## Social Security Man <br> To Be In Uvalde

Gordon James, manager of the San Antonio social security representative from his office will visit in Uvalde on Novem-
ber 7 . He will be at the City Hall
at $1: 00$ p.m.
He will take claims of He will take claims of re-
tired workers, dependents and tired workers, dependents and
survivors; issue social security ards; and distribute informational leaflets explaining phases of the
Act.
James calls attention to the provision in the social security benefits to the wife of a retired worker regardless of her present age, if she has a child under 18 in her care. Under the old law, such payments were
not made until she became 65 . Women who meet this requirement should file claims for in-
surance payments, says James.

## Letter From State Health Officer

Austin, Texas, Oct. 17. -

the vital records much of the planning for the welfare of the planning for the welfare of the
people of Texas is done. The people of Texas is done. The
number of births credited to number of ornty or city of the residence of the mother can be used in planning hospitals and medical care. The medical certi-
fication of the birth record fication of the birth record
furnishes the Division of Mafurnishes the Division of Ma-
ternal and Child Health, with ternal and Child Health, with
a list of children who may need a list of children who may need
additional care, because of prematurity, congenital malforma tions or birth injuries. The birth certificates are used in
establishing dependency beneestablishing dependency bene-
fits for veterans or members of fits for veterans or members of
the armed forces. They are also used in proving relationship in settlement of insurance claims and inheritance matters.
The statistics made from
causes of death as gathered from medical certifications on death records are used in the prevention of disease, for control of epidemies, and immuiza-
tion programs for children of tion programs for children of
pre-school and school age. Lead-pre-school and school age. Lead
ing causes of death statistics ing causes of death statistics search which will lengthen life expectancy and improve health during the expected time. Mortality statistics and the expected length of life are consurance premium rates.
