#### **Business Briefs**

Rep. Gardner Withrow (R.-Wis.) was thumbing through his newspaper a short time ago, and saw a junk dealer's ad offering used landing mats for sale. The mats in question are steel-the kind used by our armed forces for speedy construction of aircraft landing strips.

The Congressman checked up and found that the mats originally were sold by the Navy surplus material for 67 cents ton in 1947, and had since passed through several junk yards, with the price going up each step of the way. By the time he saw the ad, the asking price was \$75 a ton.

Further checking showed that the Army is now buying new landing mats and paying \$157 a ton for them. 67 cents-\$75-\$157. Can this be in the taxpayer's interest?
