

Coyotes Beat the Sanderson Eagles for Regional Title

The Borden County Coyotes got off to a very sluggish start Friday as they found themselves behind for the first time this year when Sanderson scored on their opening drive. The Coyotes had a penalty that allowed them to continue their drive and then misplayed a ball in the air that gave them a first and goal at the one that led to the Sanderson Eagles initial score and a 6 to 0 lead for the Eagles.

But, the two first downs that the Eagles got on that drive would be twice what they would get the rest of the game as the Coyotes held the Eagles to only 3 first downs and 87 total yards on the

The Coyotes got the ball on the 38 yard line after a failed onside kick attempt and Michael Cooley followed to tremendous blocks by Flynn Chapman and Miles Valentine and a down field block by Zach Telchik to travel those 38

The Coyote defense held on a 4th and 1 on the 19 yard line and one play later, same play same result, as Michael scampered in from 19 yards out to give the Coyotes a 12 to 6 lead.

The Eagles returned the ensuing kick to tie the game again at 12 all.

After the Coyotes stumped their toe on their next offensive possession the defense behind some great pressure from Jake Cooley, John Hensley and Michael Cooley force a pass to float and Flynn Chapman was Johnny on the spot for the in-terception. Four plays Later Flynn Chapman cut loose on a 52 yard run to regain the lead at 18 to 12.





Don't Let Potluck Meals Be Bad Luck

of sharing, entertaining - and indulging in good food. That combination naturally leads to potluck meals, where friends and family gather together to share each other's favorite

But don't let the possibility of foodborne illness ruin these festive occasions. Follow these safety precautions to

a get-together, don't let perishable foods stay in the danger zone – 40-140 degrees – for more than two hours. Transport time and serving time refrigerator for storage, be sure should be included in these to place them in shallow dishes two hours. Be careful with these perishable foods: meat, poultry, seafood, eggs, cooked vegetables and dairy products, and dishes made with any of these foods, such as dressing, gravy, casseroles, cream pies, puddings and dips.

* Perishable foods prepared ahead of time should be kept refrigerated until time to leave. If the food is to be served hot, reheat it at the event. One convenient way to keep it hot at home is by using your slowcooker (crockpot).

Use ovens and microwaves to reheat food; don't use warming trays or slow cookers. Food thermometers should be used to make sure reheated foods have reached an internal temperature of 165 degrees. If reheating equipment is not available, prepare food closer to the event time and keep it hot by wrapping it in towels or blankets, or by placing it in an insulated chest.

* Keep cold perishable foods below 40 degrees until serving time. Use ice chests to transport these foods and keep them cold. Ice chests or ice bowls can keep foods below 40 degrees on a buffet line.

Make sure everything that comes in contact with the foods is kept clean. Wash

The holiday season is a time hands and food preparation sharing, entertaining – and surfaces often. Make sure adequate garbage disposal facilities are available and keep garbage away from the food area.

* If food will be prepared at the event, keep raw meat sepa-rate from foods that will not be cooked, such as salad or raw fruit or vegetable tray ingredients. Use separate cutting boards for fresh produce and help eliminate that risk:

* When transporting food to food. If separate cutting boards and utensils are not available, clean and sanitize between

> * When placing foods in the to place them in shallow dishes or containers that can cool quickly. Use zip top bags for things like meat, potatoes, dressing, etc. (This will also make it easy to send left.) make it easy to send leftovers home with guests!) If you place them in deep containers, the food will not cool quickly enough and will allow bacteria to grow (even though you have refrigerated it within 2

The experts stressed the importance of the two-hour rule: Do not let perishable foods remain in the temperature danger zone for more than two hours. Foods left out more than two hours should be discarded: If in doubt, throw it



the elementary side of the competition (grades K-5) where Borden County Elementary collected 809 points, almost doubling second-place doubling second-place O'Donnell with their 411 points. New Home was third with 175 points, and Ira was fourth with 165. Wilson and Southland brought up the rear. with 115 and 30 points respectively

Altogether, Borden County teams won 36 out of 44 team contests. BC students won individually in over half of the contests and swept the top three individual positions in 14 separate events.

The overall championships for schools are determined by points that are won when their students place individually in the top six. First place students win 15 points for their school. Second place receives 12, third -10, fourth -8, fifth -6, and sixth - 4. Winning teams also receive 8 points for first place, 6 for second, and 4 for third. Then, all of the points are totaled to name the sweepstakes champions.

These results are a true testament of the efforts of Borden County students, parents, staff, and administration to excel academically. U.I.L. academic competition provides additional incentives for students to push themselves above and beyond the typical curriculum. 


