Poinsettia Care

The Poinsettia is NOT Poi- clean! sonous

The widespread belief that tia Care poinsettias are poisonous is a misconception. The scientific evidence demonstrating the poinsettia's safety is ample and well documented. Studies conducted by Ohio State University in cooperation with the Society of American Florists concluded that no toxicity was evident at experimental ingestion levels far exceeding those likely to occur in a home environment. In fact, the POISINDEX Information Service, the primary information resource used by most poison control centers, states that a 50 pound child would have to ingest more than 500 poinsettia bracts to surpass experimental doses. Yet even at this high level, not toxicity was demonstrated

As with all ornamental plants, poinsettias are not intended for human or animal consumption and certain individuals may experience an allergic reaction to poinsettias. However, the poinsettia has been demonstrated to be a safe plant. In fact, in 1992, the poinsettia was included on the list of houseplants most helpful in removing pollutants from indoor air. So, not only is the poinsettia a safe and beautiful addition to you holi-

Do's and Don'ts of Poinset-

DO place your plant in in-direct sunlight for at least six hours per day. If direct sun can't be avoided, diffuse the light with a shade or sheer cur-

DO provide room temperatures between 68-70E F. Generally speaking, if you are comfortable, so is your poinsettia. <u>DO</u> water your plant when

the soil feels dry to the touch. DO use a large, roomy shopping bag when transporting it, especially if it is windy.

<u>DO</u> fertilize your plant AF-TER THE BLOOMING SEA-SON with a balanced, all-purpose fertilizer.


DON'T place plants near cold drafts or excessive heat sources. Avoid placing plants near appliances, fireplaces or ventilating ducts. <u>DON'T</u> over water your

plant, or allow it to sit in standing water. Always remove a plant from any decorative container before watering, and allow the water to drain completely

DÓN'T expose your plant to chilling winds when transporting it

DON'T fertilize your plant when it is in bloom. Source: Texas Cooperative



He was preceded in death by his parents, Harvey and Oma (Lee) LaRue.






