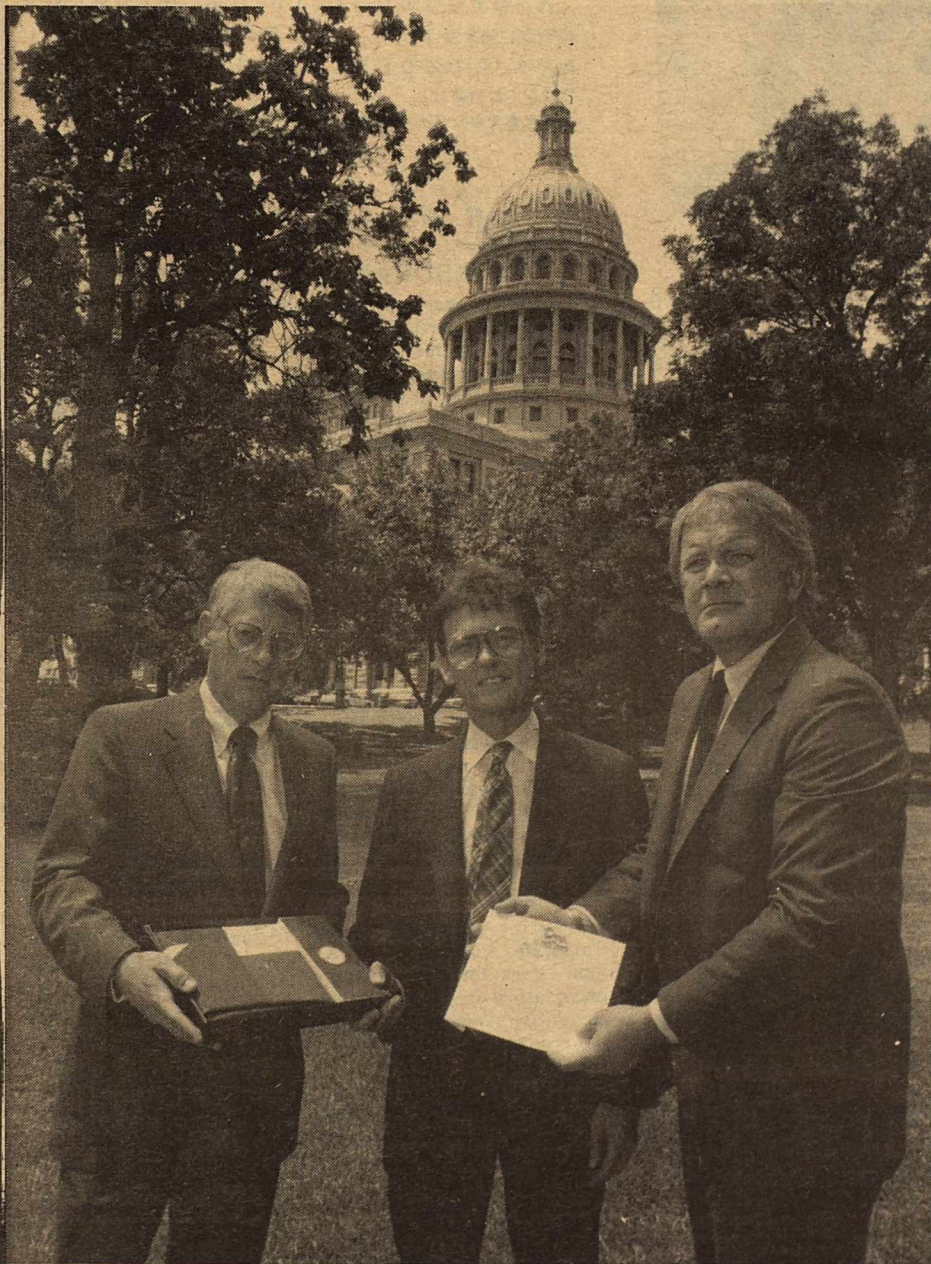

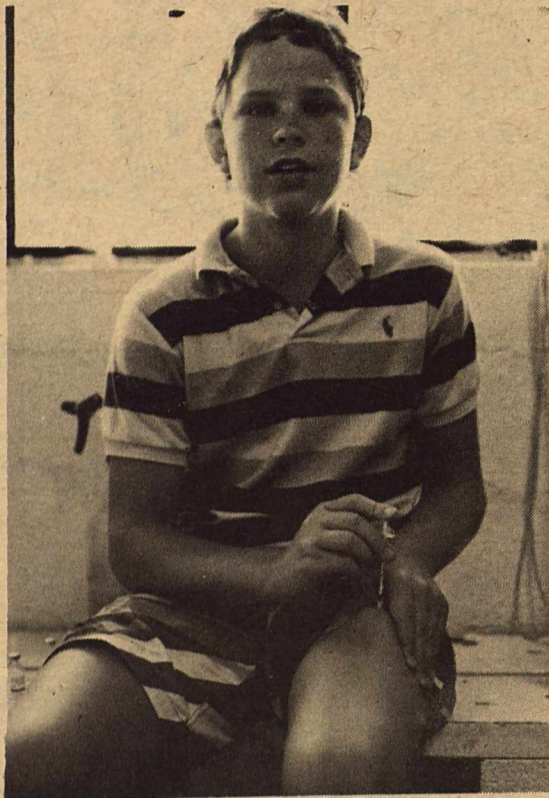
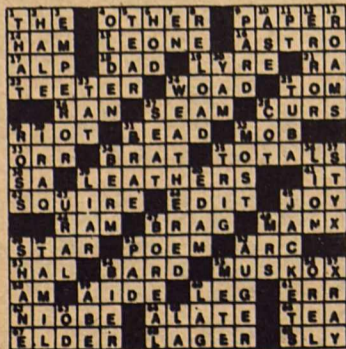

Insulin injections and blood tests are a part of a diabetic's daily routine. The Texas Lions Camp teaches diabetic campers to give their own insulin injections and conduct the necessary tests.

KERRVILLE, TX -- TEXAS LIONS CAMP FOR DIABETIC CHILDREN

A diabetic youth from Brackettville, Texas enjoyed six days of camp fun and medical education at the Texas Lions Camp in Kerrville. William Risinger, 14, and 130 other campers attended the camp free of charge.

The focus of the camp is to help insulin dependant diabetic children understand and manage diabetes. A team of doctors, nurses, and dietitians from the University of Texas Medical Branch at Galveston teach the campers about balancing their diets, testing blood sugar levels and giving their own insulin injections. The medical team helps the campers understand why the tests are necessary and helps them understand their meaning.

Activities at camp include swimming, nature study, basketball, volleyball, canoeing, tennis, golf, ceramics, snorkeling and many

more. All activities are supervised by an experienced counselor staff.

The Texas Lions Camp is located on 500 acres of the Texas hill country near Kerrville. The camp holds two sessions for insulin-dependant children between the ages of six and 17. The Brackettville Lions Club sponsored Risinger and made it possible for him to attend camp. The Texas Lions Camp is a non-profit organization which has served more than 4500 diabetic children since the program began in 1971. It is funded by contributors interested in providing recreation and education for handicapped and diabetic children.

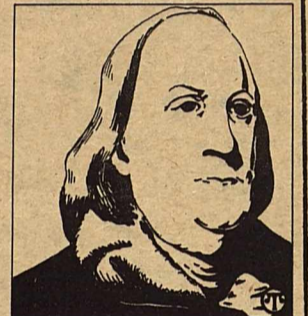

I sometimes receive requests from local merchants and private citizens to assist them in problems they are having concerning a "hot check". This week's column will contain information that should alert those of you who take checks on what to look for and the proper procedure to follow if your precautions fail and you receive a "hot check".

It is of vital importance to thoroughly examine a check before accepting it. In the case of a merchant, your establishment should have a set policy for all customers so that no one should have any reason to feel that they are being treated unfairly. It would be a good idea to have a "checklist" available where a cashier can see it easily. The "checklist" should have at least the following information on it:

1. IS IT DATED TODAY?
Checks must be dated the same day they are given. Post-dated checks are not subject to prosecution.
2. IS THE SIGNATURE LEGIBLE?
DO NOT accept checks previously signed. Have them signed in your presence and compare the signature with that on the customer's driver's license or I.D.
3. IS THE ADDRESS COMPLETE?
Require a permanent street address, not a P.O. Box number unless you personally know the customer.
4. CAN YOU CONFIRM THE IDENTITY OF THE CHECK WRITER?
Every kind of I.D. can be forged. The most reliable ones are those with physical descriptions, photos, etc. If you are suspicious, ask the writer to hand you the license, he may be caught off guard and give the wrong information.
5. DO WRITTEN AMOUNTS AND NUMBERS CORRESPOND?
Banks will not honor

checks that have discrepancies.

6. IS THE I.D. USED RECORDED?
Record ON THE CHECK the type of I.D. and I.D. numbers as well as the initials of the clerk who takes the check.

I have listed below a few clues for detecting bad checks, they are:

1. Beware of low series of numbers on personal checks. About 85% of all uncollected "hot checks" are new account numbers between 101 and 150.
2. Check the finish of the black magnetic computer numbers on the bottom of the checks. Magnetic ink is very dull-never shiny.
3. Check the first four magnetic numbers to the left of the account number. Each area of the state has it's own bank routing number-LEARN YOURS.
4. Look for at least one (1) perforated edge. All checks except government or computer produced will be perforated.
5. Beware of photocopied checks. The best sign of a photocopied check is shiny, tacky, uneven letters. Also beware of photocopied "color" on multi-color checks from large corporations.

There are certain checks to be avoided because they usually WILL NOT be prosecuted. They are as follows:

1. A check marked "refer to maker", drawn against uncollected funds", or "unable to locate account".
2. A post-dated check.
3. A stop payment check.
4. A check on an out-of-state bank.
5. A two party check.
6. A check more than a year old.
7. A check for less than \$5.00.

8. A check for which partial payment has been received.
9. A check given in exchange for a returned check.
10. A check which does not identify who accepted it.
11. A check received in the mail.
12. A check not passed in this country.
13. A check not presented to the bank within 30 days of issuance.
14. And, a check for which no 10 day notice was given.

Should you have a check returned there are certain procedures to follow before the check will be accepted for prosecution, they are as follows:

1. The check MUST be presented to the bank for payment, even though you know it will not be honored.
2. You must send written notification to the check writer informing him or her of the reason the check was not honored. The written notice must be sent CERTIFIED, RETURN RECEIPT REQUESTED.
3. Be sure to keep a copy of this letter. If, after 10 days the check has not been paid, you must personally take it to the prosecuting attorney's office and furnish the following:

1. The original check with the bank flag or notation showing the reason it was not honored;



2. The signed return receipt from the certified letter or the letter (unopened) marked **REFUSED** or **UNCLAIMED**;
3. A copy of your letter;
4. The name, address and phone number of the person who accepted the check and who can identify the maker;
5. Specific identification of maker such as drivers license number, date of birth, and physical description. (It will be necessary for you to supply this information on a form when you go to the prosecutor's office.)

Though the proper channel is to go directly to the county or district attorneys office, my advice would be to take extra precautions with checks and maybe avoid lengthy, time consuming court action at a later date. **GOOD LUCK!**

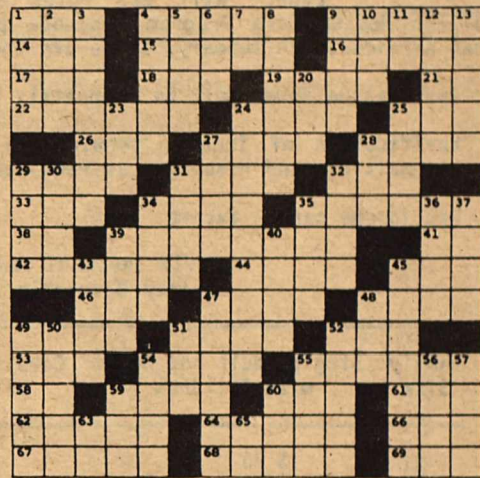

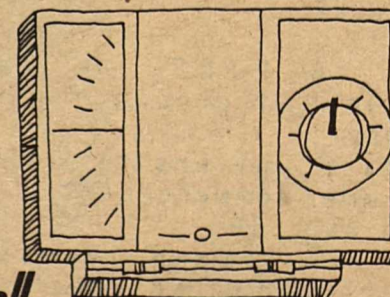
