

The white rice goes mighty well with the pink shrimp which curl "real pretty" as they cook in the soy sauce. Even the gruffest "old salt" warms up to the cook with a smile and praises for the eating satisfaction he's getting. Fact is - this rice, shrimp, sauce combination is so really good no one blushes about asking for

INGREDIENTS: tablespoons butter or margarine

2 cup chopped onion 1/2 cup diced celery 2 cup chopped green pepper 2 tablespoons flour 11/2 cups warm water 2 tablespoons soy sauce

1 pound cooked or uncooked shrimp, cleaned 3 cups hot cooked rice PREPARING THE FLUFFY WHITE RICE: To make 3 liberal cups of fluffy rice, put 1 cup of uncooked rice, 2 cups of cold

Ahoy mates, here is powerful water and 1 teaspoon of salt into a 2 quart saucepan and bring to a vigorous boil. Turn the heat as low as possible. Cover saucepan with a lid and leave over this low heat for 14 minutes. Do not remove lid nor stir rice while it is cooking. Turn off

Use exact measurements of uncooked rice and water. Time the cooking accurately.

METHOD: Melt butter or margarine in saucepan or skillet. Add the onion, celery and green pepper. Cook until barely tener. Add the flour and mix well Cook several minutes stirring constantly. Add the water and soy sauce and mix thoroughly. Cook five minutes stirring constantly. Add the shrimp. Cover and simmer 10 minutes, or until the shrimp curl and become pink. Serve over the hot rice. If cooked shrimp are used, thoroughly heat the shrimp in the sauce before serving over the hot rice. Serve with additional
