

## **USDA** Announces **Extension on** 2014 Acreage **Reporting Dates**

January 15, 2014, to report crops that have a November 15, 2013, or December 15, 2013, reporting deadline without paying a late-file fee. Crops under this waiver include wheat and native and improved grasses intended for grazing or haying. The Risk Management Agency (RMA) did not grant a waiver so producers need to consult their crop insurance agent for deadlines for insured crops.

In order to comply with FSA program eligibility requirements, all producers are encouraged to visit the Garza-

Producers now have until Borden County FSA office to file an accurate crop certifica-tion report by the applicable deadline.

> Noninsured Crop Disaster Assistance Program (NAP) policy holders should note that the acreage reporting date for NAP covered crops is the earlier of the dates listed above or 15 calendar days before grazing or harvesting of the crop



#### Keep Food Safe During Holiday Entertaining

Holidays, we often think about food and fellowship. They are both important parts of our annual festivities. However, we often forget to keep food safety in mind. It is important to follow a few guidelines during the holidays since we do not want any unwanted guests to

Foodborne illness has symptoms of diarrhea, nausea, fever and vomiting. It is caused by harmful bacteria that grow in moist food, usually protein-based, at temperatures between 40 °F and 140° F.

Food safety is especially important for holiday food events because serving large crowds means handling considerable amounts of food. When cooking for groups, keep in mind how long it will take to prepare the food, available refrigerator storage area to keep food cold and the amount of oven/stove space for cooking and keeping food hot. If serving buffet style, make sure food is not kept at room temperature for more than 2 hours.

Holiday foods include perishable items such as meat, poultry, seafood, eggs, dressing, gravy, dairy-based prod-ucts, and other dishes on which bacteria feed. To keep harmful bacteria from growing, make sure these foods do not remain in the "danger zone" temperatures of between 40° F and 140° F.

To keep holiday foods safe to eat, keep these recommendations in mind:

• Thaw frozen foods in the refrigerator. Food can be thawed in a microwave if it will be cooked immediately. Do not interrupt cooking and never thaw food on the

• Keep preparation areas and hands clean when prepar-

• Cook foods to the proper internal temperature. Whole

When we think about the chicken or turkey should be cooked to an internal temperature of 180° F; fresh ham to 160° F, beef, veal or lamb to 170° F for well done; ground meat dishes to 160° F; egg casseroles to 160° F; leftovers to 165° F or boiling hot, and seafood should become opaque.

· Do not serve any egg dishes that undercooked or raw eggs, such as eggnog. Raw eggs may contain the harmful bacteria Salmonella.

· Avoid the transfer of bacteria from raw meats to cooked foods or foods that will be eaten fresh (do not use the same plate, cutting board or pan unless it has been washed thoroughly).

• Quickly cool large amounts of food if cooking ahead. Divide food into smaller portions and store below 40° F in shallow containers, less than 3 inches deep (if you can use them, zip top plastic bags make great storage containers and are easy to stack and send home with your guests). This will help food cool more quickly.

Serve hot foods hot above 140° F and cold foods cold below 40° F. Hold foods for buffet service for no more than 2

• Put out small quantities if serving buffet style and replace often. When a dish becomes empty, or nearly empty, replace with a fresh container of food.

· Discard any foods left at room temperature for more than 2 hours. Do not store them for leftovers. Any foods still refrigerated or frozen should be used within recom-


