Then the Standard proceeded to ruin him in the usual way—cutting prices below BETWEEN POINTS IN profit line- but the citizens stood by him, preferring to pay the higher figure. He charged 10 cents a gallon, though the Standard vainly offered it at half that price.

New Tork 'Unange Seat Uneaper. For some unexplained reason there has been a decided "slump" in the price of seats on the New York Stock exchange. A seat sold last week for \$60,000, which is \$5,000 below the last sale reported, and \$15,000 below the high level price of two months ago. Brokers the market now, and for some time and asking me as a personal favor past, has been wholly "professional," or, in other words, the speculative public is standing aloof.
