#### Highway Safety

AUSTIN-How much clear vision should you have to pass another automobile when it is going 50 miles an hour and you are going 60?

This is one of the problems facing Texas highway planners in their efforts to modernize Texas highways and make them safer. They must make it possible for you to see a half-mile ahead, or you are taking a chance at passing another vehicle traveling at a mile a minute.

With highways built for only two-lane or three-lane traffic, the Highway Department has to and warning lines down the highways.

"We are all too prone to ignore these warning stripes when we think we have even a halfchance," says Jack Kultgen, president of the Texas Good Road Association.

#### The Human Side of Social Security

The knack which one field representative had for remembering names paid off in social security benefits for two surviving children of a World War II veteran.

In 1945, Mrs. Helen Creason, widow of Harry Creason, came to the social security office to file a claim for herself and two small children. Her husband had been killed in action. No benefit payments were possible, as Harry had not worked long enough under social security, and World War II service could not be counted. But the new law makes it possible to count Harry's time in service as social security credits.

Attempts to locate the widow proved unsuccessful. Mail addressed to her was returned and former neighbors had lost track of her.

This might have been the unhappy ending of the story had not the field representative gone to the courthouse in another county to transact business. While there, a couple came in and asked for a marriage license. The girl was overheard to say her name was "Helen Creason." The representative paused to reflect on that name. When the couple were ready to leave, he introduced himself.

Yes, she proved to be the widow of Harry Creason. She had decided to get married and do better by the children. When informed the children would get \$20.20 each per month, she said: 'Wonderful, but even if the amount was \$200 a month, it wouldn't change my mind about

After some figuring, it was learned the children will get in monthly benefits, \$4,680.40-all because field representatives seldom forget a name.

A—A veteran-student is entitled only to such medical treatment from VA as he would otherwise get by virtue of his military service. The World War II GI Bill makes no special provision for medical treatment of trainees.
