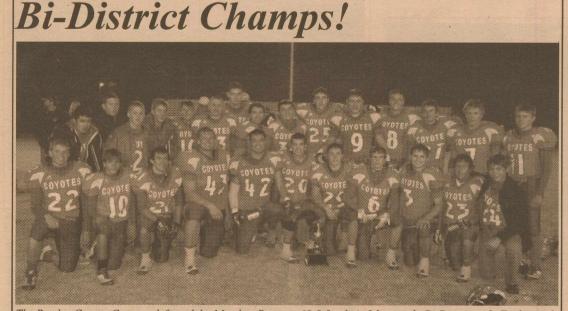

The Coyotes will next phase Valley in the Area round contest, this game will take place in Idalou on Saturday the 24th of November at 6:00.

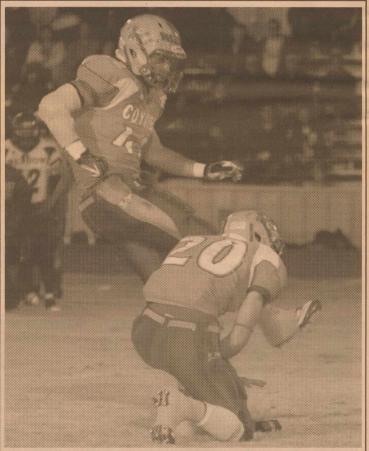

Get plenty of rest. According to the National Sleep Foun-dation, adults need seven to nine hours of sleep per night to stay healthy. If you find yourself running around like one of Santa's overworked elves, even 15-20 minutes of

next to the buffet table. It leads to the temptation to overeat. Instead, mingle with the guests

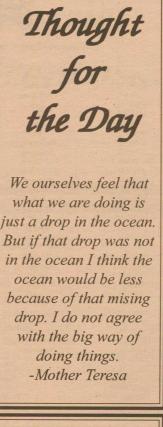

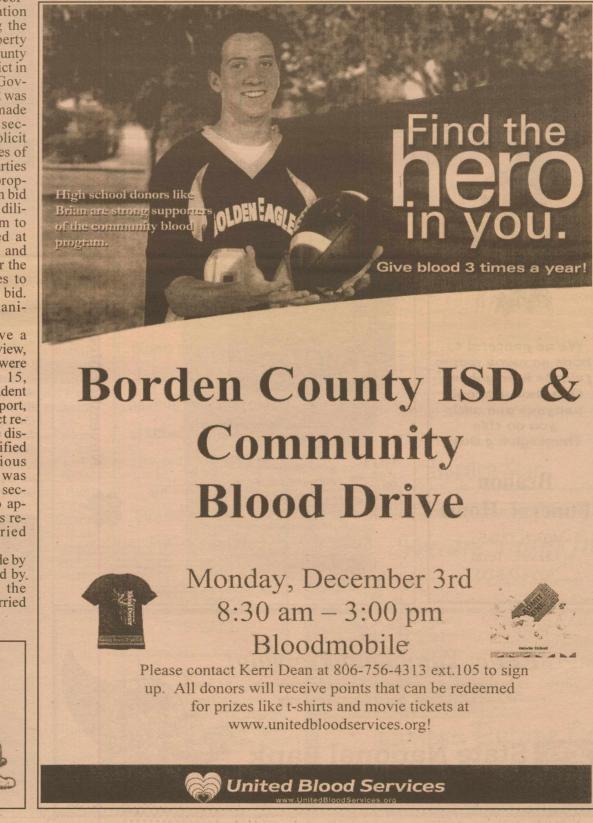
