Richey Earns All-State Honors Two Years in a Row

Just like her dad has coached the best Division II six-man football team in the state each of the past two seasons, Borden County's Taylor Richey also has been recognized as one of the best small high school girls' basketball players in the state.

Richey, one of Borden County's top guns on back-to-back Coyote hoop squads that went three rounds deep in the state playoffs the past couple of seasons, has earned first-team all-state accolades again from the Texas Six-Man Coaches Association.

Richey, the daughter of Borden County head football coach Trey and wife, Hayley Richey, earned this same honor last year from that coaching group.

coaching group.

"We're talking about a kid who's gotten double teamed nearly every game that she plays, but still puts up over 19 points per game," Borden County Coach Colt McCook

said of Taylor.

"We're not only excited, but we're also excited for her."

That kind of attention from their opponents speaks highly for Richey, according to her head basketball coach.

"She's nearly always getting double teamed form the backside or wing. That can get a little frustrating, but that also says something right there, whenever your opponents' defense is that worried about stopping her," McCook said.

In addition to putting up just under 20 points per game, Richey also has been averaging 5.5 rebounds and two steals per game for the Coyote girls.

"Probably, her biggest strength is that she's got a scorer's mentality," McCook said. "When some kids have an off shooting night or whatever, they have a tendency to get down on themselves but not Taylor. She just always finds a way.

"Being left-handed is another advantage for Taylor.

Most people get used to guarding people going to that right side."

After playing on a couple of ball clubs that made deep playoff runs each of the past two seasons, Richey once again will be counted on heavily at Gail when next season rolls


