of this section, brought the total of this section, brought the total
number of these wolves killed by number of these wolves killed by
himself since last August up to twenty. The ones he killed last week had just killed three calves and dragged them to their den, he states.
Mr. Corbett who was in the city Monday after supplies, has been confining his operations to the ranges owned and controlled by G. W. Tankersely and J. D. Sugg, and for each lobo he killed he
