| Stop and Shop Drive-In grocery, early Monday morning, was thwarted by the quick action of a Fort Clark security guard and the rapid response of Brackettville Chief of Police, Johnny Fritter. <br> Dan Shi, security guard on the Fort Clark gate, was working the graveyard shift when he noticed someone trying to get into the Stop and Shop shortly after 1:00 A.M. Shi's attention was attracted because the individual was trying to enter through a side entrance that was known to be sealed up. He immediately notified the Sheriff's office, with the primary call being made at 1:20 A.M. According to the dispatcher in the Sher- iff's office, a call was place to John Fritter at 1:21 A.M. A second call at $1: 25$ A.M. was attempted by the Fort Clark securi- ty to the Sheriff's office but it could not be completed due to the line being busy. A third call was made by security to the Sheriff's department at $1: 28$ A.M. notifying them of the sound of breaking glass coming from the west side of the building. ## Irate Parents Appear Before School Board

A special meeting by the
Brackett school trustees was scheduled for Monday evening at six thirty o'clock for the purpos of canvassing the results of the
Bond Election. What should have Boen a routine meeting developed into a very volatile situation after Mr. Vitt, LaGioia requested his name be placed on the agenda.
After calling the meeting t. order promptly at six thirty o'-
clock in the high school library the Board immediately went into execre for four hours. The Boar heard concerns and complaints from four sets of parents in re gards to a corporal punishmen
incident concerning members of the coaching staff.
On the morning of March 22,
1991, according to Bracket 1991, according to Brackell School Superintendent, Bob
McCall, coaches James Day Rebecca Hubbard, and Kenneth Campbell were involved in an incident which involved corporal punishment being administered i not consistent with the Brackett Independent School District Policy and the District Discipline Ma
agement Plan agement Plan.
McCall's stating that students were paddled by both Coach Day and Coach
Hubbard for "lack of effort" Hubbard for lack of effort physical education program. The punishment was administered in an inappropriate setting (in view of
other students rat ouer students rather than out of
view of other students). Board view of other students). Board
Policy (FOB) allows corporal purrishment in order to "preserve an effective educational enviro
ment, free from disruption. ment, free from disruption."
After an intensive study of After an intensive study of the
incident, Mr. McCall found the
ack of effort in physical educaion insufficient cause to use corporal punishment. He also did
not feel that due consideration was not feel that due consideration was
given to the "size, age, and condition of the students, the type of
instrument that was used, the instrumen force that was used, and the part of the body that was
struck." The Superintendent did not find any of the teachers involved
guilty of deliberately trying to do guilty of deliberately trying to do serious physical harm to the stu-
dents. He did say that he felt as though the teachers demonstrated extremely poor judgment and exhibited unprofessional behavior
in this incident. in this incident.
Mr. McCal
Mr. McCall has issued the
following course of action that should serve as a means to assure concerned citizens that such an incident cannot happen in the
Brackett Independent School District again. immediate staff will receive immediate instruction on the
reasons for the use of corporal reasons for the use of corporal
punishment and the means by which all corporal punishment is to be carried out.

administration of corporal punishadministration of corporal punish-
ment will be delivered to the principal's office. No individual employee of the district, other than
the principal will possess or disthe principal will possess or dis-
play any instrument of corporal punishment.
the incident will reprimand from the superintendent. The teachers will agree to the
specified specified remedial actions noted in
each re will remain in the the reprimand sonnel file for a period of one year
from from the date of the incident.
After the the other requirem period, if all of no other violation of this nature
has occurred, the letter will be
removed.
4. Coach Hubbard and Coach Day will be suspended for two days. Coach Campbell will be suspended for one day.

6. Each individual involved will be required to complete 30 hours of in-service training cover-

Physical Education Curriculum and Course Design.

Mrs. Ballantyne's father, Dr. F.
M. D. Hill, organized the First Baptist Church in 1921 after he finished his career ministering to the troops on Fort Clark. Dr
Hill, who had been a medical doctor, gave up his very successful career in medicine to devote

basis to serving God. It was after the war was over
Ind his work with the troops was winding down that Dr. Hill recog-
nized a need for a church in

Brackettville. Mrs. Ballantyne's
first memory of this new Church were in the County Courthouse. After awhile, the services were
moved to a small Chapel located in the same area as the now present Nutrition Center. Some
years later, the Chapel on Fort Clark was put up for sale and with the local Baptist Church being the only one to offer a bid, it was

fond memories of this House of the Lord. For some 30 years she served as the organist for the Church and these memories are

Spraying to combat scab will mean Spraying to combat scab will mean disease is hard to nee but if growers have had a problem in the past,
they can probably hey can probably expect it in the
future. Pecan scab usually pro duces lesions on the leaf and black or dead shucks.
Some varieties such as Burkett,
Wichita, Belmas, and Western are Wichita, Belmas, and Western are susceptible to pecan scab and
should be treated with a fungicide. Varieties resistant to pecan scab are Choctaw, Desirable, Cheyen-
ne, Pawnee, and Sioux, but ne, Pawnee, and Sioux, but
growers should still be alert for growers should still be
problems with the fungus. Spray immediately after the
buds break and then two or three buds break and then two or three
more times until June. While spraying a fungicide, also spray the pecan trees with zinc. Zinc sprayed on foliage helps produce
larger leaves and promotes larger leaves and promotes overall tree growth and nut production, as
previously mentioned. previously mentioned.
The prime time to fertilize pecan trees is immediately after

0mmonium sulfate, $21-0-0$, per inch of tree trunk diameter. Fertilizer should be broadcast on the surface under the pecan tree canopy. A common misconception for fertilizing is to dig a hole near the trunk and pour liquid ertilizer into the hole. Since most
feeder roots are in the top 18 inches, theore is no need for fertilizer to be placed beneath the depth of the soil. Newly planted pecan trees should be cut back to
one-half their height. When pecan trees are dug at nurseries, the roots are damaged. Cutting the tree back gives it a better chance

Mulching is also very impor tant in helping young trees get established. Some of the best
mulch is leaves, hay, pine needles and straw.
Unlike
ecan tree most trees, young pecan trees can withstand Roundup applications that are used to kill
surrounding grasses. Young trees surrounding grasses. Young trees
need plenty of water and should be kept relatively free of competition with grasses, especially Bermuda grass. produce good nuts and a healthy produce good nuts and a healthy
