



A case is reported from Lake Charles, La., that has peculiar interest. A prominent physician of the town is dead and his wife is charged with murdering him.


They were old enough to have a grown son engaged in the practice of medicine, and had evidently lived together many years as man and wife. While the evidence is not all reported in the papers, the wife's statements are enough to impress the lesson that the Bulletin desires to give from the story. Sunday morning the aged and highly respected citizen arose and went to the kitchen to kindle a fire. She heard him ask the stable boy for a match and took one down to start a fire. Supposing that the fire was burning he went on out on the porch, and his wife, discovering that the fire was not burning, followed and told him he "ought to try to make one more fire and quit." This was followed by several

other nagging and taunting remarks about the fire. She returned to the kitchen, and the physician followed her and said: 'I am going to slap your face good and hard just to show you that I can." She defied him to attempt it and a fight ensued, in which he was stabbed, dying soon afterward. There is no excuse that can be offered for such family troubles, and should the members of all families restrain their dispositions to nag each other they would never occur. Some women, and some men too, have a despiseable habit of constantly taunting each other, magnify trivial occurnces into things of real importance, and bring about un necessary entanglements. It is hard especially to stand constant taunting and nagging from any one without at least retorting, and a disposition must indeed be saintly that can stand it always in silence. Nearly all the differences between man and wife are entirely unnecessary if one has the proper regard for the rights and feelings of the other.
