## 2010 UIL Elementary Junior High Contests Prove Challenging BCS Continues Winning Ways With Sweepstakes Victories in Both Divisions

Each year when UIL district contests roll around, area schools aim to knock off the longstanding tradition of Borden County School's championship performances. Once again, however, the young competitors held off fierce challenges from Dawson, Ira, Klondike, Loop, O'Donnell, and Wellman-Union. Borden County won both the elementary and junior high divisions after the results were tallied from the two-day meet held in O'Donnell November 16 and 17.

Final point totals for the elementary victory were **Borden County (464 points)**, O'Donnell (270 points), Ira (204.25 points), Loop (195 points), Klondike (194.33 points), and Dawson (176.33 points).

Grades 6-8 points totals were **Borden County (828.5)**, Loop (607), Wellman-Union (555.33), O'Donnell (261.5), Ira (242), Klondike (235.33), and Dawson (116.33).

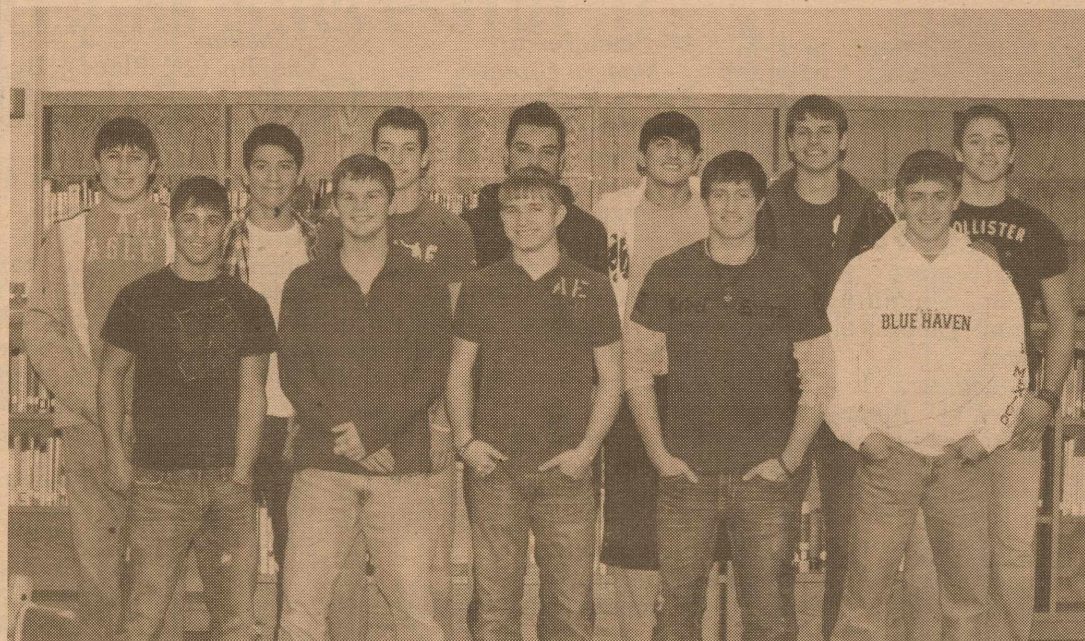

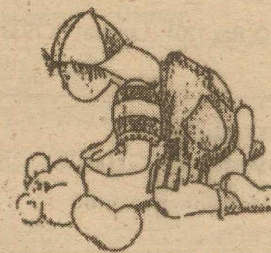

### ORDER RESTRICTING OUTDOOR BURNING

**WHEREAS**, the Commissioners Court has determined that circumstances present in all or part of the unincorporated area of the county creates a public safety hazard that would be exacerbated by outdoor burning.

**IT IS HEREBY ORDERED** by the Commissioners Court of Borden County that all outdoor burning or outdoor burning of trash, brush or open camp fires is banned in the county for 90 days from the date of adoption of the Order, unless the restrictions are terminated earlier based on a determination made by this Court. This Order is adopted pursuant to Local Government Code 352.081, and other applicable statutes. This Order does not prohibit outdoor grilling when grill is placed over non-combustible surface and welding activities are permitted when an assistant is attendance for fire watch; nor does it prohibit outdoor burning activities related to public health and safety that are authorized by the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality for (1) firefighter training (2) public utility, natural gas pipeline or mining operations; or (3) planting or harvesting of agricultural crops; or, (4) burns that are conducted by a prescribed burn manager certified under Section 153.048, Natural Resources Code, and meet the standards of Section 153.047, Natural Resources Code.

In accordance with Local Government Code 352.081 (h), a violation of this Order is a Class C misdemeanor, punishable by a fine not to exceed \$500.00.



Then Danny got out a double barrel shotgun from his car.

"He disarmed me. He was so quick. He took the shotgun out of my hands, shook it all over the place and then just flung it off to the side." The alligator started backing up.

"He turned away from me and I kicked him on the tail. Before my foot hit the ground, he had turned around and was staring right at me with his mouth open. He was making weird noises as if he was telling me to get away. I nearly went into shock."

Danny really didn't know what to do. None of the old game wardens were around. He usually called on them when he ran into difficult situations. This was his first time to deal with an alligator and he was a little unsure of himself. "Back then, game wardens drove Dodge Diplomat cars. I got in my vehicle and thought I would just bump him a little

bit and maybe he'd just scoot on off the road. I nudged him a little bit, then got out of the car."

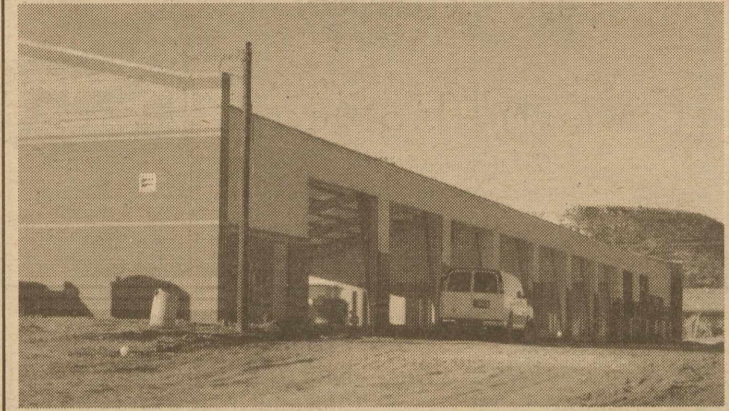
