## Exemplary! Borden County Receives Top Rating in the 2010 Accountability Rating System

Borden County recently rate of 90 percent in every subachieved the state's top ranking of Exemplary in the 2010 accountability rating system used by the state

Those results for school districts statewide were made public on Friday by the Texas Education Agency.

Borden County ISD repeated its Exemplary ranking this year, after moving up to that in 2009 from being Recognized in 2008
In order to achieve the state's highest rating of Exemplary, the district is required to achieve a minimum passing ject on the TAKS (Texas Assessment of Knowledge and Skills), or meet the standard with TPM.

The Texas Projection Measure (TPM) provides an indication of how student performance at the end of a school year positions a student to meet the standard in future grades. Exemplary campuses also must obtain a high school completion rate of 95 percent completion as well as have an annual drop out rate that is no greater than 1.8 percent or meets Required Improvement.

## Borden County ISD Dress Code 2010-2011

The Borden County School's dress code is established to teach grooming and hygiene, prevent disruption, and minimize safety hazards. Students and parents may determine a student's personal dress and grooming standards, provided that they comply with the following:

Borden County's students shall be dressed and groomed in a manner that is clean and neat and that will not be a health and safety hazard to themselves or others. Clothing and grooming that in the principal's judgment may reasonably be expected to cause disruption of or interference with normal school operation is prohibited.

The Borden County School prohibits pictures, emblems, or writing on clothing that

1. Is lewd, offensive, vulgar, or contains obscene language
2. Advertises or - depicts tobacco products, alcoholic beverages, drugs, or any other substance prohibited by the school

manic, cult, prison wear or gang activities

The following guidelines will be used to determine appropriate dress:

Dresses,
skirts, split skirts and shorts should not be shorter than two inches above the knee. A student will lose the privilege of wearing shorts for the school year upon a third offense. Parens will be notified when the second offense occurs. Shorts must be tailored (hemmed with no frayed edges). No spandex biker shorts or wind shorts are allowed (loose-legged, athletic running shorts) and shorts shall not be too tight.

Wearing of oversized or baggy pants and/or jeans is prohibited at school or at any school-sponsored activity on or off campus. No "saggin, baggin, or draggin." Pants must be an appropriate length and not drag the floor. Boys' pants will be worn at the waist and properly fit the waistline. No excessively wide legged pants will be allowed. No trench coats, dusters, jail attire or para-military attire will be
allowed. No chains will be allowed on school property or at school sponsored functions.
Shirts and blouses must be buttoned appropriately with midriff and back covered at all times. (Tops must be long enough that skin does not show when arms are lifted.) Clothing shall be designed, con structed, and worn in a manner that is not suggestive or indecent, and that shall promote proper decorum. The opening on any type of shirt shall not exceed the equivalent of the first button below the collar of a dress shirt

Tank tops and "see-through chiffon blouses" will not be allowed unless they are worn with a crew neck T-shirt underneath it or a shirt worn over them during all school hours and activities. Tailored shirt shirttails must be tucked in unless you have a crew T-shirt underneath the shirt. (All tar lored shirts will be buttoned and tucked into the pants or skirt when representing Borden County in any extracurricular activity.)

Sleeveless blouses are permissible but must be in good taste. Appropriate undergarments must be worn and must not be exposed at any time.

Footwear shall be a part of regular attire. House shoes are not acceptable footwear. No metal cleats or plates on the soles of shoes shall be worn in the building.

Hair shall be clean and well groomed at all times while attending school, school funclions, and school sponsored activities. It will be styled in a manner that will keep it out of the student's eyes and not obstrict one's vision. No unnatuaral or bizarre hair colors or haircuts will be permitted Eyebrows must not be notched or shaved in an unnatural manner. Male students' hair may be worn no longer than the top of the collar. In addition: geometric or unusual patterns will not be allowed to be shaved or cut in the hair, and boys may not wear ponytails, rat-tails, or braids.

Students are to be cleanshaven at all times. Mustaches and beards are not allowed. Sideburns shall not be worn
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lower than the bottom of the ear lobe and no wider than one inch at the base.

Boys will not wear piercing jewelry. Girls may not wear exposed piercing jewelry other than earrings. No tongue piercing will be allowed for boys or girls.

Sunglasses may not be worn in the building during school hours or events inside the building unless prescribed by a doctor.

Students may not wear hats, caps, bandanas, or hoods inside the building during the school day unless approved by the school administration. In addition, they may not wear such headwear when particibating in basketball games whether actively participating or sitting on the bench

Any clothing or grooming not listed above that is determined by the school adminstration to pose a disruption, interference, or safety concern to the normal school operation or Borden County School Community will be prohibited and addressed as appropriate.

Students may not wear gloves or arm sleeves in the

## school building

A student who violates the dress code shall be given an opportunity to correct the problem at school. If not corrected, the student shall be assigned to in school suspension either for the remainder of the day or until a parent or designee brings an acceptable change of clothing to the school. Repeat offenses may result in more serious disciplinary action. The principal, in cooperation with the spansor, coach, or other person in charge of an extracurricular activity, may regulate the dress and grooming of students who participate in the activity (for example: cheerleader uniforms may vary from normal requirements according to principal/ sponsor approval). Students who violate these standards may be removed or excluded from the activity for a period determined by the school administration or sponsor and may be subject to other disciplinary action.
Violations of the Borden County Dress Code may be handled through the Student Code of Conduct.

If you haven't already done it, gather up the backpacks, messenger bags, lunch packs-anything that has been used to transport items to and from school-and get rid of the past school year's accumulation of "stuff." Turn the pack inside out and shake out the crumbs and lint. If necessary, labels to see if it's okay to toss the items in the washing machine. If not, wipe them down with a disinfectant wipe.
Create a central collection point, such as a basket or a plastic bin, for the wayward pens, pencils, notebooks, and any other reusable supplies that you uncover during the summer months. That way, you'll be able to take inventory before school starts and avoid replenishing supplies you already own.
