MORE FACTS ABOUT THE ROAD BOND ELECTION

The object of the road bonds is to provide a sum of money to means about \$20 in cash for build a system of highways in every man, woman and child in the citizens of the county to get tion. to and from their homes at the least expense and labor.

Reagan. cheaper to build because the travel over them and the wear is correspondingly less than on the main or first-class roads. The remaining \$35,000 will be applied to the second-class roads.

Under our present road and bridge tax we are paying 15 cents on \$100. A tax of 12 1-2 cents will be required to pay 5 per cent interest on \$100,000, and an additional tax of 5 cents required to provide a sinking fund, making a total bond tax of 17 1-2 cents, an increase of 2 1-2 cents, or 25 cents on \$1,000 valuation. It will be necessary to provide a fund for the maintenence of the roads when built, so it will be best to retain 5 cents of the present road and bridge tax, which will make an increase in taxes amounting to seventy-five cents on \$1000 valuation.

These figures do not take into consideration the fact that taxable values will greatly increase in the years to come, under which conditions the road bond tax will decrease, and our present system increase. Nor do they take into consideration the fact that the accumulated county money will be drawing interest on the daily balance at some bank. The interest under the present rate to the bonded indebetness would reduce the amount of the increase over the present rate to less than 20 cents a year on \$1,000 valuation.


