# Ben Miller creates special sculpture for Post Founder's Day

Ben was asked by the Founder's Day Committee to build a special sculpture for the occasion and he has outdone himself.

The sculpture, called "Visionary", is a spectacular work of art. It features a rider on a horse looking around the area and visualizing what the future will hold. The rustic base of the sculpture will depict industries of Garza County.

Ben, a world known sculptor, starts with a drawing of the skeleton of horse and rider. He builds the skeleton out of wire and clay and then details all the muscles on both and builds them up.

When I viewed the sculpture, I really would not have imagined that all the detail that was done ahead of time. The sculpture will be a quarter of life-size when finished.

Ben explained the process of going from the clay to the bronze finish. They will make a mold of the clay product then go to a rubber mold. After that a wax mold is made. Then the bronze will be

poured. It is a very tedious procedure.

Ben said that after the poring of the mold is complete and the sculpture is removed, the mold will be destroyed. "This is a one-of-a-kind. No other will be made," he said.

The sculpture will be auctioned during the Black Tie & Boots celebration, September 23.

"We are really fortunate to have such a talented person in our midst. Ben is really 'one-of-a-kind'," said Barbara Hardin, Post Main Street Manager.

## Winners of Letter-Writing Contest


