PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO THE CONSTITUTION－TO BE QUBMITTED TO VOTE OF THE PEOPLE ON TUES－ DAY，NOVEMBER 4 1902
（BJ．R．No．3．）JOINT RESOLUTION Amending Article 6，Section 2. of the Constitution of the state of Texas uéquiring all persons subject to a poll tax to have paid a poll taz and to hold a receipt for same before they offer to vote at any election in this State，and ${ }^{\circ}$ fixing the time of payment of said tax．
BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGIS－ LATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS：
${ }^{\text {Sen tion }} 1$ 1．hat Article 0；Section of the Constitution of the State of Tex． beramended so as to hereafter read as follows：
Sec．2．Eyery male person subject to none of the faregoing disqualifications， who shall haye attained the age of 21 United States，and who shall have re－ síded in this State one year hext pre－ ceding an election and the last six monthe within the district or county，in Which he offers to vote，shall be deemed aqualified elector and every male pe son of foreign birth subject to none of
the toregoing disqualifications who not the foregoing disqualifications who no
less than six months before any election at which he offers to，vote，shall hav declared his intention to become a cit－ izen of the United states in accordance with the Federal Naturalization Laws， and shall have resided in this state one year next preceeding such election and the last six months in the county in which he offers itifete，shanl alector；and all deemed a qualifited elector；and ar
electors shall vote in the election pre－ electors shall vote in the election pre－ cinct of their residence；provided，that electors，living in any unorganized county may rote at any election pre－ cinct in the county to which such coun－ ty is attached for judicial purposes；and provided further，that any voter who is subject to pay a poll tax under the laws of the state of Texas shall have paid said tax before he offers to vote at any election in this state and hold a receipt showing his poll tax paid before the
first day of February next preceeding ＂first day of February next preceeding such eloction．Or fi safd roter shall
