## Borden County U.I.L Celebrates Double Victory

## Junior High \& Elementary Win Overall Zone Academic Titles

As the holidays arrive this Cheyenne Dowds week, students and teachers at Borden County Elementary and Junior High have much to be thankful for - this time in the form of dual District 4-A, East Zone UILAcademic Meet championships.

Both groups won their zone titles by wide margins last Wednesday and Thursday in contests held in O'Donnell.

On the elementary level, Borden County finished with 782.66 points overall, outpacing second place O'Donnell, who finished with 480.83 points. Ira was third with 252.5, while New Home was fourth with 200 . Wilson and Southland finished out the contests with 39 and 24 points respectively.

Borden County more than doubled its next closest competitor on the junior high level with an overall total of 1257.5 points. Ira was second with 558 points. O'Donnell finished in third with 422.5, and New Home was fourth with 319. Southland ended with 239, and Wilson was sixth with 44.

These sweepstakes points were awarded for both individual and team placements in over 70 different academic contests.
