according to ATPE sponsor Nancy Rutledge,

and English instructor at SWTJC.

"Moral leaders the world over favor such donations as expressions of the highest humanitarian ideals," Rutledge said. "Members of ATPE encourage anyone over the age of 18 to sign a donor card or the back of their driver's license to give the "gift of life".

Techniques for transplanting kidneys and corneas are currently the most advanced, but progress is being made with the liver, pancreas, heart, bone and other tissues.

Also during the meeting to announce the drive, Uvalde juvenile probation officer Terry Studer spoke on the procedure for putting juveniles on probation and how the process involves interaction with local school system.

Studer suggested that law enforcement and schools work together more closely to insure the effectiveness of techniques to deal with juvenile delinquency.

## POISONS ACT FAST ... SO DO CHILDREN

Thanks to the efforts of local, grass roots groups and farsighted federal legislation, the 25 year National Poison Prevention Week campaign to lower the number of accidental poisoning deaths has proved highly successful. This observation is borne out by a drastic reduction in poison fatalities in children under the age of five, dropping from approximately 450 in 1962 to 67 in 1982.

National Poison Prevention Week, with its theme of "Poisons Act Fast ... So Do Children," is observed this year March 16 - 22. The observation became public law when signed by President Kennedy in 1961. Additional legislation followed in 1970, passage of the Poison Prevention Act that requires child-resistant packaging.

This "one-two punch" of legislation is backed by the continuing, untiring efforts of local poison control centers, safety councils, pharmacies, health departments, and hospitals to educate and emphasize the need for awareness and prevention.

The annual theme underscores the fact that most poisoning accidents occur in the home, where medications, household

cleaning products, and cosmetics are the most common items involved in poisonings.

Texas Safety Association recommends you "poison proof" your home, including garage and storage areas, by following some prevention tips:

\*Store all household cleaning products out of a child's reach and away from shelves containing food. Lock up all toxic products.

\*Keep medicines, cleaning products, paint, drain cleaners, and any other potentially harmful products in their original containers.

\*Never tell children that medicine is "candy," which may tempt them later to seek it out.

\*Buy only child-resistant packaged medicines and keep them closed properly.

\*And be certain to keep the telephone number of your local Poison Control Center close to the phone. If you need to call for help, have the poison container in your hand in order to describe the substance swallowed by the victim. Your local Poison Control Center number is located on the inside cover of your telephone directory for immediate, easy access.

"Another area of awareness for poison prevention involves visitors to your home or your visits to others," cautions George R. Gustafson, Executive President of TSA. A recent study by the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission showed that 36% of the accidental childhood prescription drug ingestions involved a grandparent's medication. "Children are curious and grandparents often have non-child-resistant prescription vials or loose pills out on tables, kitchen counters, in purses, or in jackets. We need to continue our awareness efforts to help keep children safe," Gustafson pointed out.

Remember, poisons act fast and so do children, so stay aware during National Poison Prevention Week and year round.

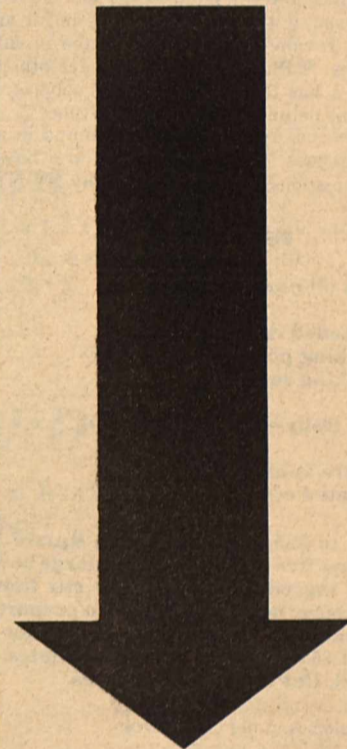

### FUDGE CAKE

- 1 cup unsifted all-purpose flour
- 1/2 cup sugar
- 1/4 cup unsweetened cocoa
- 1 teaspoon baking powder
- 3/4 teaspoon baking soda
- 3/4 cup water
- 2 tablespoons Hollywood Safflower Oil
- 2 egg whites
- 1 teaspoon pure vanilla extract
- 1/2 teaspoon grated orange peel

Preheat oven to 325 F. Oil an 8-inch square baking pan. Combine first five ingredients. In a large bowl combine remaining ingredients. Gradually stir flour mixture into oil mixture; mix well. 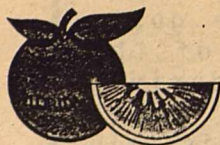

**SHERIFF'S CORNER**

This past week has been one of those of high and low daily activities that comes along every so often that makes us think we are earning our pay. We were kept extremely busy at times and other times the activity slowed down enough to allow us to catch up on the paperwork associated with the previous incidents.

Gregorio Sandoval reported on Monday, March 3rd, that someone had entered his goat pen and had killed and stolen a goat belonging to him over the week-end. We investigated the incident and evidence at the scene indicated that the thieves had cut the throat of the goat while still in the pen and then, after it was dead, lifted it over the fence. We followed the trail out to Fulton Street, then west for a short distance before losing the trail out to Fulton Street, then west for a short distance before losing the trail on the pavement. There are no suspects at this time, but there has been an increase in theft of livestock in that area over the past few weeks so added patrol time will be spent there in an effort to curb the criminal activity.

On Tuesday afternoon we received a report that a plane had landed on Highway 131 south of Spofford and had made contact with a small, white truck. As we have suspected for quite some time that illegal activities involving planes have been occurring in that area we immediately contacted U.S. Customs Air Operation Branch and reported the incident. They dispatched one of their "hot" pursuit planes and I made contact with them in the Spofford area by radio. They patrolled by air and I by land and we finally located the plane. It turned out to be a survey crew working on the Burr Ranch in Maverick County. We have been working closely with U.S. Customs Air Patrol on sightings of suspect planes in Kinney County the past few months. Anyone making a sightings of a suspicious plane should attempt to obtain the number of the plane, a brief description as to color,

number of engines, etc. Report these sightings and their location to the Sheriff's Department as soon as possible. There has been a heavy increase of illegal narcotics traffic along the Texas-Mexico border since heavy pressure has been applied on these activities in Florida. If we can make it "hot" enough here hopefully Kinney County can remain basically free of illegal drug traffic.

On Thursday, March 6th, we received a call for assistance in locating a missing person out of San Antonio. The white female was believed to have come to a hunting camp in Kinney County east of Brackettville, but attempts to locate her in this area were negative.

On Friday, March 7th, Ft. Clark Security called for assistance in the investigation of a case of Criminal Mischief at Camper's World on the Fort. I met with Chief of Security Wallace Morgan and evidence at the scene and statements of witnesses lead us to believe the suspects to local juveniles. A good follow-up investigation by Chief Morgan led to the apprehension of three male juveniles later that day. We met with the suspects and their parents at the Sheriff's Office and reached an agreement whereby the three young juveniles would be given a break this time with no charges filed. They were, however, strongly advised that further activity of this type would result in charges being filed and legal proceedings instigated against them in Juvenile Court.

The trial of Juan Martinez of Brackettville, charged with Burglary of a Building in January of this year was held on Friday, March 7th. Martinez has been held in the county jail in lieu of \$5,000.00 bond. The charges were reduced from a Third Degree Felony to a Class A Misdemeanor in a plea-bargain agreement reached between District Attorney Tom Lee and Martinez's attorney. Martinez pled guilty and received a sentence of 60 days in the county jail and court costs of \$88.00.

Saturday afternoon, March 8th, we received a call for assistance from the Medina County Sheriff's Department in Hondo. They requested that I

bring our mantrailing Bloodhound "Dandy" to an area north of Castroville in an attempt to locate a black male who had been driving a stolen car. When officers gave pursuit the man ran two road blocks, wrecked the car after a high speed chase on rural roads and then fled into heavy brush on foot.

Deputy Sheriff Terry Fisher, myself, and "Dandy" proceeded to the scene, arriving approx 2 hours after the incident had occurred. Dandy was started on trail from the car and we trailed the man approx 3 miles through heavy brush to near a farm house. We were then notified that a confirmed sighting of the suspect had occurred 2 miles farther south of our location (on a direct line with the trail Dandy was following). We were transported to that location, but due to contamination of the area by peace officers involved in the search we were unable to start the trail again. It was near dark by this time so we pulled out of the search and returned to Brackettville. The suspect has not been located at the time of this writing.

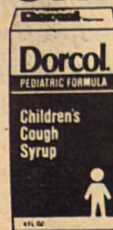

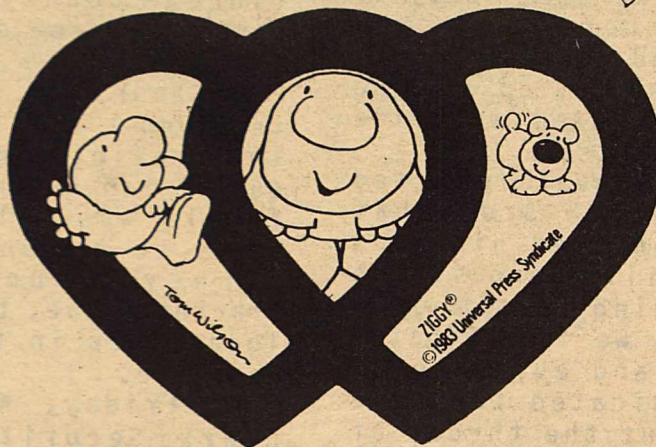
