

cards, such as expiration dates or added fees—especially if you do not use the cards right away

In new credit card protections passed this year, Congress saw fit to include some consumer protections for gift card buyers and recipients. The rules apply to retail cards and general gift cards (bearing Visa, Mastercard, American Express and Discover logos) but not to paper certificates, phone or rewards/loyalty


