Be it Resolved by the Legislature of the State of Texas: Secrion 1 . That Section 51 the State of Texas, as amend ed in 1903, be so amended as to hereafter read as follows: Article 3. Section 51. The Legislature shall have no power to make any grant or authorize the making of any grant of pubsic money of any individual, municipal or other corborations whatsoever; provided, howaver, the Legislature may grant Confederate soldiers and sailors who came to Texas prior to either over sixty years of age roximate disability is the roximate result of actual service in the Confederate
