COUNTY OF BORDEN

ORDER RESTRICTING OUTDOOR BURNING

WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court has determined that circumstances present in all or part of the unincorporated area of the county creates a public safoty hazard that would be exacerbated by outdoor burning.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED by the Commissioners Court of Borden County that all outdoor burning or outdoor buming of trash, brush or open camp fires is banned in the county for 90 days from the date of adoption of the Order, unless the restrictions are terminated earlier based on a determination made by this Court. This Order is adopted pursuant to Local Government Code 352.081 , and other applicable statutes. This Ordor does not prohibit outdoor griling when grill is placed over non-combustible surface and welding activities are permitted when an assistant is attendance for fire watch; nor does it prohibit outdoor burning activities related to public health and safety that are authorized by the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality for (1) firefighter training (2) public utility, natural gas pipeline or mining operations; or (3) planting or harvesting of agricultural crops; or, (4) burns that are conducted by a prescribed burn manager certified under Section 153.048 , Natural Resources Code, and meet the standards of Section 153.047, Natural Resources Code.

In accordance with Local Government Code 352.081 (h), a violation of this Order is a Class C misdemeanor, punishable by a fine not to exceed $\$ 500.00$.

"My first encounter with an alligator had to do with perhaps the biggest one I've ever worked with," says Danny. "It was right here in the city limits of Liberty on Highway 90 near a convenience store. He just happened to walk out from the woods. He was twelve feet, four inches.'

Now Danny was fairly new on the job. He was a little apprehensive. When he got to the scene, the alligator was blocking traffic and wouldn't move off the highway.
"I used a baseball bat to tap him on the side of the head. He didn't like that one bit, even though it didn't hurt him at all."

Then Danny got out a double barrel shotgun from his car.
"He disarmed me. He was so quick. He took the shotgun out of my hands, shook it all over the place and then just flung it off to the side." The alligator started backing up.
"He turned away from me and I kicked him on the tail. Before my foot hit the ground, he had turned around and was staring right at me with his mouth open. He was making weird noises as if he was telling me to get away. I nearly went into shock."
Danny really didn't know what to do. None of the old game wardens were around. He usually called on them when he ran into difficult situations. This was his first time to deal with an alligator and he was a little unsure of himself. "Back then, game wardens drove Dodge Diplomat cars. I got in my vehicle and thought I would just bump him a little
it. Then he leaned up on his front legs and with his mouth he shook the front end of the car back and forth. It seemed unreal."

Danny finally got the gator to go back in the woods. "I've had lots of experiences with alligators since then, and have learned a lot about them, but nothing compares to this one. "My first encounter with an alligator had to do with perhaps the biggest one I've ever worked with," says Danny. "It was right here in the city limits of Liberty on Highway 90 near a convenience store. He just happened to walk out from the woods. He was twelve feet, four inches."
Now Danny was fairly new on the job. He was a little apprehensive. When he got to the scene, the alligator was blocking traffic and wouldn't move off the highway.
"I used a baseball bat to tap him on the side of the head. He didn't like that one bit, even though it didn't hurt him at all."

Then Danny got out a double barrel shotgun from his car.
"He disarmed me. He was so quick. He took the shotgun out of my hands, shook it all over the place and then just flung it off to the side." The alligator started backing up.
"He turned away from me and I kicked him on the tail. Before my foot hit the ground, he had turned around and was staring right at me with his mouth open. He was making weird noises as if he was telling me to get away. I nearly went into shock."
Danny really didn't know what to do. None of the old game wardens were around. He usually called on them when he ran into difficult situations. This was his first time to deal with an alligator and he was a little unsure of himself. "Back then, game wardens drove Dodge Diplomat cars. I got in my vehicle and thought I would just bump him a little
