According to the report, a 1966 Volkswagon, driven by Clarence Arganbright of Dallas, was heading west over the overpass which was iced over, slid on the icy surface and crashed into an east-bound 1960 Ford Falcon driven by William Charles Edgar of Cisco. CLASSIC BARBWIRE DISPLAY IS FIRST PERMANENT ITEM IN HISTORICAL COLLECTION

Mr. Berry Greenwood who lives nine miles south of Carbon has the first barbed wire collection for the Eastland County Historical Museum. Mr. Greenwood said he started his collection in November of 1965 but did not really get started until after the first of the year.

This reporter asked Mr. Greenwood about himself. He said, "Nothing of the ordinary." He said his grandfather

settled the homeplace where he now lives in 1883. Mr. Greenwood now lives on the adjoining place.

He said he attended an antique convention in Brownwood to help get the idea going. He said people have donated various types of wire to get the display started. Mrs. Charles Morgan of De Leon was given credit for donation of the wire and labeling the wire that is now on display at the Eastland National Bank and will be on display in all county banks and the County Courthouse.

A booklet, written by J. Jenkins, was given to the Historical Committee that has several pictures and illustrations of wire.

Fifty-six pieces of wire are on display at the bank. Mr. Greenwood said, "If there had been room for more, the collection would have been larger." He has started another display that will be made in the out-line of the map of Texas.

The standard length of the species of wire is 18 inches. He has over sixty pieces of wire to put on this collection. Mr. Greenwood said he hoped to have Mrs. Morgan assist him in labeling the wire.

Some of the wire dates back to about 1869. The collectors have paid as high as \$31 for the wire, an 18 inch piece, being bought by a collector in Kansas. There is still some of the wire being used in Eastland County.

This being the first piece for the museum, the committee is looking forward to other items given to the museum.

Cisco To Vote January 23 On City Sales Tax

An election has been ordered for Tuesday, Jan. 23, on the proposition of passing a one per cent sales tax in the City of Cisco, according to an announcement today. The election was approved at a special meeting of the City Commission on Wednesday, Dec. 20, according to the election order.

A legal notice in connection with the election will be published in The Press on Thursday, Dec. 28, and again on Thursday, Jan. 4.

The question in the election will be for or against an ordinance providing for a local sales tax of one per cent (1%) within the city limits. Authority for the election is a state law approved by the last Texas Legislature, giving this authority to cities.

Under the law, cities are permitted to levy and collect a general sales tax not to exceed one per cent. The state presently collects a two per cent sales tax, and the city sales tax will be handled by the state collection agency.

City officials were running a survey to determine an estimate of the yield of a one per cent sales tax. This information will be published in the near future, according to Mayor W. W. Sawyers.

The city sales tax covered the identical items as the state tax.

Breckenridge, Abilene and other area cities have recently adopted city sales taxes. Ranger will vote on the matter January 9. Eastland is reported to be studying the tax with no decision to date.

Expanded Texas Travel Book Is Offered Public

AUSTIN -- An expanded edition of the popular Texas Travel Handbook has been released by the Texas Highway Department.

First issued last year as an aid to pleasure travel in Texas, the enlarged second edition now lists nearly 400 cities and towns, and includes more than 2,500 individual items of interest. The 208-page handbook also contains 112 photographs which provide travelers with previews of such attractions as the aerial tramway in El Paso, and Presidio La Bahia near Goliad.

Handbook subjects are as varied as the state itself, ranging from the melancholy Empty Saddle Monument in Dalhart to the humorous Pop-

eye statue in Crystal City. With the Texas Travel Handbook as a guide, travelers may discover dinosaur tracks, Indian pictographs and buried cities. They will learn the locations of little-known ghost towns, and follow specific directions to the most popular attractions of modern Texas cities.

Special sections are devoted to recreational facilities in the Texas national and state forests, and in more than 55 state parks. Summaries of Texas hunting and fishing regulations are provided, as well as information on visiting Mexico.

Like all Highway Department travel literature, this handbook is free. Since its initial publication last year, the guide has become a major item among more than four million pieces of travel material distributed annually by the Texas Highway Department.

The guide is available to three-quarters of a million visitors who stop at Highway Department Tourist Bureaus each year, and by individual request from the Texas Highway Department, Travel and Information Division, P. O. Box 5064, Austin, Texas 78703.

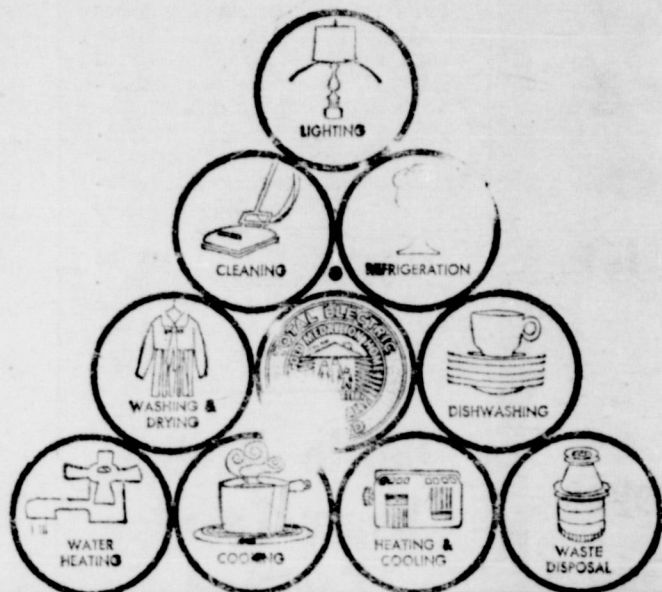

Representatives were present from several surrounding counties. Bill Scott, vocational agri-

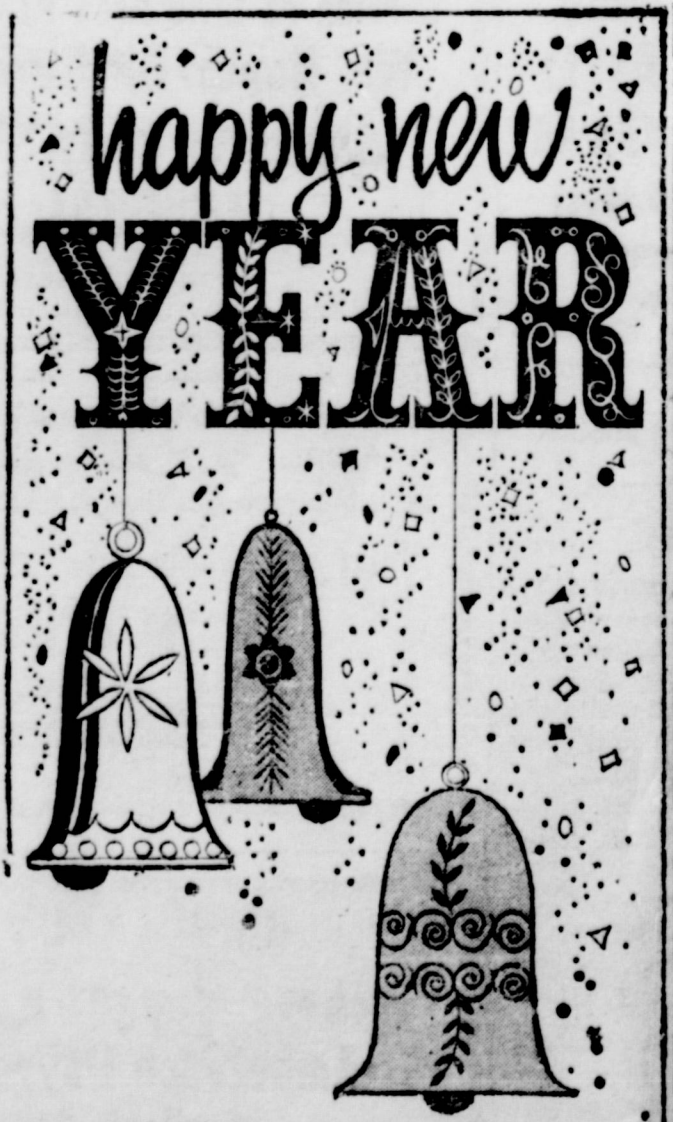

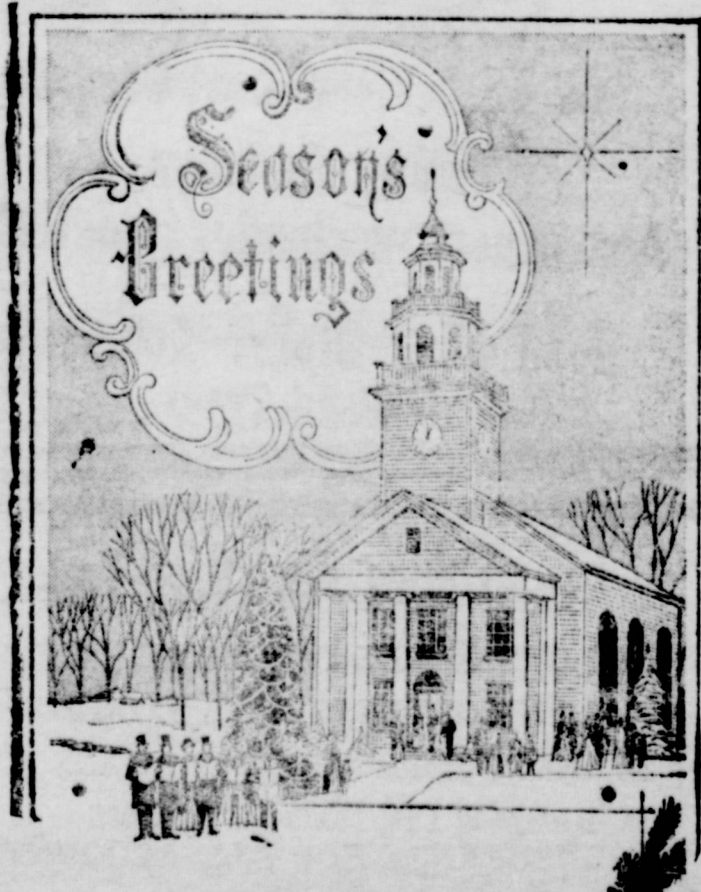
